we had to limit the number of times a member may compete."

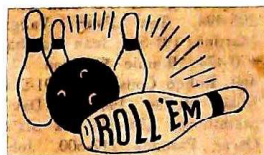

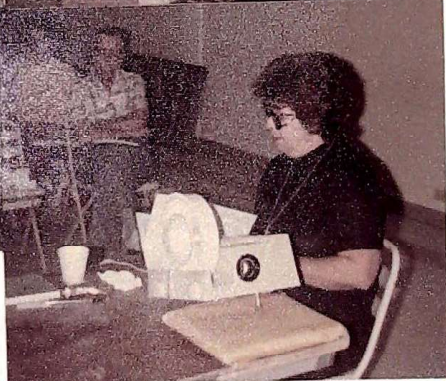
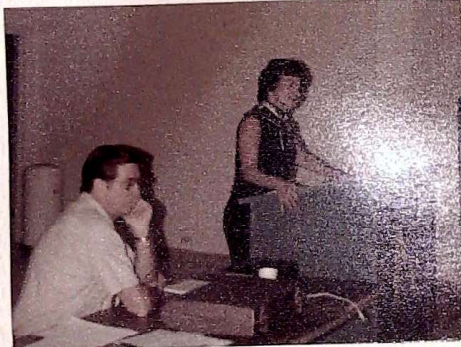

Workshops Draw Full Houses



The League Workshops were heavily attended by presidents, secretaries, proprietors, and interested bowlers seeking knowledge of "what's new at WIBC and ABC".

League officials packed the Ramada Inn International Ballroom on the northside for two sessions. The sessions were no different at McClellan Shopping Center yesterday as southside league officials searched for information to make their fall sessions even more enjoyable and efficient.

The presentation, a service of WIBC, was moderated by SAWBA City Secretary, Mrs. Sylvia Broyles, assisted by Rusty Pope, secretary of SABA.

For nearly two hours Mrs. Broyles told the WIBC sanction-

ing story. Aided by slides, she explained all the forms necessary for a smooth-running league organization, and fielded questions from those attending.

Changes in the WIBC and ABC constitutions were discussed simultaneously by Mrs. Broyles for WIBC and Mr. Pope for ABC and with the help of a tape cassette the workshop was spiced with humorous little hypothetical happenings which could occur in any league without proper rules.

The presentation, perhaps one of the finest yet offered by WIBC, also covered the WIBC Awards program for all members of WIBC leagues. Special emphasis was placed on the duties of league officers, particularly those of league presidents and secretaries. The information imparted

by Mrs. Broyles also covered the record forms provided by WIBC, and each form was thoroughly discussed as was the all-important sanction form.

Pope placed special emphasis on the duties of League Representatives, who are the liaison between the leagues and the SABA Board, and urged league presidents to select their league representatives carefully.

SAWBA president Mrs. Madelyn Spreng, acted as mistress of ceremonies of the Workshop, and as league secretaries, laden with league supplies departed one Workshop a league official was heard to comment, "Boy, that's the best thing that has happened since I became involved in bowling". We heartily concur.

Record Jamboree at Waco Best Yet!!



They Listened, Learned, and Applauded

The Texas State Bowling Jamboree drew 393 bowling officials and proprietors from all parts of the state this past weekend at Waco, and was unanimously hailed by all who attended as one of the best in the Jamboree's history.

Through field representatives, Diane Nelson for WIBC and Jim Beleele of AJBC, plus ABC executive secretary, Ken Hurley, the message was 'growth' in all three national organizations. WIBC reached its 4 million mark during the past season, and AJBC membership was reported at 825,709.

Each of the three associations encouraged promotion of the National Hall of Fame/Museum with the juniors to participate in a national Bowl-A-Thon during February 27-March 5 of next year, attempting to raise pledges of one cent for each pin knocked down during their first game of league play.

The adult drive attempting to acquire a \$2 donation from each sanctioned league bowler is set for February 20-26. Donators will be awarded a decal for their bowling bags. A promotional film on the Hall was shown to those attending the Jamboree. Narrated by Chris Schenkel, national honorary chairman, the film advised that the Hall when completed will be the first Hall of Fame of any sport to be built by the participants themselves.

Miss Nelson and Hurley fielded questions on mixed league problems during the first session after lunch on Saturday. In his opening remarks at the session Hurley called the lane conditioning controversy a 'long road with no end' but he stated that with the test facility in operation at Greendale (it's due to become operational this week) answers could be forthcoming soon. "It's a test facility—not a miracle facility," Hurley emphasized, and he encouraged proprietors and administrators to exert patience, and work with the local association officials until a solution was reached.

San Antonio was well represented by officers and directors of SAWBA and SABA.

Representing the WIBC National Board was Mrs. Sylvia Broyles. Gus Pfeiffer, secretary of the Texas State Bowling Association and Wonder Bowl proprietor Joe Carmack, president of the state proprietors were also introduced during the afternoon session.

The next Jamboree is scheduled for Victoria and the 1979 Jamboree will be held at McAllen.

During the AJBC session Jim Beleele, field representative from Greendale was moderator. Beleele cited the 12 strikes necessary for a perfect season: workshops for coaches; proper sanctioning of all leagues; coaches clinic (LTB); registration of the youngsters; league organizational meetings; organization of teams, allowing the youngsters to elect their officers and conduct their own

meetings; development of future bowlers by working on the lanes; prompt awarding of patches and awards; reporting of scores to Stars of the Lanes and Tenpin Salute; encouraging participation in state and local city tournaments and use of the Award kits.

Beleele cited new rules for juniors this season which allows the presentation of ONE FREE GAME of bowling to youngsters for accomplishments during the league play, or in red head pin games, youngsters may receive a free game when scoring a strike. "If they attain two strikes with the red pin, they may receive two games as they are permitted one game per bowling accomplishment," Beleele stated.

The awarding of bowling shirts or blouses to the winner of a tournament, league champion or for specific game or series scores is also now allowed as long as the shirt or blouse is personalized with the recipient's name and/or bowling accomplishment. Entry fee into another bowling event for the winner of a bowling event is now allowed if the fee is paid to the management of the event and not to the AJBC member.

The new attractive promotional posters available through AJBC were much in evidence during the AJBC workshop.

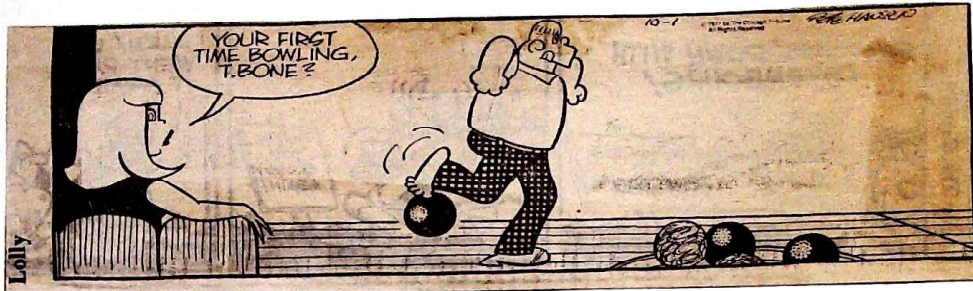

170 and Under Ladies: This Is For You! WATA!!

The Women's Amateur Tournament Affiliation (WATA) for ladies with averages under 170 — yes, we said averages under 170 — is on its way.

And, the first tournament is scheduled for September 17-18 at Southside Lanes. Qualifying squads will be at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. with match play finals at 1 p.m. on Sunday.

But first there is a meeting set for 1 p.m. at Astro Bowl on September 11 to sign up new members and adopt the By Laws which the Board recommends for the operation of the affiliation.

The Board has asked Southside manager Frank Hunt to serve as Tournament Director for the WIBC sanctioned event. Entry blanks will be available this week at all lane control counters and all ladies within the average category are encouraged to join.

According to president, Shirley Tipps, the executive board unanimously approved the change in entering averages for the city's newest tournament association earlier this week. Mrs. Tipps said "There was such immediate favorable response to the announcement of the formation of the new company, but most of those responding commented on the high 175 limit. The idea of forming the association was to give the medium average and lower average ladies an opportunity to participate in match game competition, and based on the wishes of the majority of those speaking out, the Executive

Board voted to lower the maximum to those ladies with 170 or under averages."

"We have revised the proposed by-laws for the association," she added, "And have worked on our entry blanks. The general membership meeting is for the purpose of signing up interested ladies, distributing entry blanks and preparing for our first tournament."

In other executive action the officers also amended the original format to allow ladies to enter the tournament fifteen minutes before squad time rather than by advance reservations.

Membership in the WATA must first be purchased at the rate of \$12 per year, payable

either in one lump sum or in equal installments over a four month period. Entry fee for each tournament is \$17 (prize fund; lineage \$5 and expense \$2). Ladies will roll four games of qualifying on Saturday with the top six advancing to the Finals on Sunday. The prize payoff will be on the basis of one place for each four entries.

Bowlers are to use their highest yearbook average (1976-77) and if no yearbook average, their highest previous average with the bowler providing verification at the time of entry.

At the general membership meeting ladies will be asked to elect at least five directors to serve on the executive board, and the meeting is open to any ladies wishing additional information on the association or the tournament.

Mrs. Fay Tidrick is vice president, Ella O'Quinn, secretary-treasurer and Mrs. Esmeralda (Ya-Ya) Reyes is sergeant at arms.

Of the 211 entries 132 were in Division I (averages over 165) and 79 competed in Division II (164 and under).

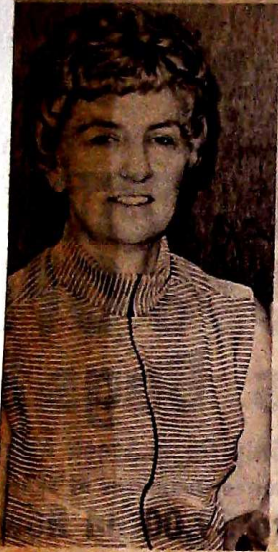

SAWBA City Tournament Near!!

It's not too late to think about City Tournament. In fact, the entry blanks are already out in the lanes for the 42nd annual tournament for the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association.

Oak Hills lanes will host the team event and Southside lanes will be the site for singles and doubles event.

The tournament will begin on October 29 and close on Monday, November 13, and if necessary, additional squads will be added on Saturday.

Sign Up Week to corral tournament entries is set for September 25 through October 1. During this week SAWBA Directors will schedule visits to the lanes to assist in completing tournament entries.

On the last night for entries — October 13 — two southside and two northside locations will be staffed by Directors.

Last minute entries may be brought to either Billy Mitchell Lanes or All Star. The northside last-minute stops will be at San Pedro and Wonder Bowl.

The tournament is in four classes this year and is handicapped within each class at 80%. In team event ladies may bowl as often as desired, however, no more than three players may bowl together more than once, and no more than three players on the same team can place more than once in the prize list for position standing. A member's first team score shall count toward all events if the bowler competes more than once in team event.

Singles and doubles may be entered only once and ladies bowling in doubles must also enter singles, and vice versa.

All events are automatically entered without fee when a bowler enters, team, doubles and singles, however, only those paying

All events is automatically entered without fee when a bowler enters, team, doubles and singles, however, only those paying optional all events fees shall be eligible for prize money in all events.

Handicap is to be 80% from the highest in each class and Open Division bowlers will receive a 80% handicap from the following scratch figures: Team event from 1000; Doubles from 400, Singles from 200. All other classes will be handicapped from the top.

Scratch score winners in each event shall be declared Champions and the highest all-events scratch score, regardless of class, shall be declared Local Champion.

"Finishing second to woman? I really didn't care," said Padron, who pocketed \$65. "I wanted to take first. Well, second is better than third but I wanted first. I had three bad games and it cost me."

The meet attracted 59 entries — 13 better than its initial tournament in July.

"I like the tournament, except it wasn't a sanctioned tournament," said Liz, who finished fourth in the first event. "That's the only thing that I didn't like about it. I thought it should have been sanctioned."

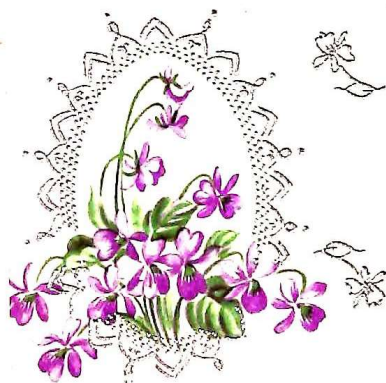

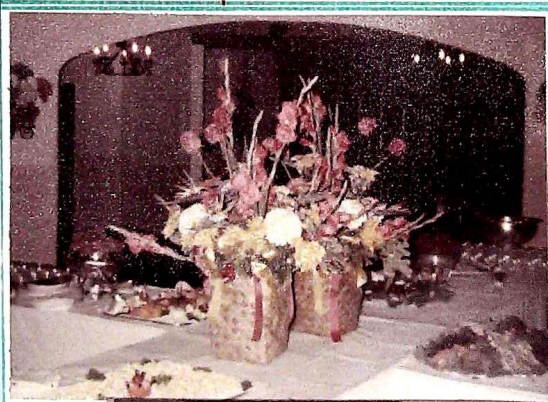
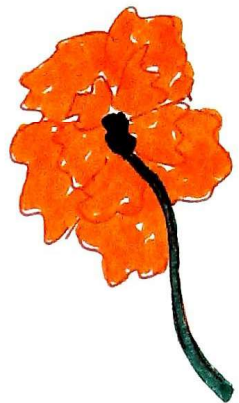

Awards Galore at SAWBA Open Meeting

Not a storm clouds, lightning, thunder nor heavy rain kept sixty dedicated members of the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association from attending their Open Meeting last Monday at the Farm & Home Savings office building.

Mrs. Madelyn Spreng, president, admitted nervous at conducting her first association meeting, but showing few signs of the fact, advised members of the many activities of the association since the beginning of the season and outlined future plans of the organization.

In her president's message to the membership Mrs. Spreng noted that WIBC had surpassed the 4 million mark in membership for the first time; that SAWBA had enjoyed increased membership during the previous season, and she urged continued support of the Bowlers Victory Legion.

"Our number one project this year will be financial support of the National Bowling Hall of Fame/Museum. To date the location has not been selected but we feel that the site will be selected shortly after the fund raising drive. The major thrust of the fund campaign won't come until next February 20-26 when all WIBC and ABC bowlers will be asked for a \$2 donation to support the new sports shrine. We do urge your cooperation in this venture," she concluded.

Mrs. Sylvia Broyles, city secretary, reported 1976-77 membership as 11,757 members as compared to 10,410 the previous season. Five hundred ninety-three league sanctions were processed throughout the year.

Mrs. Broyles reported on the highly successful League Officers Workshops held during the

month of August at which more than 200 league kits were distributed.

The delegation approved the association's annual budget of \$20,875, based on membership of 11,500. It also set Sunday, March 19, 1978 as the date for the association's Annual Meeting.

Elected to serve on the 1977-78 Nominating Committee were Mrs. Helen Baetz, chairman, Mrs. Judy Stephenson, Mrs. Flo Tolle, Mrs. Maggie Nance and Mrs. Jennie Everhart.

Reports from various standing and special committees were heard by the 60 attendees. Ways & Means chairman Mrs. Marge Battreall advised that a jewelry boutique will again be opened during the City Tournament with many new items of jewelry.

Mrs. Lois Scott related plans for the San Antonio Bowling

Council Hall of Fame banquet planned for Sunday, October 2 at the Frost Tower Plaza Club. The 1977 inductee will be Roger Zeller, president of Columbia Industries. Mrs. Scott reminded members that tickets are on sale at all bowling centers and from Council members. Tickets are priced at \$9.50 per person.

Other reports were on AJBC activities, association publicity, and during the balloting, reports regarding the 1977 TWBA and WIBC conventions and tournaments were given.

SAWBA awards for high season game and series were given to Eunice Balmos 290 and Mary Falconer 710. Shirley Mansfield earned the high composite average for 189.

Texas Women's Bowling Association awards were given to Roz Porriani, Jo Ann Noska, Flo Tolle, Sharon Schrum, Pat Sheehy, Nora Johnson, and Laurie Jo Seales for high series and to Ann McGehee, Eunice Balmos and Emma Cicio for games of 277, 278 and 278 respectively. Bettie Jo Geisler received a WIBC award for a 278 game rolled during the Martha Washington tournament.

Those in attendance also approved the secretary's recommendation to study the possibility of adding another SAWBA award — a Service Award, as well as forming a committee to look into the feasibility of having 200 pins or patches and 500 pins or patches available for use in ladies leagues. The delegation also approved the association pledging at least \$300 for "Builders Club" membership in the National Hall of Fame/Museum.

SAWBA City Tournament Entries Coming In!

Oak Hills lanes will host the team event and Southside lanes will be the site for singles and doubles event.

The tournament will begin on October 29 and close on Monday, November 13, and if necessary, additional squads will be added on Saturday.

The tournament is in four classes this year and is handicapped within each class at 80%. In team event ladies may bowl as often as desired, however, no more than three players may bowl together more than once, and no more than three players on the same team can place more than once in the prize list for position standing. A member's first team score shall count toward all events if the bowler competes more than once in team event.

Singles and doubles may be entered only once and ladies bowling in doubles must also enter singles, and vice versa.

Handicap is to be 80% from the highest in each class and Open

Division bowlers will receive a 80% handicap from the following scratch figures: Team event from 1000; Doubles from 400, Singles from 200. All other classes will be handicapped from the top.

Scratch score winners in each event shall be declared Champions and the highest all-events scratch score, regardless of class, shall be declared Local Champion.

Ladies are encouraged to read the complete entry form regarding entering average, however, in most cases averages as of June 1 will apply.

For the WIBC Hall the deadline for submitting nominations is September 26 and awards will be given in two divisions-Superior Performance and Meritorious Service.

Superior Performance nominees must have bowled in 15 WIBC Championship Tournament unless injury or illness has shortened her career, and the nominee must have won national recognition for her bowling or performed outstandingly in WIBC tournaments.

The Meritorious Service nomi-

nee must have distinguished herself through outstanding service to WIBC over a period of years. She must be 50 years of age or older.

Mrs. Helen Baetz was the 1976 winner of the Meritorious Service award.

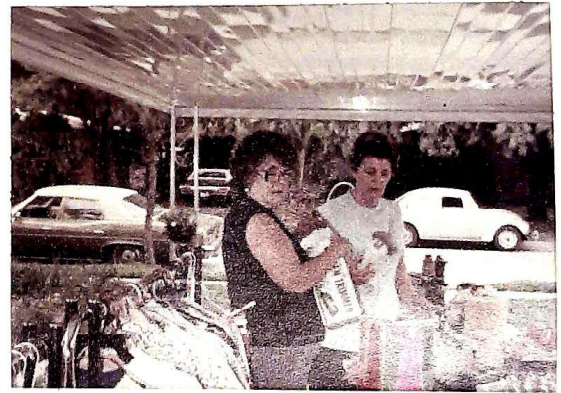
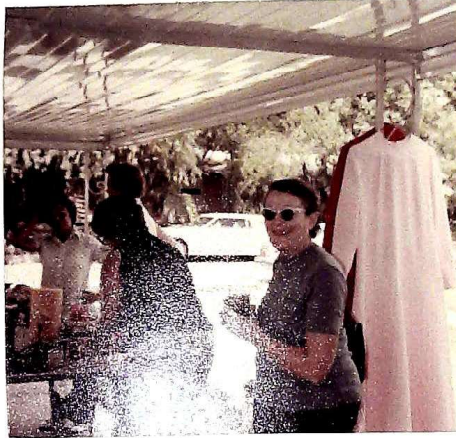

"New Look" for SAWBA Entry Blank

For members wishing to bowl at specific times, Reservation information is included, but completed entry forms with fees must be in the SAWBA office on or before Monday, October 3, or reservations will be cancelled.

such as entering averages, eligibility, check in time, substitute rules are listed on page 2. Each bowling center has a complete set of tournament rules available for anyone wishing to read them.

The official entry form is on page 3. Team captains are asked to select three preferred times for each event. After submitting forms to the office, verification will be given to the captains.

Names of team members, their addresses, WIBC sanction numbers and averages are then to be included in the space provided — with a reminder to use last names first. Captains should also make certain that those paying optional all events are marked.

After totalling averages, classes are then determined. Captains then follow the same procedure in the space provided for singles and doubles entrants. Bowlers entering doubles must also enter singles, and vice versa.

After personally verifying that no more than three members are bowling together more than one time in team event, captains sign the entry form and ready it for mailing. Teams with bowlers with no Yearbook averages will find space for additional average information on page 4 of the entry form.

Oh, Good Grief!! Bowler's Toe???

America's 65 million bowlers are in danger of being bowled over themselves — by a newly diagnosed condition called Bowler's Toe.

It is caused by repeated stress placed on the rear foot just before the ball is rolled down the alley, according to doctors. The damaging pressure comes from the stiff cap of the conventional bowling

shoe as it bends over the foot.

Dr. Samuel Zebrack, a St. Louis podiatrist, recommends soft canvas-top shoes until manufacturers come up with bowlers' footwear with soft toes. When Bowler's Toe is sufficiently advanced, symptoms can be as serious as a "hammer toe" (upward pointing) of the second toe, calluses behind the toe, and a painfully thickened toenail that makes it difficult to walk.

Mrs. Shirley Tipps, Metro-170 prexy, and tournament director, Frank Hunt, expressed pleasure at the turnout for the first tournament and advised that the next Metro-170 will be on October 15-16 at Astro Bowl. Squads again will be at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. with Finals on Sunday at 1 p.m.

To earn her victory in the match play finals on Sunday Tootsie had to come from third position to the top. Going into the sixth game Barbara Tate was a plus-144 and Bebe Baird, the leading qualifier after Saturday, was plus-113. Tootsie was plus-111 just ahead of Margaret Winton with plus-66. (Plus was the number of pins, plus bonus points, based on 170 averages).

In the leader's race Tate and Baird were far off their previous pace as Barbara registered a 158 and Bebe cranked in a 169 taking the 30 bonus points.

One lane away Tootsie and Margaret staged a real war. Tootsie logged in two spares, a strike and another spare before slamming in four solid strikes. She

finished with the tournament's high game of 227. In the meantime Margaret recorded her tournament high game of 190 even though she had an open in the 7th and converted a split in the 9th.

The 30 bonus points and 57 pins over the 170 par were more than enough for Tootsie to claim victory.

The other battle of the Finals was between veteran Minnie Bounds and Metro-170 sergeant-at-arms, Ya-Ya Reyes, a relative newcomer to the game. Bounds took the win with 184 against Reyes' 173 game.

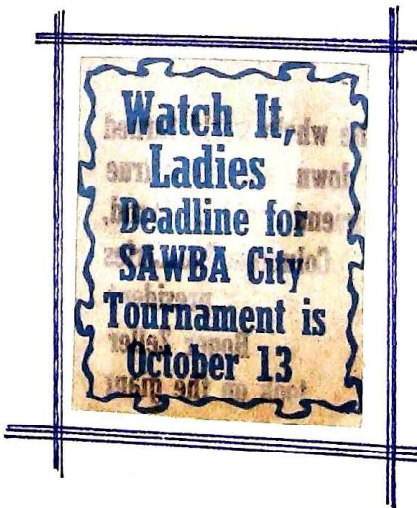

Metro-170 Rolls to Astro

The METRO-170 tournament, for ladies with averages under that magic mark, will roll out the red carpet for its members for the second time next weekend at Astro Bowl.

According to Frank Hunt, tournament director, qualifying round times have been slightly altered this month because of the center's regular bowling schedule.

Qualifying squads will be at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. on Saturday, October 15, and the match-play Finals will be at 1 p.m. on Sunday, October 16.

Requirements for membership in METRO-170 are simple. Ladies with 1976-77 Yearbook averages of 170 and under are eligible to participate. Dues of \$12 are re-

quired, payable one lump sum or in four equal installments.

The METRO-170 tournament itself is a scratch event in which members roll four games across eight lanes in the qualifying rounds. The top six bowlers advance to the Sunday match-play Finals.

In the Finals, each match consists of one game with the high game determining the winner. Thirty bonus points are awarded for each win, 15 bonus points for each tie.

Ladies with average of 170 or under may enter the qualifying rounds only once.

Entry fee is \$17 (prize fee \$10, lane fee \$5, director and expense \$2). Special cash prizes of \$10 each are awarded to the member

who is the leading qualifier after Saturday's play and to the member who rolls the highest qualifying game.

The prize fund is returned 100% and one place is paid for each four entries.

Ladies interested in making a reservation for one of the qualifying squads should contact Frank Hunt at Southside Lanes before Thursday. All others may sign up when they come to Astro Bowl to participate.

New members wishing to join METRO-170 should arrive at the lanes at least 30 minutes prior to squad time.

The first METRO-170 tournament was held at Southside Lanes on September 17-18. The event drew 35 entries and paid a prize

fund of \$345 plus special prizes.

Tootsie Phillips was the first METRO-170 champion after she averaged 178 in the match-play Finals to earn the \$85 first place prize.

In the WIBC sanctioned event,



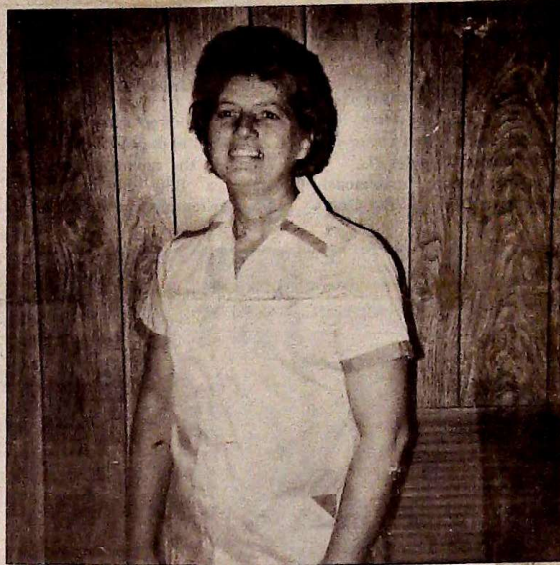

JODY Wright is starting to make folks realize that she can bowl as well as she paints.

Jody, the mother of four children, rolled a 288 game at Oak Hills recently. It is the highest individual mark of the current season for a woman bowler.

"I bowl for recreation and I paint for my job," Jody said. "Painting started out as a hobby, now it's a fulltime responsibility. My paintings range from \$20 to \$400. Painting has been properous for me. Now, my bowling has been better this year than in past years."

The 47-year old kegler spared the first frame, then cracked 10 in a row before leaving the 5-10 in the Wednesday Ladies Classic League at Oak Hills. Her first game was a 214 and she finished with a 160 for a 662 series. It was Jody's first 650-or-better set.

"I stayed relaxed during the 288, then I fell apart," said Jody, who specializes in landscape oil paintings. "I turned to jello and rolled that 160."

Jody's previous high-game was a 268 nearly two years ago at Wonder Bowl. She and Evelyn Hector won the State Open Doubles in Corpus Christi six years back.

"I've been bowling since I was in high school, about 30 years ago," said the Houston native. "I took an interim from bowling to have four children. They are all grown now and now I have time for myself. That's why I started back bowling and painting about five years ago."

Jody's current bowling success could be attributed to the change to a lighter ball.

"I tried 16 and 14-pound balls, but I decided on an 11-pounder because I had better control of it," Jody said.

"Even though I have three finger holes, I only use two because I feel I can get better control. I used to be a pitcher in high school and played basketball in college. So, I had the tendency to throw my bowling ball like a baseball until I made the change. I got a lighter ball and now I'm having a good time, and my game is improving."

Mrs. Wright, who had a 181 high-average last year, currently carries a 183 average.

"I would like to fish, but I don't have time. Aside from bowling, my husband, Laurence, and I travel nearly every weekend to art shows around the state. I bowl twice a week, and paint 10 hours a day," added Jody, who is currently exhibiting her works on the Riverwalk near the Hilton Hotel downtown. The former legal secretary has been a resident of the Alamo City for 13 years.

"We're about to move to Comfort, so I might have more time to fish. The only stipulation was that I could come into town on Wednesdays and Fridays to bowl. I can paint in Comfort, but I can't bowl out there."

"I get all kinds of awards for that 288 — a 275 patch, a Century Patch, and an award for 650-or-better series," Jody continued. "I've never gotten over 650 before, and it should have been more. However, I'm not greedy — I'll take a 288 and a 662 anytime. Maybe, when I get a little older, I'll bowl a 700."

"How they say it, 'You're not getting older, you're getting better' — there could be some truth to that."

In that close game Colleen struck out too, finishing with a 193.

Barbara Tate had such a lead going into the final game that no one could take the title away, and she defeated runner-up Rocky Boubel 189-153.

During the Finals, the 15-year veteran of bowling wars, averaged 182.8. She took the lead after the first match against Madelyn Spreng and kept it throughout the Finals.

Barbara and her husband, Buck, have two sons, Gary 23, and Steven 22, as well as a 14-year old daughter, Karen.

Just six weeks ago Barbara rolled her first 600 series, 612 in the Sundowners Mixed at Southside. The same week she and Buck became grandparents for the first time when young Steven arrived at her son's house.

Barbara has been a girls baseball team coach and made a few other headlines two years ago when she finished third in singles in the Texas Women's Bowling Association championship tournament at Longview. She currently bowls in two leagues and has previously carried a high average of 166.

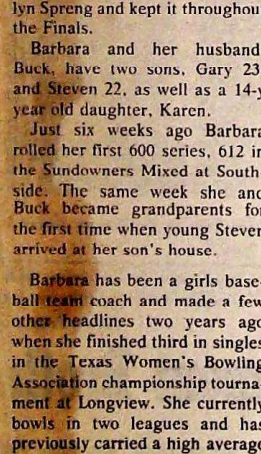

Jean Nelms rolls hefty 277 game

Jean Nelms wouldn't argue that this is the season for high games for women keglers.

Nelms spanked the pins for a 277 in the Railroad Mixed League at Fort Sam Houston Monday night.

The score comes on the heels of a brilliant 288 game by Jo Ann "Jody" Wright two weeks ago.

In late development, Nita Stein had a blistering 278 game at Astro last week.

"I was rolling the ball instead of helping it, because of this back problem I have," Nelms said. "I guess that was the key to that big game — I was just rolling it."

Jean's previous high-game was a 269 in the Indianapolis Star's Women's Ten-Pin Classic in 1973 at Indianapolis, Inc.

"One of the biggest problems I have is rushing — that's most people's problem," said the 48-year old righthander, who is originally from Columbus, Ga. "Especially rushing that first step. Rushing is what makes you cross over. You get there before you're ready to throw the ball and that hurts. You've got to count your steps before throwing the ball to get back into your regular swing. I guess this back problem is a blessing in disguise."

But, the night wasn't all pleasant for Jean as she finished with games of 159 and is 154 for a 590 series.

"I guess I started pulling the ball," Jean said. "I just kept getting splits ... it was disgusting."

"During the 277, I had the first four in a row, then I had a real good hit in the fifth frame but left the seven. I picked up the spare, then had six straight. The last ball, I left the 4-6 — I guess that's when I began getting all the splits."

Nelms, who has been in the city for two years, carries a 177 average at Fort Sam, and averages of 176 and 170 in two leagues at Wonder Bowl. Jean's husband, retired Colonel Norman Nelms, is manager at the Winderest Golf Club.

"My husband likes to bowl," said Jean, who has been bowling for 26 years. "When you have children, that's all you can do. It's kind of hard getting my husband to bowl now, since he loves his golf."

"When I first started bowling at Fort Sam, I wasn't too impressed with the conditions. Now, Fort Sam has the same conditions as Wonder Bowl. I learned about conditions when we were in Virginia — I bowled in a traveling league in 12 different houses, and the conditions were different at all 12 houses! Virginia is where I really learned about bowling. I learned from two girls, who had 190 averages and were considered semipro. They taught me how to adjust to lane conditions."

Jean also worked with youngsters, teaching the fundamentals of bowling, in Carlisle, Pa., and Indianapolis.

"I presume the reason for my recent successes in the last few years is that I'm concentrating more that I'm older," said Nelms, who earned a Century Patch and a state award for her 277 game.

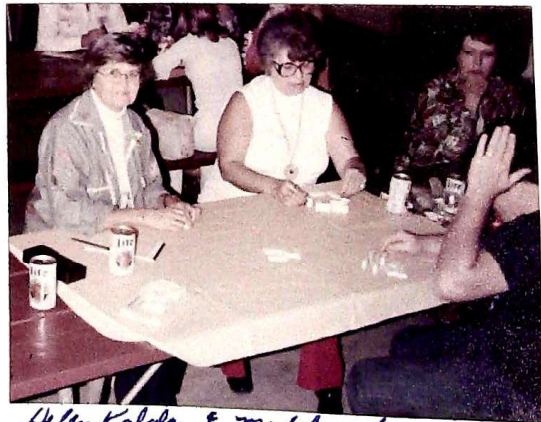

PARTIAL TOURNAMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS

(Complete tournament rules may be found in each bowling establishment)

- ELIGIBILITY:** Entry will be open to members of the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association. Members of other associations who bowl in leagues sanctioned through this association may enter, but participation shall be confined to the team event with the team of which the bowler is a regular member. Every entrant must be a member of WIBC.
- TEAM EVENT:** A member may bowl as often as she wishes in team event; however, no more than three players may bowl together more than once. No more than three players on the same team can place more than once in the prize list for position standing.
- DOUBLES AND SINGLES:** Singles and Doubles may only be entered once. Bowlers entering Doubles must also enter Singles, and vice versa.
- ALL EVENTS:** All events is automatically entered without fee when bowler enters team, doubles and singles; however, only those paying the optional all events fee shall be eligible for prize money in all events. Paid All-Events are not transferable unless substitute replaces original entrant in all three events and the transfer is made by the tournament manager or her assistants prior to substitute's participation in any event.
- When a bowler bowls in team event more than once, her first team score shall count toward her all events score.
- Handicap to be 80% from the highest in each class.** Open Division will receive a 80% handicap from the following scratch figures: Team event from 1000; Doubles Event from 400; Singles Event from 200. All other classes will be handicapped from the top of their respective categories. There will be four classes.
- In this tournament, the scratch score winners in each event shall be declared the **CHAMPIONS** and the highest all-events scratch score, regardless of class, shall be declared and acclaimed the **LOCAL CHAMPION**.
- Tournament Average:**
 - Entrants will use their highest WIBC sanctioned league average of 21 or more games taken from previous winter leagues or as of midnight, June 1, 1977 (Provided winter league ended in March, April or May as listed in the Yearbook.) Averages subject to change if participant bowler in any league which did not submit averages.
 - If no previous winter season average, an entrant shall use her highest WIBC sanctioned league average as of the end of the previous summer season, provided she has bowled 21 games or more.
 - If no previous winter or summer league average has been established, an entrant shall use her highest current WIBC sanctioned league average of nine (9) games or more as of closing date of entry (Thursday, October 13, 1977).
 - Entrants not having an average as specified in either a, b, or c, will use her highest average for nine (9) or more games as of date of participation.

- Participation must check in 1/2 hour before scheduled time of events and must show WIBC card upon checking in. Replacements may be allowed for just cause in any event upon notification to the Local Secretary at least one hour before scheduled time of event.
 - Substitute will not be required to reimburse the original entrant with the entry fee paid nor shall she be expected to give the original entrant any prize money or trophy she (the substitute) may win.
 - Scorekeeper will be furnished by the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association.
 - Any player or team arriving late shall begin play with the score counting beginning with the frame then being bowled. No frames may be made up. No absentee average at any time is permissible in tournament play.
 - Entry fee must accompany entry form. **RESERVATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED BY TELEPHONE** but will be forfeited unless all fees are in the hands of the secretary by Monday, October 3, 1977.
- Members are requested to wear suitable attire when appearing in the Local Tournament. **SHORTS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED.**
- A prize list of winners will be posted in each bowling establishment ten days after the close of the tournament — one week after winners prize list has been posted will be allowed for protest of the winners' prize list.

In City Tournament:

Kathy Kirst Leads With 1796

If the first weekend is any barometer the 42nd annual San Antonio Women's Bowling Association tournament may be a record-breaker, score-wise.

Kathy Kirst, 17, Alberta E. Crowe Star of Tomorrow winner, paced the adult action in her first local association tournament. Kathy stroked in a beautiful 615 in her doubles competition at Southside on Saturday and she and her partner, Debbie Lauzon, quickly took over the Class A Doubles lead.

Kathy then popped in a 599 for her Singles tally to become the scratch leader in that category.

Sunday at Oak Hills, rolling with the Marsh's Mobil Service Station team, Kathy slammed in a 582 to become the first weekend scratch leader in Class A All Events with 1795. Her score is 75 pins over the 1976 first weekend leader, Rhoda Marmolejo, who had 1721 scratch.

The Oak Hills AJBC Coaches #1 team of Gloria Rios, Olivia Osborne, Elsie Vetter, Linda Withoff and Nina St. Clair needed little coaching as they banged their way into first place in Class A Team event with 2754 scratch, 3154 handicap. Their scratch score is 137 sticks over the 1976 opening weekend score set by the Oak Hills All Star team; and 313 over the scratch total put in by the Columbia "300" team.

Angela Perez and Annabelle Johnston, with 1226, are in first place in the Class A handicap, and Wendy Hoskins is the handicap leader in Class A Singles.

In All Events in Class A Anna Lee Kass slammed her way to the top of the standings with 1822 for her first three appearances in the tournament.

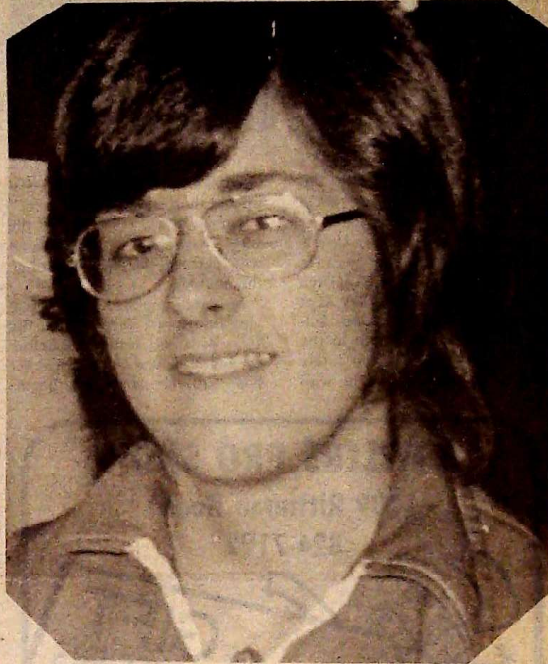
The standings board in Class B was in a constant state of change as the mid-average ladies took aim at the record prize fund of \$12,950 offered this year.

Many of the Senior ladies went after the SAWBA Special Senior Citizens awards for the ladies over the age of 55. Three tied for the high game honors with each swatting a nifty 189 game. On the standings board are Lenora Rose, Eva Keith and Beryl Mullins, with Mrs. Rose also recording the Senior high series of 526.

Mrs. Cumberland who dominated Class C Singles also recorded the tournament high game of 245 and Shirley Sheets rolling with Garcia's Team in Class A put in the tournament high series to date - 628.

The record set by Kathy Kirst in 1975 when she was 15 years old fell on August 1 in Vallejo, California, when 17-year-old Nikki Gianullias slammed in 274-257-279 for an 810 series.

Nikki has recorded 11 three-game series over 700 and over and a perfect game during the 1976-77 season.

The 800 series is the first by a girl in AJBC history and ranks as the fourth highest sanctioned 800 series ever among women bowlers.
