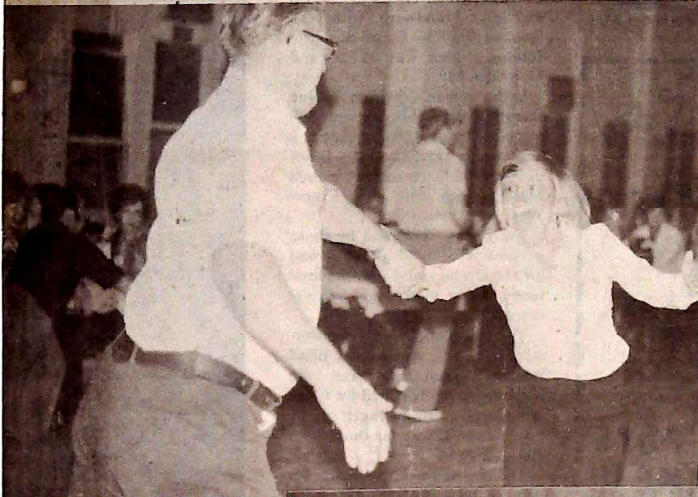

'Hall' Drive Funds Near \$10,000!

No goal was set for the local fund drive campaign staged by the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association for the National Hall of Fame and Museum, but never in their wildest dreams did SAWBA board members expect the response they received at press time \$8,605.88 had been received or pledged, with the SAWBA phone ringing constantly!

Mrs. Helen Baetz, local Hall/Museum chairman and SAWBA president Mrs. Madelyn Spreng expressed gratitude to all the bowlers, proprietors, tournament associations, SABA committee workers and league secretaries who made it all possible.

During the seven days of the drive bowlers were asked to

donate at least \$2 to become Charter Sponsors joining bowlers all across North America to build America's newest Sports Shrine.

Incentive awards for leagues with 100% participation in the campaign were offered, with the funds to be added to the league's prize fund. First place was \$200 and second was \$100. Oak hills Does#51 was the winner of the \$200 award, and the San Pedro Businessmen's Doubles earned the second place money of \$100.

A second award was offered for bowlers donating at least \$1 and those who participated in their league as Charter Sponsors even though their league was not 100% league.

Winners of the three prizes offered were Benny Tang, \$100, Betty Jo Reid, a league secretary,

\$75, and Keith Smith, \$25.

The \$500 incentives were donated to the Hall/Museum Committee by Roger L. Zeller, the 1977 inductee into the local Hall of Fame. Mr. Zeller is president of Columbia Industries.

Through league participation the Committee registered a whopping \$4,122.88 and from pledges from proprietors, bowling leaders and others \$3947.50 was accumulated.

The Committee offered a 'fun bonus' to all bowlers interested in helping build the Hall. A huge Country/Western Victory Dance Saturday evening at Hermann Sons lanes was the climax of the week. Items such as crochet, paintings, macrame, and paper products made and donated by SAWBA board members were

auctioned to the highest bidders with the proceeds going to the campaign.

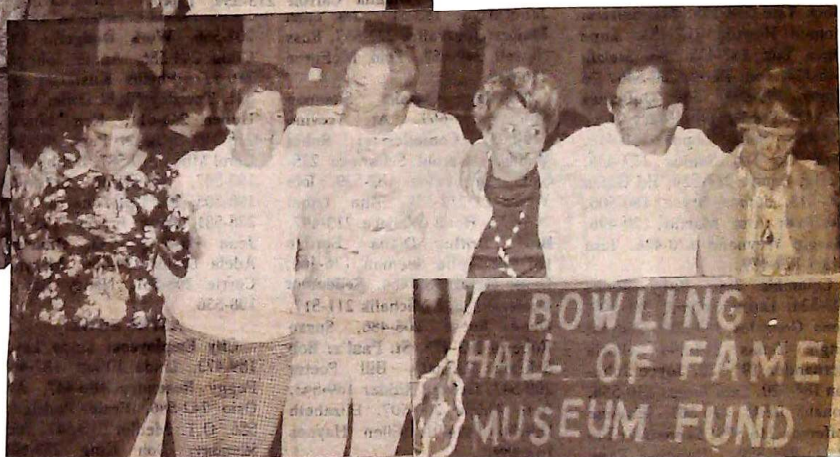
Jack Spreng's auctioneering and committee member Susan Schoenfeld's booze basket drawing generated an additional \$535.50, bringing the total to its lofty plateau.

The total could soar even higher this week as additional pledges are received in the Leadership Gift Program. Patron Gifts are for those pledging \$150, Builders Club \$300 and Founders Club \$1000. All leadership gifts are payable in three years and all donations are tax deductible.

Leadership Gift donors will have their names inscribed in the Hall/Museum after completion and will be presented a Lifetime Visitors pass.

Bowlers or businessmen wishing to make a pledge should call the SAWBA office at 824-1321 to secure a National Bowling Hall of Fame pledge card.

The Drive received an unexpected 'boost' mid-week when television station KENS-TV Sports interviewed Chairman Baetz in the pits while the fund drive was being conducted among the league members of San Pedro's Breakfast Clubbers. Television sports celebrity Gary DeLaune listened to the story about the Hall/Museum drive, then contributed his \$2 Charter Sponsor fee to Mrs. Baetz, as did cameraman Rex Stanley who filmed the segment. Each received a 'thank you,' the dazzling Baetz-smile and a hug before departing the center.

**Annual Meeting/Election
Next Month**

The annual meeting of the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association will be held Sunday March 19, at 3:30 p.m. at the International West Room of the Ramada Inn, 333 N.W. Loop 410.

According to SAWBA president Madelyn Spreng, "Members of our association are urged to attend this business session, which is only one of two general membership meetings required by WIBC. Members will be able to learn more about the operation of the local association by listening to the reports of board members and the various committees which function throughout the year for the women bowlers."

"We will have several proposed amendments to our Standing

Rules, and members will be asked to elect the ladies who will guide the association's work in the coming years. The even numbered Director's slots are to be filled and the offices of President, 2nd Vice President and Treasurer are also to be elected," said Mrs. Spreng.

Looking ahead to the 1979 WIBC and TWBA Conventions in Tucson and Austin, members will be asked to select those ladies who will represent them at the two conventions in Tucson and Austin next year.

Local secretary Sylvia Broyles is distributing memos to each ladies league president and secretary reminding them that WIBC League Rule 102c, Page 114 of the WIBC Constitution, states that it is the President's duty to attend meetings of the local association and if she is unable to attend, she should send the vice president, or a duly accredited representative in her place.

"At the present time, we have processed over 400 league sanctions," said Mrs. Broyles. "Our attendance, however, at association meetings has not even reached 100 in many years."

"We call on all league officers to begin to make plans to attend the SAWBA Annual Meeting—have your league represented and begin to get involved in YOUR association—it's a pleasurable experience," concluded Mrs. Broyles.

"After that 700 series, I guess I wasn't too serious about league play. Once you bowl a good series, you think you can do it again. However, in most cases you try too hard and you mess up."

Among her accomplishments listed for local bowling promotion were serving as secretary of two leagues, each 15 years and serving as an officer in others.

She was the local association secretary for eight years, served as director 7 years, 2nd vice president four years and first vice president 3 years.

Mrs. Baetz chaired the successful National Hall of Fame/Museum fund drive just completed as well as being the chairman of the Nominating Committee for the local association and serves on the policy and procedure committee of SAWBA.

She has served on the local AJBC board, helped organize the local bowling council, served as

1st vice president and became president before the first year was completed. She was re-elected two terms as president. She is a former director of the San Antonio "600" Club, member of the Council Hall of Fame and is the first Life Member of the San Antonio WBA.

"Martha" Entries In The Lanes

Women across the city are completing entry forms for the 17th Annual Martha Washington Tournament to be staged at Oak Hills Bowling Lanes throughout the month of June and the first two weekends in July.

Mrs. Bettie Jo Geisler, tournament secretary, advised that entry fee is \$6 per person (prize fund \$3.05, expense \$4.40 and bowling fee \$2.55) with a prize ratio of one to ten returned 100% to the participants.

No advance reservations will be accepted and the entry closing date is May 1. All entry fees must accompany entry blanks, and no personal checks will be accepted.

The event is divided into two classes A and B with teams divided 776 and up in A and 775 and under in Class B. Doubles are separated at 311 and up for A and 310 and under for B. Singles are

156 and up in A and 155 and down for B.

The handicap within each class is 75% from 200. Bowlers may enter team event as often as desired, but not more than three bowlers on the same team may place more than once in the prize list for position standings. Bowlers may bowl only once in singles and doubles.

The tournament is sanctioned by WIBC and all rules governing special tournaments will apply. All questions not covered will be decided by the Martha Washington Tournament Committee of Mrs. Geisler, Laurie Jo Seales, Jerry Johnson, Carol Smith, Marie Denman and Shannon Palmer.

Reminder from Sylvia...

The San Antonio Women's Bowling Association is reminding league secretaries that it is nearing the time to submit final average sheets to the association office.

WIBC Rule 102e provides that submission of the Final Average Sheet is the responsibility of the Secretary immediately after the completion of the league schedule.

Failure on the part of the league secretary to comply with the provisions of Rule 102e or fulfill other duties as may be prescribed by the league's Board of Directors shall be cause for

removal from office and/or suspension from membership in WIBC.

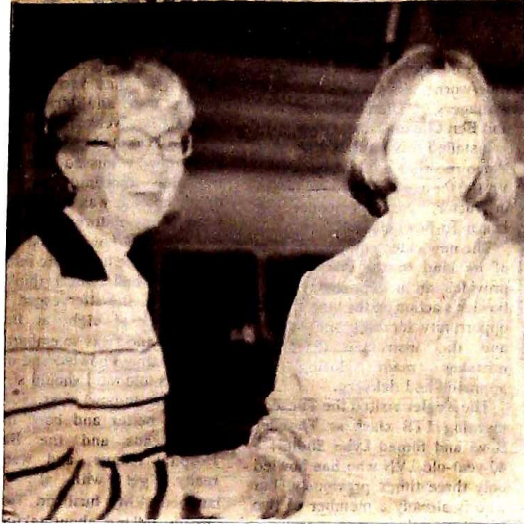
The SAWBA office has requested from league secretaries a list of all female bowlers, regardless of number of games, in alphabetical order, with the last name first. They are asking for WIBC numbers after each name plus the total pins knocked down during the season, the number of games and the end of season average. Additionally, a listing of all women who have rolled series over 600 is requested and for the Texas Women's Bowling Association a list of all

bowlers who have had 650 or better series this season.

Leagues which extend past June 1, the cut off date for information going into the Yearbook are requested to submit the same information to the SAWBA office on a regular league standing sheet.

All end of season information requested is to be mailed as quickly as possible to the SAWBA office at Post Office Box 16427, San Antonio, Texas 78216. For additional assistance secretaries may contact the SAWBA office at 824-1321.

Laurie Jo Takes 3rd in Bluebonnet Queens



Laurie Jo Scales, won more matches in the Finals than the Queen and came within a whisker of the runner-up spot. Laurie Jo, rolling in her third Queens, averaged 192.14 for her 14-game Finals play, after squeezing into the Finals as the last qualifier.

She rolled on the second squad on Saturday and slammed in a four game block of 838 with a 255 high game. Returning for her second block she popped in a 739 with a 193 high. When the field was cut to the top 36 for the Semi-Finals, Laurie Jo was almost unnerved after missing an easy spare on her final ball, but her minus-119 was just enough to allow her to continue.

Cheryl Bodenhamer and Kathy Kirst also survived the cut to the Finals after rolling 1542 and 1519 blocks in their qualifying. After the Semi-Final round, Cheryl was in 11th and Kathy in 13th. Kathy's first qualifying game was a 255 and Cheryl's high on the second block was a 246.

Mary Falconer Wins LATA—AGAIN!!



Eighteen points separated the winner - Mary Falconer - and the runner-up Charlene Scheel - when position round time rolled around at the March Ladies Amateur Tournament Association at Oak Hills.

Charlene, who hails from San Marcus, was the leading qualifier after Saturday's play and took the tournament lead after the fifth match on Sunday. To this point she had amassed a 944 total which included a high game of 204, and she had only one loss.

Mary, meantime, had dropped two matches and recorded a 955 for her first five games.

In the 6th Mary slammed in her Finals high game of 216 to take the lead while Charlene won her match with a 182. The see-saw

battle continued as Charlene turned on the steam with a 212 game to Mary's 179. Each won the bonus points setting the stage for the final game.

Charlene admitted being nervous in her first crack at becoming an LATA Champion, while Mary's who's been down that road five times previously took it in stride.

The 192 rolled by Mary which included a four-strike string was enough to take the match and the bonus point - and her 6th LATA championship. Mary's average was 193. Charlene's 190. Each won 6 matches.

A few lanes away Laurie Jo Scales tossed in the Finals high game of 222 but couldn't get ahead of first-time finalist Shirley Henry who completed her finals play with a 184.7 average after winning five of her matches. Laurie Jo averaged 188.3, winning three matches.

At the annual meeting preceding the tournament Sher Dunlap assumed the presidency of the monthly tournament company. Her line officers will be Rayne Mitchell, vice president, Gail Cantu, secretary, Nora Johnson, treasurer and Kathy Kirst, sergeant-at-arms.

In legislative action, the rules were amended to read that should there be less than 20 members present for a tournament, a sweeper will be held and no champion named. The eligibility rule regarding PWBA members was revised to read that if a prospective member was held a pro card withing the past five years she would not be eligible to participate.

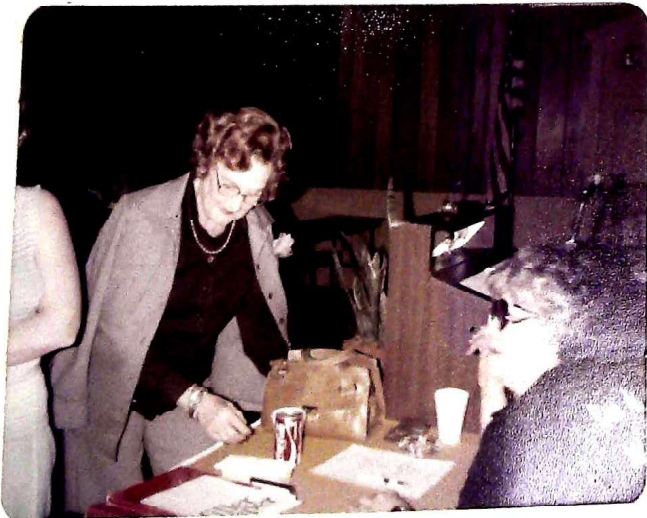

Granny Haufler Makes Easter Special!

Easter is a Christian festival in the spring celebrating the resurrection of Jesus, but to millions of kids it's the time for the Easter Bunny, colored egg hunts and new spring finery.

Here in San Antonio, Easter was celebrated Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday in the Oak Hills Nursery and the 'bunny' was "Granny" Erna Haufler, caretaker of the nursery three days a week and one-half of San Antonio's only WIBC Doubles team.

For this "Bunny-Granny" preparations for Easter begin a month early, for several reasons. Number one reason is that it takes almost that long just to prepare the 50 or 60 baskets, especially when the "Bunny" has limited use of loving hands now slightly crippled with arthritis.

"Granny" Haufler, and that's what all the wee ones call her,

was 80 years old last September. She collects plastic margarine tubs throughout the year. These are covered with bright crepe paper, filled with cellophane grass and each has one colored boiled egg, several candy eggs and, of course, the Easter Bunny himself.

When the youngsters arrived in the nursery they are met by their smiling Granny who admonishes "Don't touch", but the gaily decorated Easter table filled with baskets, and there's one for each, captures the attention of each wide-eyed little one much as the annual Christmas tree does.

For 15 years Oak Hills youngsters have been treated to Granny Haufler's special brand of Easter love, although she admits it is becoming increasingly difficult to get the baskets ready.

"You know it took me all afternoon and until late Thursday night just to punch the holes in the butter tubs. My hands don't work as well, and that plastic is hard to punch through with a heated ice pick. But the worst is vacuuming up that cellophane grass from the carpet," she said.

Granny Haufler, at eighty, still lives alone, does her own laundry, cooking and cleaning the apartment she has called 'home' for 11 years, and attends St. Paul's Lutheran Church regularly.

And what a history there is behind this beautiful lady! She's been bowling since the late 1920s, met and became friends with Billy Simon when she first arrived in Texas, and that friendship is still growing.

With eyes twinkling, and between playing 'referee' for several tot-spats, she reminisced of the days that used to be, when the price of bowling was

two games for a quarter, and prizes were buckets of lard, or a pound of butter, a sack of flour, and, of course, the quarter-keg of beer which the loser had to pay for.

"You know, I once tried to play cupid for Billy with my husband's cousin, but it didn't work. She was so busy beating us at pinochle, fishing and getting women into the game of tenpins instead of 9-pins which was all we played, she didn't have time for my foolishness," she laughed.

Erna was one of the first tenpin bowlers in Texas, with Billy of course, Babe Campbell, who now resides in the Valley, and several other former great pioneers. Erna Haufler was the first TWBA president when the Women's Texas State Bowling Tournament was formed and became affiliated with WIBC in 1935.

She became San Antonio's first WBA president when the association was formed, and in 1935 she and Billy Simon also became Doubles Champions in the WIBC Championship Tournament—a feat not duplicated by San Antonio women since that time.

Erna says she has a framed picture on her bureau of the Champs, but it's rapidly being covered by school photos of her many charges, most now adults. Too, although she didn't say so, she carries several hundred photos of many of the youngsters she has 'minded' in her purse.

Her last performance on the lanes was during the 1968 WIBC Tournament at Wonder Bowl. A muscle spasm forced her from the lanes in the fifth frame of the second game, but her opener-at age 70—was a 132!

She has been a widow for several decades, has one son, who's been married 36 years, one grandchild and two great-grandchildren.

She's a great and grand lady—a respected and beloved leader for women's bowling—but the title she cherishes most is—"Granny", and to hundreds of tots she'll always be their own special 'Easter Bunny'.

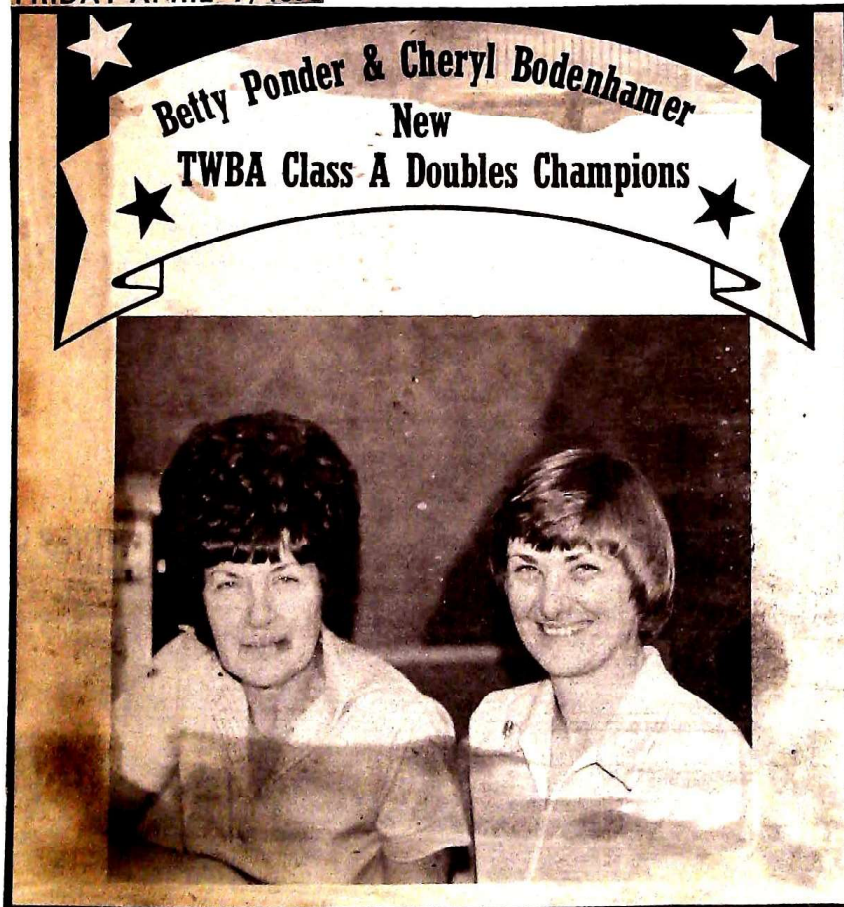

Both Irma and Kathy earned a WIBC Century Award for scoring 100 pins over their average.

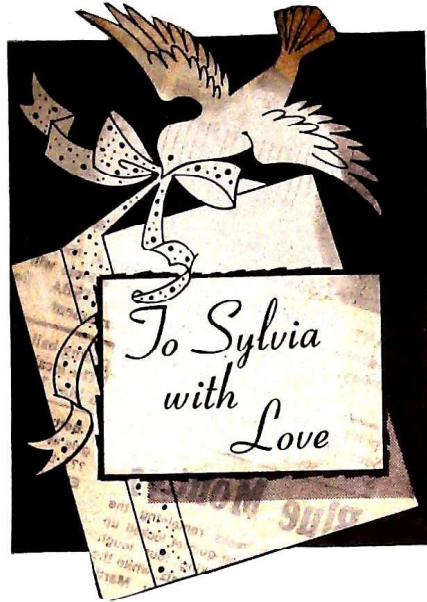

In addition to her duties for SAWBA, TWBA and now WIBC, Sylvia is Vice President of the Local Bowling Council, member of the Southwest Texas Junior Bowling Association, Member of the National, Texas and local "600" Club and the Texas Women's Bowling Writers, and of course, serves as an ex-officio member of all SAWBA committees.

As further testimony to the wisdom of Mrs. Crowe, who has guided WIBC since 1960, Sylvia was appointed the WIBC Board last year to complete a three year term as Director #18 in the position vacated by Mrs. Billie O'Connor, Chehalis, Washington, who was elevated to 6th Vice President.

The San Antonio bowling family unites in extending best wishes to Sylvia for continued success and are secure in the knowledge that Women's affairs will be in capable hands.

The outpouring of love in the messages on pages 3, 4 and 5 are but a token of the deep esteem and admiration in which Sylvia is held here in San Antonio. We know, too, that the sentiments and the many more she will receive later will carry her through whatever challenges may be ahead.

SAWBA Delegates Face Busy WIBC Agenda

Fourteen San Antonio Women's Bowling Association members will represent the more than 12,000 female bowlers of the city at the Women's International Bowling Congress Convention this weekend in Miami, Florida.

The Miami tournament is bowling's fifth largest and WIBC's fourth largest tournament ever. It is WIBC's third longest and fourth richest, has the third biggest traveling entry and the fourth largest field in doubles, singles and all events. More than 40,000 entrants are expected to participate.

Palm Springs Lanes site of the team event is a 40-lane center in Hialeah. Brunswick Congress Bowl in N. Miami, site of the doubles and singles as well as the

Queens tournament, has 52 lanes.

Delegates representing WIBC's more than 4-million members will find everything from rules questions to poignant ceremonies dotting their agendas. The majority of the activities will be centered around the huge Hotel Fontainebleau. Mrs. Alberta E. Crowe will officially open the business session at 9 a.m. on Monday morning.

Three members will be inducted into the WIBC Hall of Fame, Mrs. Theresa Kelone, Little Rock, a frequent visitor to San Antonio, Mrs. Mae Bolt, Berwyn, Ill. and Mrs. Pat Dryer of Indianapolis.

In the business session on Tuesday delegates will consider 28 proposed amendments to the WIBC by laws and rules. Six of the proposed changes deal with reduction of the size of the delegations to future conventions.

One of three cities will be selected as the site of the 1981 convention—St. Louis, Baltimore and Tulsa. The 1979 and 1980 meetings and tournaments are at Tucson and Seattle.

In addition to convention activities there is a President's Reception, the National Bowling Writers annual meeting and awards luncheon at which Mrs. Helen Baetz and Mrs. Ella O'Quinn will receive awards, the

Pioneer (20 year) Club, the National "600" Club annual meeting and various workshops.

Strikes 'n

Lola Graves has nine in a row

"Just think, I had nine strikes in a row. I actually had a perfect game going."

That's what Lola Graves said of her 277 game at Mitchell Lanes last week.

"I was just thinking about what Jaye Jean (Smith) told me, 'Don't pull the ball across your body,'" said the jovial 56-year grandmother. "That's what I did to open the 10th, pulled the ball across my body. When I let the ball go, I just sighed and turned around."

Graves left the 1-2 to open the 10th, picked up her spare, and got nine on her last ball. The Washington, Tex., native finished with games of 159 and 167 for a 603 series.

"That 600 was even tougher to get," smiled Graves, whose previous best are a 278-650 at Oak Hills in 1975, a 286 at Goliad and a 250-690 at the old St. Gerard's lanes. "All I needed was a spare in my last game to get that, and I got it. The only ball I throw is a straight one. Wherever I put the ball down is where it's going to go. Jaye Jean's advice about staying behind the foul line has also helped."

Graves' introduction to bowling came as a result of a heart condition and a friend in the early sixties. As she puts it, "If it were not for my heart and one of my church members, I probably wouldn't be bowling at all."

"I had to slow down in the early sixties because of a heart condition," Graves said. "My doctor, however, demanded I get involved in some type of activity. One of my girl friends suggested I try bowling. I bowled three games, went to the doctor for a check-up a few days later, and he said I was still all right. For all practical purposes, bowling helped my heart. I started bowling every night of the week. I was enjoying it and it wasn't bothering me."

"Last year, I carried a 178 average but I got sick. My average has dropped to 172 this season. Last season, I was using a

16-pounder. Now, I'm using a 14-pounder. I prefer the 16-pounder. Anyway, I feel that I can do better than what I'm doing."

"I guess I'll be like those Brooklyn Dodgers in the fifties, wait until the next time. I don't know when that'll be. It might scare me to death to come that close again."

"I threw nine strikes in a row without being nervous. Why did I get nervous in the 10th?" said Graves, who'll receive local and state awards for her 277, and a WIBC award for bowling 100-plus pins over her average. "I was clowning around with my teammates through the first nine frames and that didn't break my concentration. But it got quiet in the 10th frame. I guess if there had been some noises in the background, I wouldn't have had the time to think about what was happening. There's one thing for sure, I can tell my friend, Ike Elliott, that you can hit at Mitchell. All you have to do is concentrate."

"I've got to learn how to quit being nervous, and study and concentrate a little more. One never knows, I just might sneak up on that 300 game one of these days."

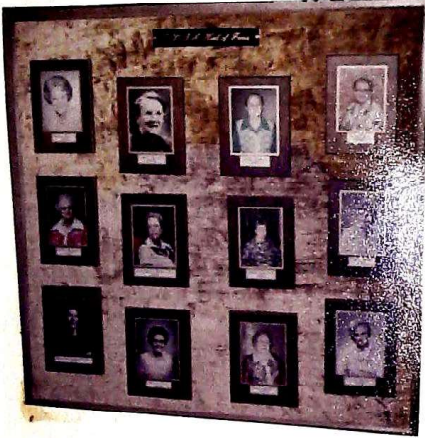
At the afternoon session TWBA's Service Award will be given to a member who is not on the Board but has, over the years, given valued service to the organization.

In her first four-game block she tangled with Melody Frazer, Glendale California losing 714-755, which dropped her into the loser's bracket.

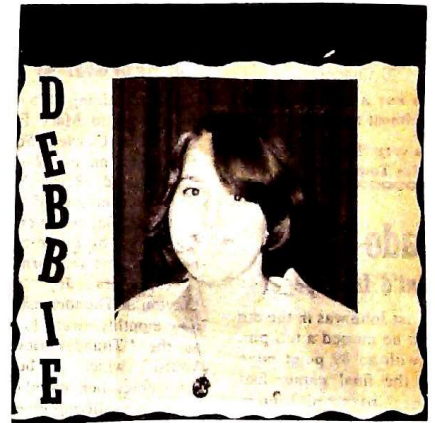
Returning to the lanes Thursday morning Debbie slammed in an 835 four game block while Sonja Doyle, Calgary, Canada logged 660.

Betty Morris Sets Visit

Mrs. Betty Morris, Stockton, California, 1977 Bowler of the Year will make two appearances at local lanes this week.

Her first appearance will be at Southside Lanes on Monday at 1 p.m. Betty will talk with bowlers under a Question and Answer format, and at 3 p.m. will pit her many talents against San Antonio's swinging-grandpop, Pat DeFily, in a match play exhibition.

Tuesday she will be at Wonder Bowl beginning at 9 a.m. for exhibitions and counseling visits with local bowlers.

The saucy redhead, who is a member of Columbia Industries professional staff, was chosen Bowler of the Year by the members of the Bowling Writers Association of America. Her male counterpart, also a member of Columbia's professional staff, was Mark Roth for the 1977 season.

Both selections were expected, because each topped their respective peers in money earnings.

For Betty it was the second time she was honored as Woman Bowler of the Year. She was the 1974 selection, finished fourth in 1975 and was second to Patty Costello, Scranton, Pa., last year.

Both Roth and Betty were overwhelming favorites. Betty received 122 first place votes and totaled 724 points. She was mentioned on 162 of the 168 ballots cast. Roth's selection was even more decisive and he totaled 798 points and was mentioned on all but one ballot.

Betty was the 1977 BPAA U.S. Women's Open and the AMF Grand Prix and she finished fourth in three PWBA events and sixth and tenth in two others. The 29-year old righthander's credits also included an 8th place finish in the WIBC Queens Tournament.

Betty's average, computed by the PWBA, was 205.6 for 288 games. In league play, she recorded a 210 during the 76-77 season, second highest among WIBC members last season.

Betty is recognized by her fellow professionals as a formidable opponent in any event and is gaining a reputation as a 'clutch bowler'. She won several of her most prestigious titles by striking out and getting the necessary pins in the final frames of championship games.

She was also the only woman selected to the Woman Bowler magazine four All-American Teams. She has been named to the team in 1973-74, 1974-75, 1975-76 and 1976-77. She is the eighth woman in 30 years to be named Bowler of the Year more than once.

bidding year with Houston, which is also bidding for the 1981 meet. Bid plans will begin immediately, selection of a theme and various other activities will commence so that many thoughts may be presented to the women attending the annual meeting in the fall.

On the agenda also for the Board of Directors was the pricing of the new SAWBA membership pins which will be available shortly before the new season. The price was set at \$2 and pins will be available from SAWBA Directors.

The Board also approved the submission the Permanent Membership application of Mrs. Mae Muenster, a San Pedro bowler, who has been active in bowling in various capacities for nearly five decades.

Mrs. Helen Kalala presented Life Member Helen Baetz with a colorful scrapbook which was prepared after the testimonial reception for Mrs. Baetz and Billy Simon last fall.

For Chris and Gladys, who entered the tournament with 159 averages, it was their first trip over the 600 mark in their first TWBA Tournament attempt.

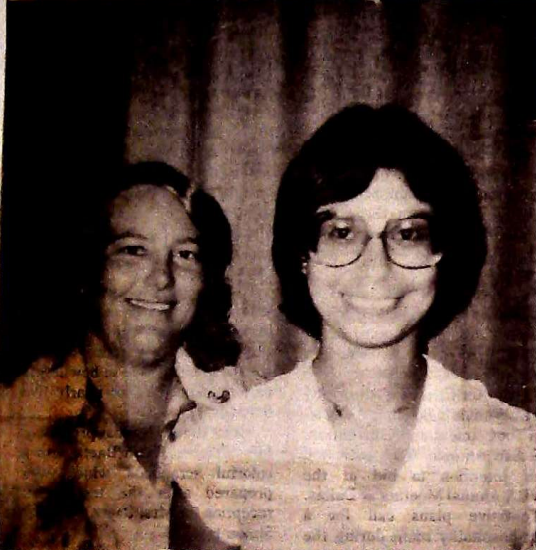
Chris led off the day's play with a 229 game, slammed in a 189

She continued her torrid pace in Singles with 179, 136 and 180 for a 1464 all events total.

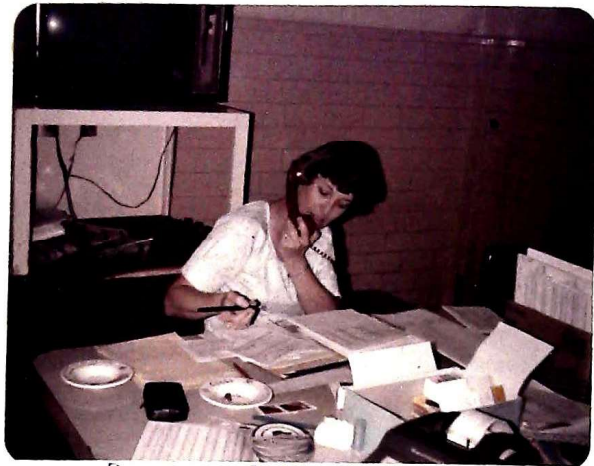
Jean's is a story of determination and love of the bowling game. She's been bowling for 13 years and previously rolled a 227 game. Dallas was Jean's third

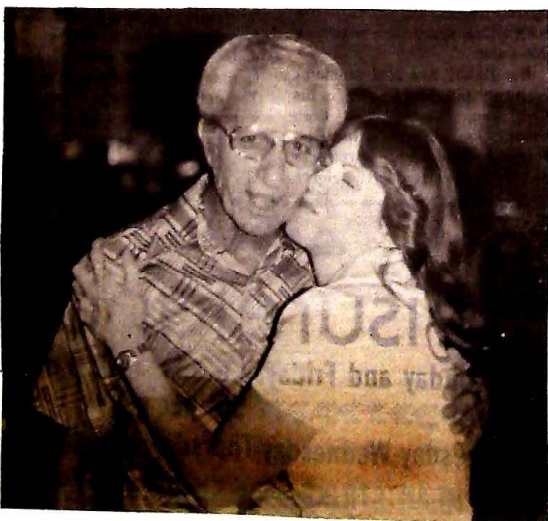

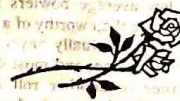

The Qualifying Round was sparked by a 300 game by Houston's Margie Rountree, although the attractive blond finished during Sunday's play.

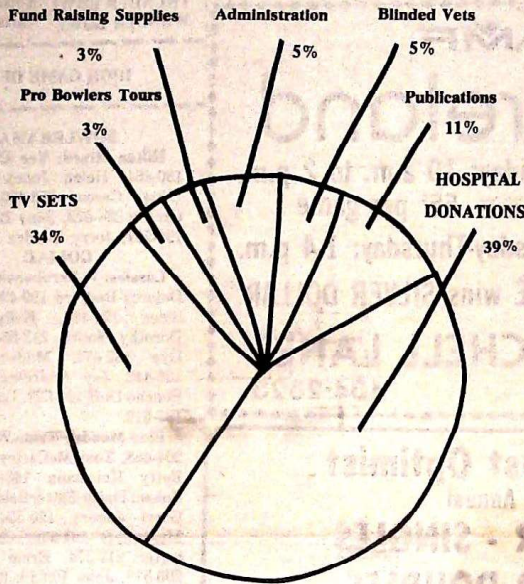

This Is BVL Time !!

Where BVL Contributions Go



More than 92 cents out of every dollar collected goes directly into benefits for disabled veterans, as illustrated by the chart above showing BVL disbursements and expenses during the audited fiscal year, 1976-77.

Funds contributed to the BVL are distributed as equitably as possible to the 160-plus VA Hospitals in the Nation.

What is this "BVL" that "Lets the Sunshine In" for hospitalized veterans across the country?

BVL is officially—the Bowlers Victory Legion—inaugurated in 1942 to aid the World War II effort. Because of donations of dollars, and time, thousands of bowlers helped provide our overseas fighting men with 400,000 decks of playing cards, 325 paperback books and many other miscellaneous items to help while away the lonely hours.

BVL also supplied servicemen on six outlying Aleutian Islands, with 50 1/2 tons of other recreation equipment including pianos and radios.

After the fighting ceased, BVL turned its efforts to aiding the hospitalized and blinded veterans.

The last year of the World War II contributions from the bowlers totaled over \$250,000. Then came the end of hostilities, and "patriotism" lost a little of its lustre—but the rehabilitation program of the nation's wounded men became a chore for many hospitals. How best to fill those lonely hours during recuperation, when only slightly more than \$45,000 was contributed?

The creed of BVL was coined—"Lest We Forget"—and bowlers were again called upon to renew their efforts for hospitalized and blinded veterans.

The measure in which bowlers met the challenges over the years following was reflected in the continued rise in contributions to BVL—and by mid-sixties contributions went over the \$300,000 mark.

At the WIBC Convention in Miami, earlier this year, it was

reported that last year's contributions exceeded \$716,000, with 152 BVL baseline checks (depending upon the number of VA Hospital beds) totalling \$147,300 were already on their way to VA hospitals across the country.

Here in San Antonio since 1972

total cash contributions from the BVL Fund to our VA Hospital was \$9200 plus 12 RCA 19" Color Television sets.

In addition, throughout this six year period, the BVL has disseminated copies of various bowling publications, "The Sporting News" and in some

cases have sent Pro Bowlers to visit the Hospitals which have bowling programs.

None of the above items would have been possible without the generous contributions received from America's bowling population.

We cannot drop the "ball" on the Bowlers Victory Legion program. This publication urges all Alamo City sanctioned bowlers to participate in the local SABA/SAWBA BVL Tournament and the Southside BVL 3-6-9 Tournament during July 2 through July 15.

The nation's hospitalized veterans receive the best medical care and attention which technical knowledge and a grateful nation can provide. But there is much more of getting well or living out the tedium of hospital residency.

The BVL Fund strives to fill part of this need by providing the 'extras' of this need—providing those 'extras' to speed up the morale and rehabilitation process to show that people on the outside remember—and care—.

Here's How You Can Help!!

The annual Bowlers Victory Legion (BVL), sponsored by the San Antonio Women's and Men's Bowling Associations, will be conducted July 2 through July 15.

It is the only tournament in the city in which bowler's league scores count toward a prize fund; and the prize fund is exceptional—including a payoff last year of \$3135. Based on the 2000 entry figure, 25 places will be paid.

For the \$1.00 donation this year, first place is estimated at \$75, second \$65 and third \$60 based on 2000 entries. Bowlers may enter as many times as they bowl in league during the term of the tournament, but cash only once.

All entries must be accepted by league secretaries before the beginning of the second game,

using current league averages. The tournament is open to sanctioned league members of WIBC and ABC only.

Women's scores will be handicapped at 80% from 200 and men will be handicapped at 75% from 200.

All league secretaries will be a vital part of this important drive. Entry forms will be available at

all bowling centers and secretaries are asked to distribute the entry forms prior to league play.

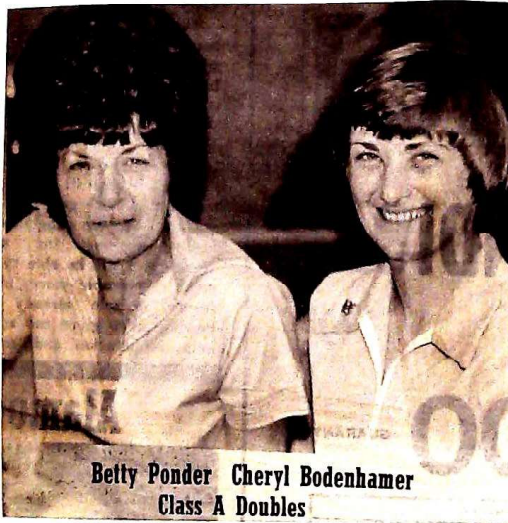

Handicap is to be 80% from the highest in each class and Open Division bowlers will receive a 80% handicap from the following scratch figures: Team event from 1000; Doubles from 400, Singles from 200. All other classes will be handicapped from the top.

Individual winners scratch and handicap, in each class will be awarded arm patches and scratch scores of winners in each event will be declared Champions. The highest all-events scratch score, regardless of class, shall be declared Local Champion.

Scorekeepers will be furnished by SAWBA, and the tournament office will be at Wonder Bowl under the direction of Mrs. Sylvia Broyles who will serve as Tournament Director.

Tournament entries will be available at all lanes shortly after the first of August.

As any astute businessman will do when he embarks on a new venture the search began for competent management. "Mr. Lew" chose Frank Jones to serve as manager of his new venture - Woodlawn Bowling Lanes.

In those days the game of

bowling wasn't enjoying the popularity it does today and bowling alleys were certainly nothing like today!

With Jones' expertise in bowling lane management (he worked at the old Alamo Lanes, Main Avenue and Highlands) Woodlawn Lanes thrived. In 1950 Jones was called back into the U.S. Navy, but not before helping build Woodlawn into one of the most popular centers in town with all the newest equipment available for centers at the time.

This past week Levinson employed the granddaughter of his first manager, Frank Jones, as League Coordinator of Goliad Lanes - Bonnie Haecker.

Bonnie's a lot like her granddad. She loves the game and has become quite proficient on the lanes.

She shared the SABA/SAWBA City Mixed Tournament Doubles title last year with Donnie Harborth. She's a member of the San Antonio "600" Club, and her name frequently appears in the Kegler 17th board. She carries a 170-plus average and has turned in several games over 250.

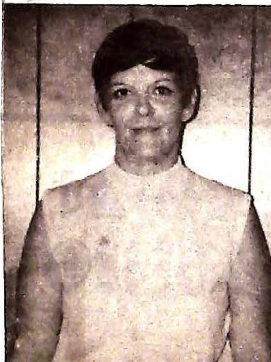
