Pat, who made hundreds of riends last year during the Spectacular and the WPBA stop at the Sports Palace dynamited the pins for games of 298, 266 and 299 for a new WIBC record of 863.

Word seeping out of Dallas during the pro-am of the the event is that the personable young pro will be an 'adopted' Texan after this month. Pat will be joining the staff of Don Carter's All Star lanes - east and west.

According to the WIBC Press Record Book her score eclipses Bey Ortner's previous record of 818 set during the 1968-69 season by 45 pins.

EASY LATA WINNER

Sometimes the lanes are just right - your timing is there - and there's nothing more to do than win a tournament!

. That was the situation faced by the 1977 Local Champion Kathy Kirst when she participated in the Ladies Amateur Tournament Association last weekend at Wonder Bowl.

The talented lefty, whose performance during the previous season could easily win her 'bowler of the year' honors, swept through the LATA finalists field at 208 a clip, with just two of the eight games under the 200 mark, and one

Kathy opened with a four game block of 823 then moved onto her final block and popped in an 841, to take the \$100 first

place prize money.

Her only loss was in match-7
when she faced her coach - her own mother, Debbie Kirst. The two battled like two strangers before Debbie took the match and the 30 bonus points with a 212-208 victory.

No one was even close at the finish as Kathy took the lead after the second match and stormed on to her second LATA title.

A distant second was Carol Smith who put on a strong stretch run to finish with 1633 to Kathy's 1874. The petite blonde bomber won four matches and averaged 189.1, to nose Mary Falconer by one stick. Mary

averaged 181.5.
As a side-note to the tournament Kathy won an additional \$30 from fellow participants and spectators when she drew her own name in the 'pot'. The 'pot' is for the high game of each match and a few bucks are awarded to the person who has the winner's

Nora Johnson logged the

high game by a non-casher (the Billy Simon Award of \$25), for a 248 game.

The Thunder Bowl Award; given to the lady with the highest qualifying block of games, was presented to Nancy Huber for 1124.

McLean, who has been bowling for 15 years, carries a 185 average. She is involved in the real estate, and in the oil and gas wells businesses.
"I come back and forth to town, and bowl in leagues where a team can have an alternate member," said McLean, who does a lot of traveling around the state. "I just can't get away from the sport."

"It would be nice to roll a perfect game or even a 280-plus game, but mainly I would like to bowl my first 700 series. I'm tired of the 670's. I come so close all the time.

"I don't bowl that well all the time," said McLean of her 277 game. "Just look, I had a 161 in the first game. I moved a little to the right after the first game, and I guess I made the right

"To me, bowling is fun. I don't worry too much or think about the big games or the big series. I go to the lanes and enjoy myself. Of course, I enjoy rolling 270-plus games when I get 'em. Those are a part of the game (smile)."



Beverly Ortner's career should be an inspiration to any struggling bowler. She rolled a 30 the first time she tried the game and averaged a modest 139 in her first full bowling, season. Less than a dozen years later, she established the women's world record for a 3-game series.

Bey has established many first' over the last decade. The veteran member of the AMF-Staff of Champions comes from a small farming community of Galva, lowar where she excelled in basketball and softball while attending high school Bowling didn't seem to

be her forte, based on the paitry double figure scoring in her first try at the game. She didn't get back to the sport until after graduation when she worked in a local bank. The diligent Bev, displaying the tenacity and dedication, that would characterize her entire bowling career, slowly but surely

improved her game to a point where she was strong enough to join the Professional Women bowlers Association in 1965.

This topflight PWBA competition quickly honed her game She won her initial pro title in 1967 at St. Paul and added her second the following year. At home Bev dominated the Iowa bowling scene winning the I965 Match Game Championship in I965;member of the State Team champions 1967 and copped the All Events title in 1968. She was also a member of the 1969 WIBC team champions.

Bev didn't attract much national prominence until the 1967-68 season when she compiled a 206 average, second highest in the nation for women. It was one particular evening during that season that has since been inscribed in bowling's history books. Competing in a men's classic league at Harmony Lanes, South Sioux City, Nebraska on the evening of Oct. 18, 1968, Bev bowled 818 on games of 267, 264 and 287, to become the first woman ever to break through the 800 barrier.

She was an All American selection in 1968 and was inducted into the lowa Hall of Fame in 1970. The ultimate honor came in 1972 when she became the fifth woman designated for the WIBC Hall of Fame's Superior Performance Award. At the time, she was the youngest ever to be selected.

Bev currently instructs at three bowling centers in Tucson and is a potent force on the pro tour. She won a Western Women Professional Bowlers title in Las Vegas in 1975, and ranked 11th in money earnings on the 1975 PWBA circuit. She also has been selected to compete both years in the National Bowling Council's Bowling Spectaculars.

Bev hasn't stopped making the bowling record book. In 1976 she became only the secon woman in WIBC history to roll three perfect games. Since then she has added another.

The Thunder Bowl center instructor had 40 series over 600 including 678, 675, two 673's, 671 and two 652's with a high game of 277 rolled at Astro



She rolled in the Alamo City All Stars carrying a 193 average; Bluebonnet 191, Tri Strikers 190, all at Oak Hills, plus the Astro Bowl Scratch Doubles, 187, and the Wonder Bowl Ladies Major 187.

Unlike previous years when Mary received the honor and had several tournament titles, this season there were no local, state or national wins; it was a matter of outstanding league play.

Mary, however, did do well outside the association area. She won five Ladies Amateur Tournament Association titles, had a third and two fifth place finishes. Her highest finish in the Southwest Masters Tournament Association was fourth; and she was 22nd in the PWBA in Houston where she logged a 204.9 average for 18 games and rolled a 720 series.

Pope advised that a new procedure would be followed by the men's association in that




board will work closely with the house directors assigned to work directly with the league bowlers.

Mrs. Spreng also reported on

a number of projects in the immediate future including the San Antonio "600" Club September 9-10; Fall Festival, September 23; Sylvia Broyles Secretaries. Singles meet, October and the local championship tournament on the first three weekends in November.

A challenge was issued to the membership by a local secretary, Sylvia Broyles-"Lets have the largest number of entries outside the Hostess City" she urge. "With the support of each of you to assist in promoting entries among the bowlers, and the proximity of the tournament site, we can accomplish the goal and meet this challenge."

Reporting on the association's increased-and recordmembership she advised that at the end of the 1977-78 season there were 12,372 sanctioned members with the 584 leagues. 





METRO-170 Kicks Off New Season At Goliad

METRO-170, the monthly tournament company for women with averages of 170 and below, opens its new season on October 21-22 at Goliad Lanes.

According to president Billie Wheeler membership dues have been reduced to \$10 per member and the tournaments carry, a \$17 entry fee each month. Dues of \$10 may be paid in two equal installments All at joining and the following month. Dues are due at the Gollad tournament.

METRO-170 offers two monthly special prizes of \$10 - one for the leading qualifier and one for the member who rolls the high game during the qualifying, but does not cash.

The event is WIBC sanctioned (Comp. Sanc. 159) and Mrs. Debbie Kirst is the 1978-79 tournament director.

The ladies will not roll in November to allow members to participate in the SAWBA Championship tournament at Sports Palace and Wonder Bowl and they will not roll in June so that they may participate in the Martha

Washington at Oak Hills.
After the October tournament at Goliad, the tornament will rotate in this order: December 16-17, Thunder Bowl; January 20-21, Turner Club; February 17-18 Billy Mitchell; April 28-29, (the fourth weekend) at Oak Hills when the Qualifying round will be at 3 p.m.; May 26-27, Hermann Sons and July 21-22 at San Pedro lanes.





Prior to the tournament on Saturday members enjoyed a Christmas party and exchanged gag-gifts.



The San Antonio Bowling Proprietors, San Antonio Men's and Women's Associations have joined hands in an all-out effort to have ABC-TV Sports reconsider the decision of one man at their local ABC affiliate (Ch 12, KSAT)

YOU CAN HELP! With this

YOU CAN HELP! With this suse of the KEGLER each bowling center in being provided a supply of petitions, directed to Mr. Jim Spence, Senior Vice President, ABC TV Sports, in New York, urging ABC to direct their affiliate to carry the Pro Bowlers Tour in this market.

According to proprietor's attorney, Frank Baskin, the time is ripe. Arrangements have been made to carry the AMF—PBA MagicScore Open at Wonder Bowl, January 30-February 3 and that's great! The show will be aired in this area, however, there are NO plans for future showing of the PBA

Baskin stated, at a recent bowling proprietors luncheon, "The only way we can make our desires known to those in more authority," and those who have control over the actions of the local television, is by the petition route. They must be made aware that San Antonlo area bowlers WANT the Pro Tour bowling program."

All possible avenues of plea have been exhausted. Joe Carmack, Wonder Bowl and Billy Mitchell proprietor and president of the local bowling propietors association, attempted to meet with James Schravone of Ch. 12, and was repulsed, at every turn. Many of you signed the petitions last season, and these were also

ignored. Letters were sent to the FCC, expressing our displeasure with Schiavone's decision. Tom Holbrook, Columbia Industries advertising specialist, made several visits to Ch 12, even giving the PBA rating statistics in other markets where the show is aired—Schiavone would not budge—we were deprived of the bowling show while Ch 12 alred Tarzan!

Now, it's time to go over his head and let ABC-TV know how we feel about being deprived of the great sports event.

PBA Commissioner Joseph R. Antenora just announced that prize money will average nearly \$100,000 weekly on the Tour which starts the first week in January in Anaheim, Calif., with the \$100,000 Miller High Life Classic.

The \$100,000 Firestone "721" Classic, a new tournament which will be held at Miami, Fla., Feb. 27 - Mar. 3, raises to 11 the number of events which will carry \$100,000 or better prize

The BPAA U.S. Open, one of bowling's toughest events which bring together the nation's leading league players and pros, will be contested at Windsor Locks, Conn., for an increased prize fund of \$125,000, April 1-7.

The Showboat Invitational at Las Vegas, Jan. 7-13, also is valued at \$125,000, and the Firestone Tournament of Champions, at \$150,000, remains the richest stop on the tour.

Antenora said the ABC Television again will carry the finals of each of the 16 tournaments, noting that the televised series, known as "Pro Bowlers Tour," enters its 18th consecutive year on ABC.

We may be unable to watch the first four Clasics, prior to the MagicScore Open, but we COULD be able to view the remaining eleven.

The petitions are at the lanes. It's up to you to get enough signatures to fill the pages please make certain that each signature is legible, giving complete addressed and zip codes. But don't wait for some one else to start-do it yourself!

When your lists are complete, either return them into the control counter at your favorite lane, to the men's, women's or proprietor's association for MAILING NO LATER THAN JANUARY 15.

We suggest that you pass the petitions through your leagues; that each center have petitions available at the control counter for signatures of those folks who enjoy the program.
