Senior Citizens Deadline Monday

Monday (January 14) is the final day for the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association to accept entries for the Senior Citizens 11th annual Mixed Invitational tournament, scheduled to roll at All Star Lanes on January 25-26 and 27.

The ABC and WIBC sanctioned event calls for senior teams of four members, with each team having at least one man or one woman on the roster. The Doubles events are to be two women, two men or mixed.

Team members may enter more than once, however no more than two players may bowl together more than once. The bowler's first appearance in team event shall count toward his/her all events total.

In Doubles, seniors may enter just once and in singles they may also participate only once. Singles and All Events have two divisions: men and women. All Events requires an optional fee of \$1.00 and the entry fee is just \$4 per person per event. All entries are to be mailed or delivered to the SAWBA office at 6939 San Pedro, Suite 107 (P.O. Box 16427, 78216).

Squads will roll on Friday, January 25 at 1 p.m. (team) and at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, January 27. Doubles squads will be added if necessary.

The handicap for the seniors is set at 80% from 800 for teams, from 400 in Doubles and from 200 in singles.

Interested Seniors who have not yet signed up as yet, need to hurry. Monday is the deadline!!!

League Officers Entries Due January 16

Time is running out for league officers wishing to participate in the 23rd annual Gus Pfeiffer League Officers Tournament to roll at Southside Lanes on Saturday, January 26 and Sunday the 27th.

The event is open to the following league officers only, (President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, ABC League Delegate and WIBC Sergeant At Arms) of all sanctioned men's, women's, and mixed leagues under the jurisdiction of the Association and the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association, and to all members of the Boards of Directors of both associations.

The League Officers tourney is a 3 game handicap doubles event. Pairings will be determined by a committee appointed by the President of SABA, keeping the combined scratch averages for all teams as close as possible. The handicap will be 75% of the difference between each team's combined scratch average and 400.

The ABC General Playing Rule 27 concerning average adjustment for previous tournament play will

apply to ABC members only. Tournament prize winnings need not be reported. League secretaries and all bowling establishments have copies of the 1978-79 season Yearbook. IT IS EACH BOWLERS RESPONSIBILITY TO VERIFY AND SUBMIT HIS OR HER CORRECT AVERAGE. Rule 36.3 and 36.3c shall apply.

Entry Fee is \$3.50 per person (\$2.00 bowling and 80c expense). Entry Fees Must Accompany Entry Forms. Tournament entry closing date JANUARY 16th, 1980. Mailed entries postmarked the first post office business day following JANUARY 16th, 1980 may be accepted.

Trophies will be awarded to each member of the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place teams, to be furnished by SABA. In addition, shift prizes will be awarded to the bowler on each shift who bowls the most pins over his or her average for the 3 games in that shift.

SHIFTS WILL BE Saturday, January 26th, 12:30, 2:30 and 4:30 pm and Sunday, January 27th, 12:30, 2:30 and 4:30 pm.

The courageous battle RUBLE E. MUENZLER waged to return to the bowling lanes was ended Sunday night at a local hospital.

Many of us who bowled in Wonder Bowl in the '60s and who participated in the Saturday Nite Doubles will always remember fun-loving Ruble and we'll always marvel at his determination to return to the lanes and mostly his happy out-going personality.

Soon after the doubles were discontinued Ruble suffered with a severe arthritic condition. He was hospitalized many times but he always vowed to return to the lanes. In great pain he continued to try-and try-and try, until he could no longer make his approach or hold the ball. Ruble and his lovely wife,

Rachel, moved with their daughters, Randi and Rhonda, to Boerne several years ago. There he had a heart attack which further weakened him. But never did he quit. Never did he complain. He continued to talk bowling, make new friends and always kept his cheerful attitude, but he was unable to keep his vow to return to his bowling buddies.

Death ended Ruble's gallant fight at age 54 and funeral services were conducted Wednesday at the Aldersgate United Methodist Church, where he and Rachel were married in 1958.

The love and sympathy of the bowling family is extended to Rachel, Ruble's daughters and his mother, Mrs. Ethel F. Sheppard, Ruble and his happy

outlook will be remembered forever by so many bowling friends whenever memories flood back of the 'good old days of the 60's.

Funeral services were also conducted Wednesday for CHARLES E. PARCHMAN OF Rosenberg, Texas. Mr. Parchman was the brother of SAWBA treasurer Mrs. Helen Kalala.

Final rites were held Saturday for MISS JULIE TIDRICK at the Mission Park Northside Chapel. Julie was the 15 year old daughter of Mrs. Fay Tidrick, a member of several local leagues and a former vice president of Metro-170.

"Nickle Week" Set For Junior Scholarship

Pat, rolling with a 153 league average, selected the tournament for the time for her first 600 series--602!!! Rick contributed 518 with his 168 average, and they received 177 pins handicap, for their runner-up score of 1297.

Enter Hall of Fame

A warm lovely evening to remember would best describe the San Antonio Bowling Council Hall of Fame Banquet Saturday at the Convention Center.

Led by the smooth Master of Ceremonies Pepper Martin of Columbia Industries, nearly 100 guests welcomed Joe Straus Sr. and Rosalie Bushick into the Council's Hall of Fame.

Alice Iltis, a Hall of Famer from 1975, traced many of Joe Straus' accomplishments in the bowling

world terming him the "ultimate sponsor" and adding "you would have to look long and hard to find a better one than Joe Straus".

"Joe Straus was an all-around athlete," Alice said of the new inductee who is currently in Intensive Care at the Nix Hospital, "he was an All American half-back for the Pennsylvania University football team and was honored as one of the greatest collegiate baseball players in history. Mr. Straus also served with honor

during the U.S. Navy during 1917-18. He has always loved sports and is currently serving on the Executive Board of the San Antonio Spurs basketball team."

She related that Straus, at a time when San Antonio was just starting to get recognition for their better bowlers, sponsored a high averaged team of men. In 1945 he sponsored a high averaged team of women which brought much acclaim to the city. They were a tough combination in staged

match play exhibitions, won six State tournaments and in 1950 came in second in the WIBC tournament at St. Paul. The Straus Frank also teamed together to win the world's mixed nine-pin tournament.

Straus and his lovely wife, Emily, often accompanied the ladies' team to their competition, took them into their home for afternoon swims and always paid all expenses whenever the team traveled or had teams in town for

A former SAWBA president, Lois Scott, installed the 13th woman to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, Rosalie Bushick. She drew an immediate laugh when she told the gathered friends and families of the honorees, by saying "Rosalie could have been my sister today, Bud Bushick (Rosalie's husband) if she hadn't married you." Lois went on to explain that in their younger days Rosalie dated her brother long before her bowling career began. "And I really wish she was," she chided Bud who thoroughly enjoyed the joke.

As a secretary in an office in the Frost Bank building, Rosalie joined her first bowling league—the Frost Bank League at Hermann Sons. She has helped form leagues and often served as secretary. In fact her first league secretarial position was for the Dee Howard Company employees league at Billy Simon's Alamo Lanes in 1956.

"All I knew about bowling at that point was that if you didn't get all the pins down with the first ball you had a chance with the second," reminisced Rosalie during her acceptance. "Mr. Frost himself let me know - very gently, but firmly about bowling etiquette."

She served SAWBA for almost eight years on the Board holding every office including secretary (10 months) and president, two years.

Certainly for her many accomplishments over the years she could have been selected for Hall of Fame status for her administrative accomplishments alone. But Rosalie was also a top-notch bowler. She was elected for honors in the San Antonio Top Twenty for women six times, was captain of three championship teams in the SAWBA championship Tournament (1962, 65 and 1970). Her highest career average was 180 in 1967, and she has an all-time high game of 178 and all-time high series of 670.

She was one of the organizers, and served as president for 11 years, of San Antonio's first match point women's league, the Alamo City All Stars at Oak Hills. For ten year she was secretary of the Airport Mixed and secretary of the 4-Squares Mixed for 13 years.

For her many years of dedication to the bowling game Rosalie was named a Life Member of the San Antonio WBA in 1979. She is the current Texas "600" Club president, and is extremely active in the church and in Garden Club of Bulverde, where she and husband Bud reside.

Enjoying her induction most were her daughter Joyce Taylor, and three grandchildren, Mike, Lisa and Chris, and a host of friends from leagues across the city.

She received a standing ovation from the dinner guests as Council President Sylvia Broyles presented her Hall of Fame membership pin.

the many matches and he did this for 13 years. Straus later sponsored an entire league for his Straus Frank employees.

Alice summed it all up by saying, "He was not just a sponsor but a good friend to all his bowlers, and his only requirement was that each team member be a good sport whether winning or losing."

David Straus, Straus' eldest son, accepted the Hall of Fame pin for his dad, and the attractive plaque presented by Alice from his team in appreciation for all his thoughtfulness and dedication to the bowling game.

In accepting the honor for his dad, David answered emcee Pepper Martin's jibe, about some of his father's famous race horses (he is best remembered for the wins staged by No Le Haca a few years back). "Race horses when registered can never bear the same names, so Dad looked for the unusual, often using Spanish or Mexican names. People always remember Dad's horses," he laughed, "even though they couldn't always remember how to pronounce the names." "One thing my Dad wanted me to relate tonight was a conversation he had with a spectator many years ago when the Straus Frank teams were bowling a tournament. The spectator, after watching both teams for awhile, came to my dad and said, after watching both teams for awhile, came to my dad and said, 'your men's team may be the greatest bowlers, but your ladies team was sure the best looking!' It must have pleased our new Hall member more than anything else.

Happy 80th Birthday Billy Simon

Maybe for the first time all season bowling will be secondary when the members of the San Antonio Women's "600" Club gather at Sparetime Lanes to celebrate Billy Simon's 80th birthday with a "Bring A Friend" doubles tournament.

According to Club president Carol Smith, the Club planned the Simon Doubles for Sunday (squads are at 1 p.m. and 3:30 p.m.) to allow ample time for Billy to spend time with her family on Saturday, her birthday.

The tournament format calls for teams to be made up of one local 600 Club member and a 'friend' who has not yet had her first 600 series. Teams will be handicapped 80% of the difference between team averages and 400 scratch.

Additional squad prizes will be donated by the honoree, Billy Simon, the Club's only Life Member, and Club officials have

announced that a squad prize of \$10 will be awarded to the Club member with the highest scratch game on each squad and a \$10 prize on each squad for the non-member rolling the highest scratch game.

Two \$10 prizes will be given for a Mystery Score. The Mystery Prize will be awarded at the end of the tournament for a designated team score, handicapped, on both squads.

Tournament director, Sylvia Broyles, who is also, president of the San Antonio Bowling Council, announced that one dollar of each entry (entry fee is \$6.50 per person) will be donated to the new Council Scholarship Fund for four junior bowlers in San Antonio. All funds generated from the Doubles tournament will be added to the Council's collections in Billy's honor.

In addition to being a 600 Club

Life Member, Billy is one of the founders of the Texas Women's Bowling Association, was instrumental in organizing the San Antonio WBA in March of 1934, and was elected its first secretary. She is a member of the San Antonio, Texas and WIBC Halls of Fame. In 1967 she was named San Antonio's "Woman Bowler of the Half Century" as part of the festivities by women bowlers to celebrate WIBC's anniversary season.

Billy is one half of a national doubles team (with Erna Haufler, now deceased) which set a new record of the time with 1219 (in 1935) and she is San Antonio's only WIBC Champion.

In 1935 she set a new record for women, averaging 202. She hit her peak in the late 1930's when she had 26 consecutive league series

Her career highs were 278 and 729.

During her lifetime Billy opened bowling centers in Big Spring, Kingsville, Harlingen, Mc Allen and Galveston, in addition to San Antonio, and she is reputed to be the first female bowling center operator.

As a proprietor she was secretary of the Proprietors Association and helped establish a spirit of cooperation and understanding between Texas bowlers and proprietors.

She participated in 30 WIBC Championships from 1924 to 1968, and received the National Women Bowling Writers award



for distinguished service to the game of American Tenpins in 1974.

Billy's true worth to the game of American tenpins cannot be set down in words. The time and money she has devoted to the game can never be tabulated. She has been, and still is, devoted to the game; has sacrificed thousands of dollars of her own money to its promotion and improvement; has traveled all over the country in its behalf; and done as much as any one person could do to bring the game to the status it enjoys today.

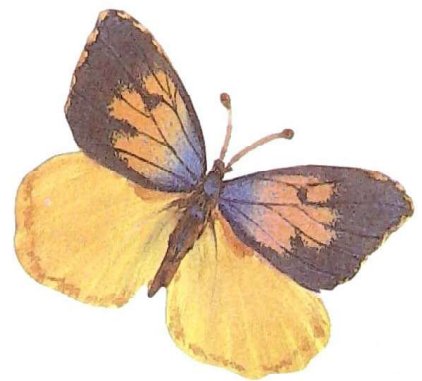
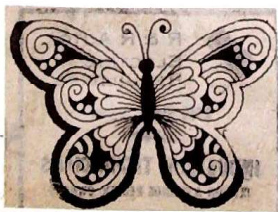

International Matches Begin at San Pedro

If the dream ever comes true and we can enjoy watching bowling matches in the Olympics, it will be because of the efforts of Al and Shirley Hurwitz of San Antonio, who have created international goodwill for more than a dozen years.

Mayor Lila Cockrell paused from her busy schedule to extend greetings from the city saying, "It is just marvelous to see so many of you here to compete in a sport you all enjoy sharing a little friendly competition-making new friends and creating international goodwill between our countries."

SABA director Eddie Jimenez acted as translator for Her Honor and the guests from across the border roundly applauded her remarks.

The opening ceremonies were most impressive as the Mexico City teams gathered together at the east side of the center and the local bowlers were on the west. While lively music was played through the p.a. system, the groups went single file across the house to greet each other with hearty handshakes and "Bienvenidos" or "Good Mornings"

The event was indeed an international goodwill gesture as there were no cash prizes, just trophies and introductions which could lead to lifelong friendship. The Hurwitz's were hosts to a barbecue luncheon between the first two games and the last two.

Hurwitz had a packed scrapbook from 1968-69 which revealed much of the history of the first international bowling competition between Corpus Christi bowlers and Mexico city friends.

Hurwitz who is the proprietor of bowling centers in Austin, Corpus Christi and now San Antonio, began his international endeavor in spite of several obstacles.

After a year of preparation, the league became a reality in September of 1968 and is going



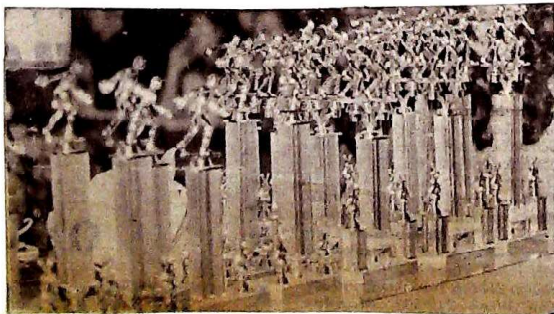
strong today in Corpus. In the beginning it took many hours and many contacts in the Tourist Bureau of the American Embassy

in Mexico. Proclamations and gifts were exchanged each year. According to Hurwitz hospitality is exchanged on a person-to-person basis, with the Mexico host bowlers assigned to a couple of U.S. bowlers, and vice versa when the tournament is held in this country. They offer visits in their homes, guided tours of Mexico, dinners, correspondence throughout the year, and friendship is extended over years and years.

Saturday's tournament is the prelude to a second international league this time between San Antonio bowlers and Mexico City bowlers. Plans call for the league to run for 36 weeks at San Pedro. Next summer, the 20 local teams will travel to Mexico City for a return visit. (When plans are completed for the new league, all details will be reported in the Kegler).

The original contingent from Mexico City this year, was under the direction of Alejandro Berdejo, who met the Hurwitz's on the first expedition south. 53 were in the group visiting San Pedro.

The San Antonio team of Eloy Guerra, Irene Fernandez, Delia Guerra and Bill Alaniz won the tournament with a 3337 four-game series.

Brunswick to Open 40 Lane Center On Thousand Oaks by September

The rumors and speculation can stop now - the new 40-lane Brunswick THOUSAND OAKS BOWL is underway with an opening date of September of this year!

To be located at 4330 Thousand Oaks Drive, almost at the intersection of Thousand Oaks and Naccgdoches, the new center will feature the newest of the Brunswick line for the '80s. The new bowling environment starts with the 2000 Twin Line ball return, which allows full use of the 16-foot approach, yet opens up the seating area.

The new 2000 Omni seating is stylish, colorful and most important comfortable, as its scientifically designed seat contour supports the lumbar region of the back.

Complementing the Omni seating is the Omni wall, which acts as a divider between the bowler's area and the concourse, and serves as either a ball storage rack or storage area for apparel.

The look extends to the futuristic Action Set masking units, and continues into the back with concourse tables and chairs, sand urn and league record frames.

According to the center's new general manager Orville Downs, official ground-breaking ceremonies have not yet been planned but will occur within the next few weeks. One wall of the new structure and a portion of another is already completed using a block wall construction. The center

entrance and the lounge entrance will face Thousand Oaks Drive and there is parking planned for 268 cars. Overall the center will include 36,728 square feet of space.

Interior decor will feature earth tones, the lounge, snack bar, glass enclosed billiards room, children's playroom which doubles as a meeting room (approximately 20x20 until a folding wall is moved increasing it to 40 x 40.)

To be constructed at an approximate cost of \$2.2 million dollars, the center is at the rear of a 3.195 acre tract of land.

Brunswick and Downs will be bringing two "firsts" to the Alamo City with the opening of Thousand Oaks Bowl. This will be the first installation of the new 2000 line for the 80's, and to be initiated will be a new service to leagues - the League Funds Deposit Service.

According to Downs it will provide an easier and more convenient way to safeguard league savings. The service is the only one approved by ABC and WIBC.

Fully computerized, the service will allow secretaries to enter their league member's names in the computer, handicaps, and all the 'numbers' involved in operating a league. When the league has finished bowling funds and nightly data will be fed back into the computer and when the league next bowls, all facts and figures will be readily available at the center.

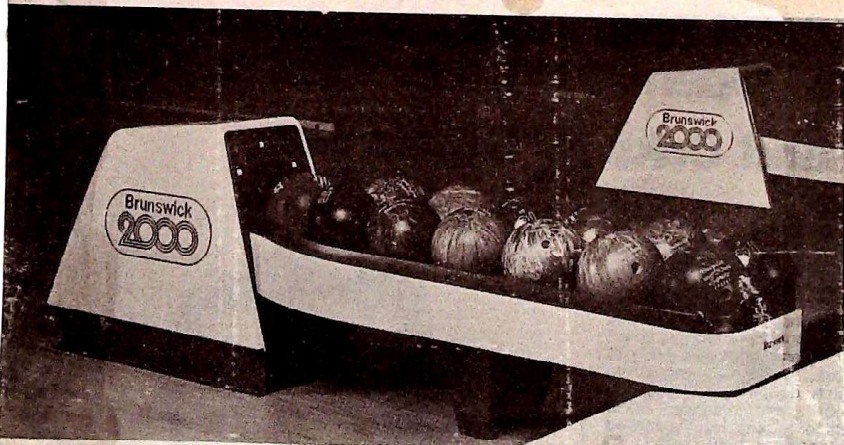

"It was weird," Roba continued. "We normally don't come from behind but we did. We just didn't break down. We were so hyped up and excited, and we all bowled well."

"After the first four games, we were in fourth place 200 sticks out of first," recalled Yerly. "We shot 945 in the fifth game and moved into second place. We stayed in second through the 10th game. We were 72 sticks out of first. The 11th and 12th games were position-round games.

"We beat Texas by 114 sticks in the 11th game and moved into first place by 42 pins. They beat us by just 15 pins in the last game and suddenly we were champions. I'm still floating on a cloud around the campus now."

"We're not on scholarship but I knew that we had five good bowlers and we could beat anybody whether they had a scholarship or not," Roba noted. Normally the averages of the six champions read: Pillsbury 177, Roba 171, Carlson 172, McCarthy 160, Farrell 178 and Lindsay 140. Roba had the team's high game in the tournament with a 235.

"It seems like we bowl better under pressure than in practice," said Farrell. "We knew that West Texas was the one team we had to beat. After we beat them, that really helped our confidence. We averaged 175 during the tournament and that's pretty good for a women's team."

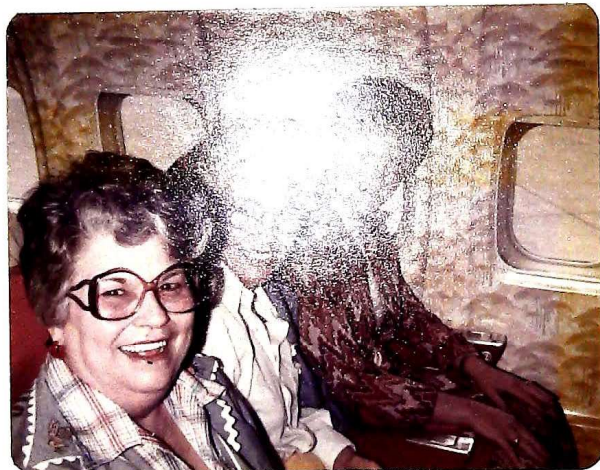

Originally from Florida, Mabelle started bowling in Germany 12 years ago and this was her second TWBA Championship. She entered the tourney with a 167 average.

The Oak Hills-All Star quintet of Jerry Johnson, Laurie Jo Scales, Beverly Hollowich, Carol Smith and Bettie Jo Geisler put together a team score of 2589 to move into second in Open Division team and a talented fivesome from Borger took over second place in Class A Team event. Members were Juanita Vaughn, Mary Faith Brown, Lillie Turner, Lee Hunter and Jean Saxon who slammed in a 2511.

Doubles action was sparked by Scales and Smith from the Oak Hills-All Star team, as the talented lassies rolled a 1085 placing them third on the standings board.

A new leader emerged in Class B Singles when Sammie Keithley put together games of 213, 212, 160 for a nice 585, and Phyllis Huckaby, Longview, moved into first in Cl. D All Events with a 1489 Putting together series of 527, 434 and 528, Phyllis bowled all of her events on Saturday, demonstrating that some bowlers just get better with practice.

There will be no bowling this weekend, April 26 and 27, as state bowling leaders attend the WIBC Annual Meeting in Seattle.

No Kegler Next Week

WIBC Convention Begins Monday

There will be no KEGLER next week so the Editor may attend the WIBC Annual Meeting and tournament in Seattle, Wash.

Mrs. Alberta E. Crowe, Liverpool, N.Y., will officially open the 1980 annual meeting, Monday, April 28 at 9 a.m. The Monday session will be highlighted by the induction ceremonies for the two 1980 Hall of Fame selectees, Miss Doty Fothergill of Lincoln, R.I., and Miss Marge Merrick of Columbus, Ohio. Both were selected in the Superior Performance category.

In addition, the morning session will be filled with guest speakers, special awards and recognition of national, state, local civic and bowling leaders.

The Monday afternoon and Tuesday sessions will be devoted to consideration of the proposed revision of the mandatory state association bylaws and 23 proposed amendments to the WIBC bylaws and rules and the bylaws of local and state women's bowling associations.

More than 3000 local association delegates are expected to visit the Pacific Northwest for the annual meeting. The meeting will be at the Seattle Center Areen, a modern and spacious facility located in the 74-acre tract. Delegates will also be asked to select the sites for the 1983 and 1984 WIBC events.

While business sessions come first, the delegates will also enjoy special ceremonies, related activities, get-togethers and bowling. Many of them will find time to renew old friendships and make new acquaintances.

First on the agenda during the busy week will be a social event - the President's Reception, scheduled for 3-6 in the Spanish and Grand Ballrooms of the Olympic Hotel where delegates will have an opportunity to meet Mrs. Crowe and Miss Flora E. Mitchell, WIBC executive secretary-treasurer and members of the WIBC Board of Directors.

During the convention itself delegates will also review reports from various national officers and committees and vote to fill nine positions on the WIBC Board of Directors. The positions up for election are

first vice president, 4th VP, 7th VP and six director's spots, including San Antonio's Sylvia Broyles, who serves as Director No. 18 on the Board.

On Wednesday delegates will choose either Las Vegas or Toledo for the 1983 events. Niagara Falls is inviting for 1984 and if Las Vegas is selected for 1983, Toledo has permission to extend an invitation for 1984.

The 1981 and 1981 events will be held in Baltimore and St. Louis respectively.

Other convention week events include the workshop for AJBC state and local association leaders, coaches and actors, which is set for Saturday.

On Sunday, members of the National Women Bowling Writers hold their annual meeting at 8:45 a.m. in the Spanish Ballroom. It will be followed by a luncheon and award ceremonies for winners of the annual NWBW story and publication contests. NWBW's traditional idea exchange mart of displays will open Saturday evening and be open all day Sunday.

The Pioneer Club (20-Year) will hold its dinner Sunday April 27 and the National "600" Club will have its annual dinner and meeting on Monday evening.

This year's tournament - the 61st - is the fifth largest tournament ever held with an 8429 five-woman team entry. The traveling team entry of 6937 is the third largest ever.

The tournament is a hometown favorite, too. This year, 822 teams from Seattle have entered. And the tourney has international appeal as it's beckoned competitors from Bermuda, Canada, The Philippines and Japan.

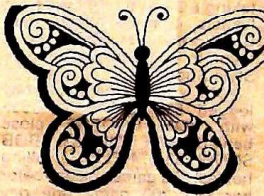
The Philippine contingent of two teams includes international titlist Bong Coo. Mrs. Coo won two titles last year - the AMF World Bowling Cup and the women's doubles crown with Lita de la Rosa at the 9th World Bowling Championships of the Federation Internationale des Quilleurs.

Some of the U.S. teams also have an international flair. Cris Barros of Spokane, a member of the Tom Barros Lincoln Mercury team, was born in

raised in Lima, Peru, and has since been in the U.S. since 1964.

Not only does the annual national event attract women with a variety of interests, but it attracts women of all ages. Ninety-two-year old Ethel Brunnick of Santa Monica, Calif., WIBC's oldest tournament participant is scheduled to bowl in Seattle on May 26. It will be her 12th consecutive WIBC showcase.

Myrtle Schulte of St. Louis, Mo., was the first WIBC member to reach her golden anniversary for participation in national tournament action at the 1978 event in Miami. Mrs. Schulte will compete in her 52nd in Seattle.

George Washington's birthday is long past and probably the celebration of Martha's too-but each weekend in June the 19th annual Martha Washington Tournament will be conducted once again at Oak Hills Lanes.

Divided into two Classes-A and B- the tournament featured team event, doubles and singles. Handicap in Class A is 75% from 200 in Class B, 75% from 155.

No reserved entries will be accepted and entry fees must accompany each entry. Checks are to be made payable to Oak Hills Bowling Center and mailed to 7330 Callaghan Road, San Antonio, Texas 78229. No personal checks will be accepted, just cashier's check, money order, sponsor check or cash.

Entry blanks or available at most centers or may be obtained by calling Oak Hills lanes, 344-6251.

First Billy Simon Scholarship Winners

The University of Florida, Texas A&M and UTSA will open their doors to four San Antonio juniors who were the winners of the first Billy Simon Junior Scholarship Tournament, sponsored by the San Antonio Bowling Council.

Each of the four - Phil Wegman, Jeanine Schaack, Barbara Jensen and Greg Winter products of the Lackland AFB, Oak Hills & Wonder Bowl, and Fort Sam Houston bowling lanes junior programs each were awarded trophies for their outstanding performances and \$500 scholarships to the colleges of their choice.

Four \$250 scholarships will go to Janet Henninger, Brian Crowder, Elsene Toten as second place winners in the scratch and handicap divisions of the tournament.

Wegman and Schaack were the two scratch champions after registering 920 and 825 respectively for their five games of competition. Winter carded a scratch 1004, 1124 handicap total in the men's division and Jensen led the girls handicap division with 769, 1097 handicap.

All four are outstanding students as well as being outstanding bowler. Wegman is valedictorian of his class at Lackland High. Schaack is member of the National Honor Society at Robert E. Lee High. Winter is a B plus student at Robert G. Cole High and Jensen is an A and B student at Incarnate Word High.

They are all sports oriented youngsters who enjoy all sports. Wegman is into football, baseball, tennis and track. Schaack is on the varsity tennis team and is a crackerjack softball player. Winter excels in golf and has quite a bit of baseball and Jensen is a District Champ in tennis, swims and shoots pool.

Wegman has already received two other scholarships from the Lackland Teachers Association and the Lackland NCO Wives Club. He plans a career as an architect after attending the University of Florida. Wegman is the current King of the junior King and Queen tournament and carries an average newar 180 in the Roadrunners. The extremely pleasant youngster averaged 204 to win the K&Q tourney and placed 9th in the junior Top Twenty. His stepfather, Robert (Bob) Green made headlines about a year ago with a perfect game at Lackland. In addition to his sports activities, Wegman works after school until 8 p.m. at the base laundry.

Jeanine Schaack has been editor of the Lee high school newspaper, The Bugle, for two years and plans to pursue a career in Communications at UT. Her bowling career began at age 2 when she could just roll the ball between her legs toward the pins. She joined her first bantam league at age 7 and is the 1977 State Scratch Class A Girls champion, after qualifying first in all events on the local level.

She was a member of scholarship tournament honoree, Billy Simon's "Billy's Kids" soft ball team and was a member of the "Blue Jays" team which won both CYO and city honors.

The National Honor Society member was one of a group of young editors to attend the Columbia University journalist's press conference last year and she was named top editor for South Texas in the Express/News high school competition. Her Lee paper was ranked third in Southwest Texas. Two brothers and a sister and her mother, Mrs. Rebecca Wallen March have competed in San Antonio leagues.

The first place champ in handicap division, Greg Winter, rolled the highest scratch series in the tournament, a 1004 for his five games. He's an avid golfer who practices daily but has been bowling just three years, bringing into the tournament a 170 average. He began his "serious bowling" while the family was stationed in Belgium where he participated in a 6-lane center.

He was third in Class A doubles (with Glen Park) and was 8th in Class A Singles last year. He plans to participate in the State Junior Tournament later this year. During his first three years of competition he has had a 254 high game, 614 series.

The son of Lt. Col. Maurice and Edeltraut Winter, the Cole High School senior plans to attend Texas A & M to study engineering.

The quietest and shyest of the quartet, Barbara Jensen, is 17 years of age and plans to attend UTSA to study Business with an eye to a banking career. She also enjoyed State Championship honors in tennis and her Incarnate Word team was declared District Champs.

Bowling just three years, she missed a century patch by just one pin when she rolled a 217 game in the scholarship tournament. She began her career after earning her Girl Scout badge for bowling and has been in three school leagues and one summer league.

The daughter of Willis C. and Emma Jensen, the pretty brunette loves both swimming and pool playing.

The second place champs also enjoy their bowling but are active outdoors as well. Crowder, 18, from South San West Campus is in the top 10 of his class and the highest boy on the list. He plans to begin his college career at UTSA and transfer to Texas A & M. He has to his credit a 258 high game, with a 640 series at Lackland AFB. He's captain of his Roadrunners team and won three trophies during the junior tournament. He is employed by McDonald's after school.

The son of William and Deanna Crowder also has two brothers and one sister and mom bowls in Southside's Hi-Lo league. He's been in the West Campus ROTC program for four years.

The quiet boys handicap second place champ is Greg Coles who entered the tournament with a 142 average from Ponderosa, but carded a five game block of 855 scratch, 1117 handicap.

The A student will be attending St. Mary's University seeking an accounting degree. He was 5th in All Events in Class B, won two seconds last year and in CLC qualified for the semi-finals and trip to Houston

to the state junior tournament although he has bowled just two years. He enjoys jogging, tennis and racketball. He is the son of James and Lela Coles and has one sister employed by the Highway Department.

The girls handicap second place champ had the lowest average of the winners, a 114, and although she began her bowling career just last summer, she's an excellent horsewoman. She has received 21 ribbons for showing horses in the States, Philippines and Japan, and is a member of their German Club Polka team. The Highlands High lass plans to attend UTSA to study history or foreign languages.

She, too, is a National Honor Society member and is the daughter of Chief M/Sgt Theodore and Nettie Ray Toten and does her bowling at Brooks AFB lanes.

Only the second place champ in scratch division was unavailable for interview this week after the completion of the tournament. Janet Henninger entered the tournament with a 143 average and carded a scratch 659 for her second place finish.

The initial Billy Simon Scholarship Tournament drew 29 entries, however four youngsters failed to appear at Sparetime for the competition.

President elect, of SABA, Edwin Crabb and SAWBA secretary, Donna O'Connor, both members of the Bowling Council, greeted the youngsters at the tournament Sunday. Dignitaries recognized were Joe Carmack and Bob Anderson of Sparetime Lanes, Council secretary Helen Kalala, Ann Elley of the Southwest Texas J3A, Jim and Maxine Oldham, Fred Serold, junior leader president, and J'Net Wahl and John Elley from SAWBA and SABA.

Council president, Sylvia Broyles was at the TWBA State Tournament in Corpus Christi, but O'Connor announced that funds to provide the scholarships was donated by all the bowlers during Nickle Week and from various donations from individuals and clubs.

The gorgeous trophies were provided by Monarch Trophy Studio and Number Won Trophy Studio.

Immediately after Nickle Week the Council voted to name the Scholarship Tournament, which is expected to be an annual event, in honor of Billy Simon for her many years of dedication to the bowling game and the junior program.

ALBERTA CROWE TO STEP DOWN Sylvia Elected!

With a firm voice, but an echo which will be heard around the world, WIBC President Mrs. Alberta E. Crowe, who has served eleven consecutive terms as president, announced at Seattle that she will not seek another term in the top office of the world's largest organization for women athletes.

"I have my health, marvelous memories and a sense of accomplishment for women's bowling," she told the Kegler. "And the time always comes for change - nothing ever stays the same. You girls in San Antonio and Texas have proven to be real friends - friends I will always cherish."

A hush came over the 3291 delegates at the Monday session as Mrs. Crowe deviated from her prepared message to the membership to announce her decision not to seek another term. Mrs. Crowe will serve one more season before stepping down.

The 1980 edition of the WIBC Championships will run 70 days and the world's women bowlers will be vying for \$684,034, in prize money in the largest bowling event ever held on the West Coast.

She reported that membership last season was 4,232,143 women participating in WIBC sanctioned leagues and urged all members to continue the "Bring A Friend" program. She

challenged them all to introduce new women to the bowling game.

The birthplace of WIBC - St. Louis - will be the site of the National Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum which is expected to open in two years. She urged continued support of the fund drive by participation in all NBHF/M projects.

With pride she announced that the WIBC Queens tournament will be sponsored by Avon and for the first time will be nationally televised through cable TV facilities from Kenmore Lanes in Seattle.

Before extending thanks to Mrs. Flora Mitchell, WIBC Executive Secretary, the WIBC staff and the WIBC Board, Mrs. Crowe announced another \$250,000 contribution to the National Bowling Council from WIBC members, adding, "It's more than a check. It is a demonstration of our belief that ALL members of the bowling family are responsible to each other - if we are to keep bowling in its rightful place in the recreation and leisure time of Americans today. Bowling has much competition in the sports world. Let's keep our game solid."

Election

During the elections for spots on the WIBC Board of Directors, st. fourth and seventh vice presidents, Mrs. Helen Baker, Florida, Gladys Banker, Maryland, and Dorothy Rowe, Arizona, were returned to office by acclamation by the more than 3300 delegates of the

Directors 13-15, Jo Smith, No. Dakota, Clara Morton, Tenn., and Irene Kreidler, New York, were each put back in office by acclamation. Directors 15 and 16, Margaret Howell, Georgia, and Eleanor Meeks, Montana, were challenged by Ruth Smith, president of the Ohio WBA. Howell defeated Smith 1603-1358, and Meeks defeated Smith, 1668-1271.

After a few anxious moments to determine if there were any other nominations from the floor, Sylvia Broyles was returned to the Board, upon motion by TWBA Secretary Lil Poole, and seconded by Tip Pfeiffer, incoming SAWBA president. Broyles was appointed by Mrs. Alberta E. Crowe after the Florida annual meeting and has served three years on the WIBC Board.

The 3,328 delegates attending the Wednesday session of the annual meeting selected Las Vegas, Nevada, as the site of the 1983 WIBC Championships and Annual Meeting, and Niagara Falls, N.Y. as the site for the 1984 events.

After losing to Las Vegas 1140-1806, the Toledo WBA extended an invitation to bid for the 1984 events, however, were defeated by Niagara Falls 1016-1915.

Portland, Oregon WBA submitted a tentative bid for the 1985 events, and the Dallas WBA also extended a bid for that year.

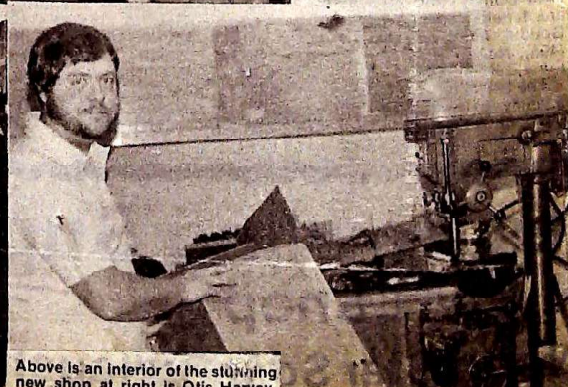
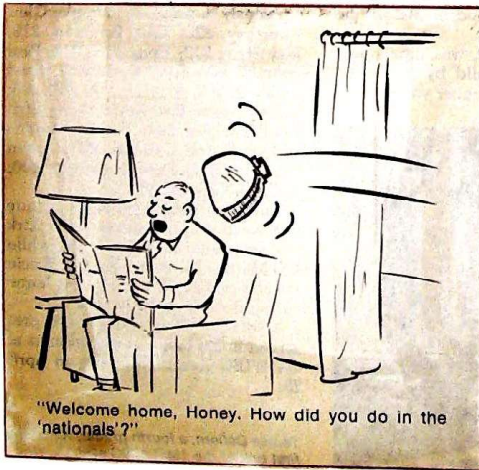
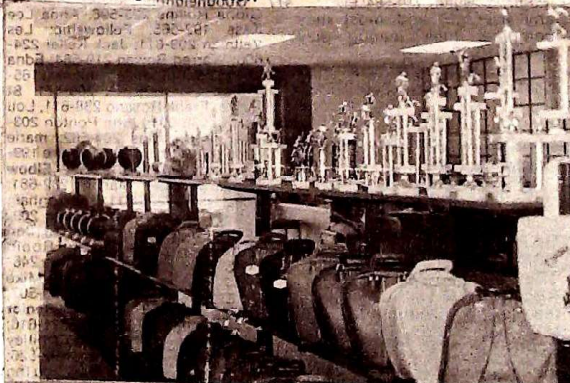

Rolling in five fall leagues Mary led the women's contingent of bowlers in the city with a composite 194.2 average, with a 201 high, 196, 192 and two 191s.

Her 201 average, one of only 63 among the nation's four million women bowlers last season, was a first in history for the city's women bowlers.

In her five (4 at Oak Hills, on at Wonder Bowl) leagues Mary had 59 series over the 600 mark, with an additional four in a summer league for which she received no points. She also had a whopping 740, 734 and a 707 during the season. Her individual high game was 278, plus carding a 272. She was the 1978 San Antonio "600" Club champion at the old Bowlerama Lanes.

Although no points were given for some of Mary's other outstanding performances on the lanes, they were considerable. She and her husband, Kenneth, won the SABA/SAWBA Mixed Doubles; she placed third with Joe Valfre and was a member of the 5th place team in the tournament.

She placed 3rd, 4th and 5th in the Southwest Masters Bowling tournaments and was second in the Tournament of Champions. In the Houston MBA at Post Oak lanes she rolled a 762 series and logged a 713 when the event was here.

She and Donna Wallace are the new record holders for the Class A Doubles with 1235. She and Kenneth again won the Mixed Doubles and Mary has been dominating the LATA and performing exceptionally well in the MBAs.

The award will come as a complete surprise to Mary since she is under the impression that she is keeping a promise made to Ella O'Quinn - that if O'Quinn won the national writer's award, Mary would accompany her to the TWBA annual meeting to watch her receive her fourth award. He husband, Kenneth, and three children, plus her mother and dad from Freer have been brought into the secret and will be in the audience when Mary receives her award at the banquet.

DeFily Honor Long Overdue

For Myrt DeFily, 59, enshrinement in the state Hall Of Fame is a long-overdue honor. The honor previously has been given to administrators with the exception of 1978 when Mary Louise Young of Houston was honored for success on the bowling lanes.

Myrt has been a standout in local, state and national competition for almost three decades.

She has won 6 city championships, two State All Star Championships (1958-1967) and qualified for the National All Stars 7 times, making the finals twice.

She was selected in 1964 on the second All American team by National Sportswriters and the same year won the National Bowlers Journal Powder Puff tournament.

In 1971 she set a TWBA State

Record in Open Singles when she swatted a 659 - a record which stands today.

In 1957 she rolled the first 300 game ever rolled by a San Antonio woman and was selected Sports Woman of the Year by the Express-News. From 1962-1971 she received the San Antonio "600" Club award for most 600s for each season, and was the first SAWBA Superior Performance award winner in 1972.

In 1960 she joined the Columbia 300 team and served as Captain from 1960-1972. The team won two TWBA championships (1966-1968) and they placed third in the WIBC championship tournament in 1972.

She has rolled in 25 state and 23 national tournaments and has to her credit three series over the 700 mark.

Extremely popular and gracious, Myrt is still a 'country girl' at heart and loves canning, pickling, wine making and gardening.

She and husband, Pat, have been married for 37 years.

Four other local women have been accorded TWBA Hall of Fame Honors - Helen Baetz, the first member enshrined, Clara Grasso, now deceased, Billy Simon and Erna Hauffer, now deceased.

TWBA secretary Lil Poole was enshrined last year becoming the 18th member and as in Mary's case, the award will come as a complete surprise to Myrt on Friday evening at the annual banquet.

O'Quinn's Bowling Writer of the Year award is her fourth since she won in 1975-76 and 77. The award is for a feature story entitled "A Delegate's Badge View of the TWBA Convention" written after attending the TWBA annual meeting in Austin when San Antonio was awarded the 1981 TWBA Championships and annual meeting.

She also has two national Women Bowling Writers first place awards and three second place awards since beginning the Kegler in 1976, including the 1980 Feature story award at the Seattle meeting just two weeks ago for the same story.

Previous award winners since the award was created in 1971 were Bunny Larson, Dallas, Sue Bailey, Port Arthur, Pat Malcolm, Nederland, Kitty Brown, Dallas and Darlene Pearce, Houston, co-owner of the Houston Bowling News, who won last year.

The Texas Women's Bowling Association Love Boat dropped anchor last Friday at the Holiday Inn Emerald Beach at Corpus Christi after sailing smooth waters for nine weeks of the 14 weekend championship tournament, which will conclude on July 6.

Two hundred sixty-eight "mateys" answered roll call when "Admiral" Fay Browning, Garland, rapped the 45th annual convention to order at the May 'port of call'.

"Today will be the day to make important decisions and changes if needed, to keep TWBA strong, keep us growing, and keep us mindful of the need to protect the integrity of our game", said Browning. "Ours is the greatest participation sport in the world for women, and it should be the personal goal of all of us to do everything in our power to keep it great," she added.

Lil Poole, Hurst, secretary

and "Captain" of the TWBA navy of Texas women bowlers reported a membership of 143,083 for the current season, slightly less than a year ago. She reported 367 series over the 650 mark for Texas women bowlers, which included forty 700 series, and six 300 games. TWBA also has recognized 81 Texas women for games of 270 or better.

300 shooters include Gloria Alderman and Kathy LeCroy, Fort Worth, Margaret Walker, Dallas, Ann McCarthy, El Paso, Ruby Thomas, Abilene and just a few days prior to the TWBA convention, Linda Wilson, Corpus Christi. Wilson has been bowling just a few years and came out of a learn-to-bowl class just last October.

TWBA delegates welcomed to the convention a very special guest - Dianne Nelson, Sioux City, Iowa - who is the WIBC Field Representative for our area.

Nelson brought greetings from WIBC and urged continued support of the building program of the National Bowling Hall of Fame/Museum (to be opened in 1982 in St. Louis, Mo.)

She told the delegates that Mrs. Alberta E. Crowe, WIBC president, will complete 41 years on the WIBC Board (21 years as president) on July 31 of this year, and will not seek another term as president.

The WIBC championships now underway at Seattle will be in Baltimore next year, St. Louis in 1982, Las Vegas in 1983 and Niagara Falls in 1984.

Delegates to the Corpus Annual Meeting re-elected JO Tucker, Houston, as first vice president; Millie Wood, Abilene, 3rd vice president, and our Sylvia Broyles, treasurer, by voice votes to their respective offices.

Named to serve additional terms were incumbent directors, Herbie Vannoy, Lubbock, Pat Lauder, Amarillo, Ruth Peterson, Dallas, and Cindy Luce, San Angelo. President Browning was named State Delegate to the Baltimore WIBC Annual Meeting, with Lil Poole to serve as alternate.

The 1980 Service Award was given to Kittie Brown, Garland, for her outstanding contributions to the game of bowling and valuable service to TWBA. Only seven members have been so honored, and TWBA Board Members, while currently serving, are not eligible for consideration.

Active in both junior and senior league activity, Brown has been a TWBA delegate for 15 years; serving as a teller several times and on the TWBA nominating committee twice. She has been a delegate to the WIBC convention 20 times, serving also on the credentials committee. She was the Dallas Bowler of the Year in 1959, received the Harless Wade Award for outstanding contributions to bowling, and was inducted into the Dallas Hall of Fame in 1968, and was also made a Life Member. She was the TWBA Writer of the Year in 1975 and received a Brunswick Award in 1972 for her first place feature story in the National Women Bowling Writers' contests.

TWBA Tournament Participation plaques were awarded to Port Lavaca, Texas City-La Marque and Beaumont, with Port Lavaca also receiving the President's Trophy for the largest number of teams entered, based on percentage of membership.

The Dorothy Cornelison BVL Trophy was won by the Lubbock WBA for the largest contributions to the BVL Fund, which provides recreational equipment for hospitalized and blinded veterans in the nation's VA Hospitals. The award is also given on a percentage of membership basis, and Lubbock's collections amount to about \$1.00 per member for their 2600 membership.

July 26 - 27 & August 2 - 3

The 5th annual SABA - SAWBA Mixed tournament is just around the corner with an entry deadline of July 12. The event is sponsored by the San Antonio Women's and Men's Bowling Associations.

To be staged at Astro Bowl on July 26-27 and August 2-3, the Mixed Tournament is for both Team event and Doubles. Squads will be at 11 a.m., 2:30

p.m., and 6 p.m. for team events of Saturday, adn at 12 noon, 2, 4, and 6 p.m. on Sundays for doubles events.

The two-weekend tournament, sanctioned by ABC and WIBC, carries an entry fee of \$7.50 per person per event, and all entries when completed are to be mailed or delivered to the SAWBA office (P.O. Box 16427, 78216).

Mixed Teams means 3 men and two women, or three women and 2 men with doubles competition being one man, one woman. Bowlers may enter team event with as many teams as desired. However, not more than three members of a team entered may bowl together more than once. Entries for team event closes at midnight, July 12.

A bowler may enter doubles as many times as desired also, attempting to cash with the same partner only once. Doubles entries close one hour prior to each shift.

The event will be handicapped 80% from 400 in doubles and 100 in team event with handicap based on three game totals. Prize fund will be returned at a ratio of not less

than 1 to 10.

If entries exceed availability of lanes the management reserves the right to extend the tourney one or two weekends (Aug. 9-10 and Aug. 16-17).

Complete rules and entry forms are now at all lanes or further information may be obtained from the two association offices - SAWBA, 824-1321 - SABA, 923-7501.

Mixed Teams means 3 men and two women, or three women and 2 men with doubles competition being one man, one woman. Bowlers may enter team event with as many teams as desired. However, not more than three members of a team entered... may bowl together more than once. Entries for team event closes at midnight, July 12.

A bowler may enter doubles as many times as desired also, attempting to cash with the same partner only once. Doubles entries close one hour prior to each shift.

The event will be handicapped 80% from 400 in doubles and 100 in team event with handicap based on three game totals. Prize fund will be returned at a ratio of not less than 1 to 10.

If entries exceed availability of lanes the management reserves the right to extend the tourney one or two weekends (Aug. 9-10 and Aug. 16-17).

Jane Galbreath, Austin, 1980 TWBA State Champ

Jane Galbreath, a 191 average bowler from Austin became the 43rd State Champion of the Texas Women's Bowling Association, as the TWBA Love Boat completed its fourteen weekend voyage to Ayers Bowling Lanes and Buccaneer Bowl in Corpus Christi. She won the State Championship with an 1831 scratch All Events total.

For the righthander it was her seventh TWBA Championship Tournament, and her honors will also include the State Singles title in Open Division. She rolled a 564 in her Ayers Bowl team event, then slammed in 616 with partner Jean Weise and capped her performance with a 651 in Open Singles at Buccaneer Bowl. Mrs. Galbreath rolled her winning scores on June 14-15. She is employed by the Department of Public Safety as Key Entry Operator II in the state's capital.

Open Division Team champs are The Texans of Fort Worth who rolled their winning score on the third weekend of the 43rd Annual Championships. The Texans were paced by Kathy LeCroy with 159-188-267 (614), with members Ruth Farris (538), Susie Reichley (491), Luci Bonneau (579), and Donna Dillion (575). Their winning total of 2794 included team games of 907, 918, and 969.

Farris and Dillion will share Open Doubles honors with Maud Walker and Theresa Habib, of Corpus Christi, as both teams carded a 1166 to win state titles. The Walker-Habib duo slammed in their top score on June 15 while the Farris-Dillion duo combined on April 13.

After the 2512 five-women teams, 6367 Doubles entries and 12,735 Singles entrants completed their play on Sunday, July 6, tournament high game honors went to Kathy LeCroy, Ft. Worth with 267, and the tournament high series went to Donna Dillion of Ft. Worth, with a 660.

Tournament Director, Lil Poole who is also secretary of the more than 143,000 Texas women bowlers, praised the efforts of the Corpus Christi WBA members in staging the mammoth events. Fourteen years ago when Corpus was hostess to TWBA, Lil Poole conducted her first TWBA Championship when the entry total was 1804 teams.

"It's a tribute to the efforts of the ladies of Corpus Christi that the 1980 event was such a tremendous success. Their work made the 1980 event the second largest, second richest in TWBA's history."

"Although scoring was not as high as in previous years, the Corpus tournament did feature the largest number of traveling teams in our history (2315 teams), and the ladies of the Houston WBA are to be commended for their record entry of 302 traveling teams, breaking their own record of 274 teams set last year when the tournament was in Austin.

According to tournament director Poole nearly two dozen WIBC awards were earned by the ladies rolling in the tournament. Four Century Patches were awarded for games which were 100-pins over the entrants average and several dozen triplicate and all spare game patches were awarded.

TWBA members were urged to begin making plans for the 44th annual event which will be at San Antonio with team events at the Sports Palace and

singles and doubles at Wonder Bowl. It is anticipated that the Alamo City venture should be another record-breaker designed to cover at least 16 weekends (from March 20 through July 12).

The awards dinner for State champions from the Corpus tournament will be held in the Alamo City on Saturday Night, Sept. 27, 1980 at the Sheraton Inn. Details will be reported later.

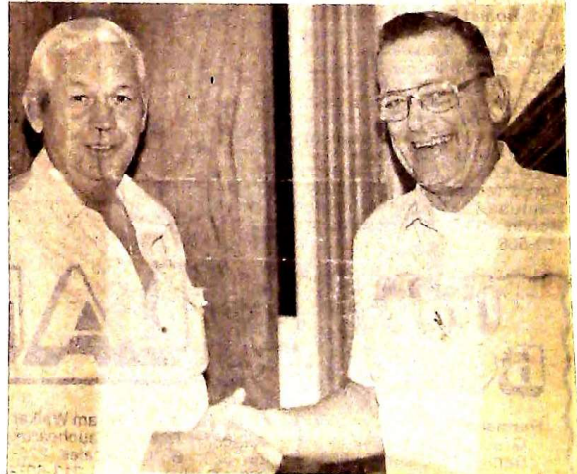

"Of course, we also had some sad moments, as we lost some of our bowling family by death or disability. The greatest disappointment to me was not being able to host the WIBC again as we planned for 1984. But it just wasn't in the cards, and it will be all of San

Antonio's loss," she added.

"The entire city now has an opportunity to join hands in staging one of the greatest State Tournaments for women next year, and if I could say one thing to all our members, it would be, get your entry in, and get involved on some of the committees. We've done it before but this year it's going to be the best yet - and there's plenty of work to be done by all our members!"

Before becoming active in SAWBA activities Mad was league coordinator at Wonder Bowl when Jim Coffman was

manager. She was appointed to the SAWBA Board by Rosalie Bushick, now a Life member, following the WIBC convention in Tulsa in the early-70s.

President Judy Stephenson tapped Madelyn as 2nd Vice President during her tenure and she then served as 1st Vice President, prior to completing one of Judy's terms of office for a year.

Madelyn has been elected to the Nominating Committee of TWBA by the membership, and has served several years on the WIBC Tellers Committee

during convention-time. She was also active in various projects for the San Antonio Bowling Council, and has worked at the Southwest Texas JBA tournaments.

As SAWBA directors can attest, Madelyn's first concern - always - was what was best for the bowlers. "I may have stepped on some toes because I am so outspoken, but I know that whenever I voted, it was for what was best for the bowlers. I believe I can step down as SAWBA President, knowing that I did my best. All good things must come to an end, and I will always remember these years as a SAWBA Board Member - it's the greatest association in the world, and I'm just proud to have been a part of it."

"Sure the SAWBA Presidency is a big responsibility - it meant many weekends away from Jack and my family, it meant foregoing weekends during tournament-time, but it also gave me an opportunity to meet some great people - our bowlers and their families - and working with a Board that is talented, responsible and dedicated - I just wouldn't have missed it for the world," she emphatically added.

SAWBA Board Members honored Madelyn at their Board Meeting last night with the presentation of a walnut plaque, complete with a

President's gavel and a lovely silver necklace in appreciation of her contributions to bowling and the Association.
