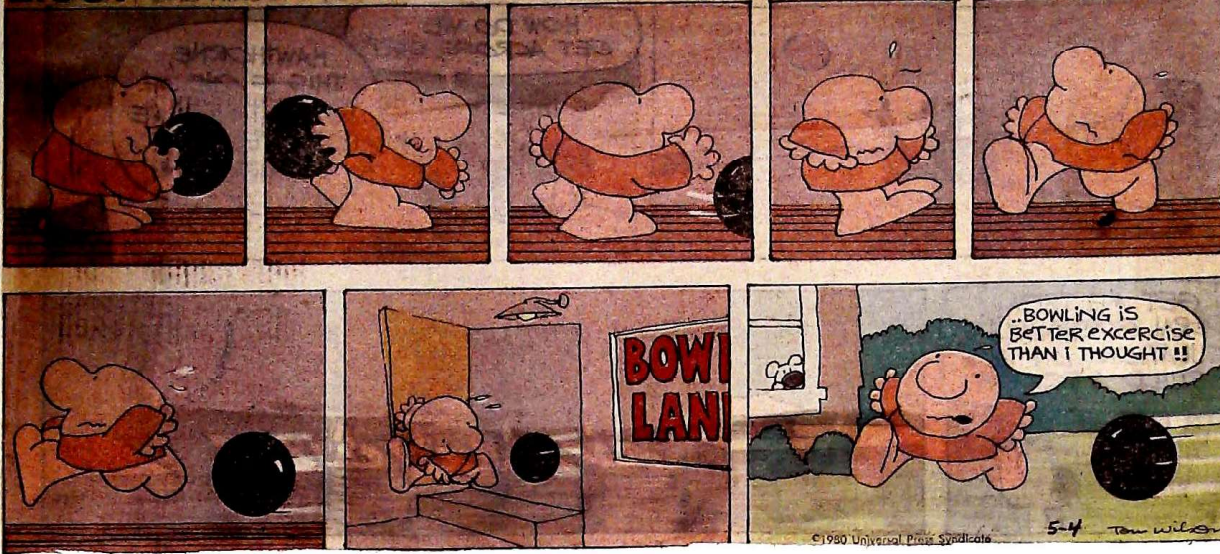

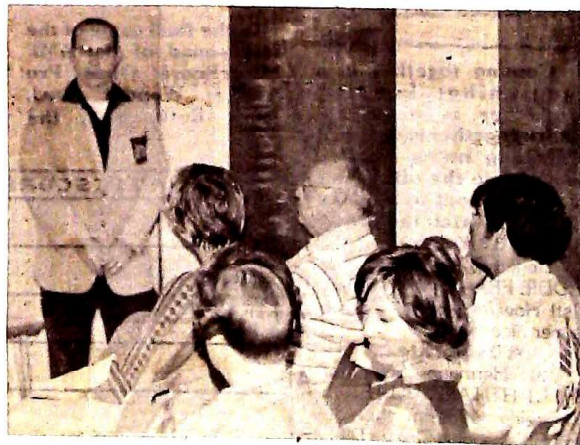

There remains one vacancy on the Board of Directors, which Mrs. Spreng will fill shortly after receiving board approval.



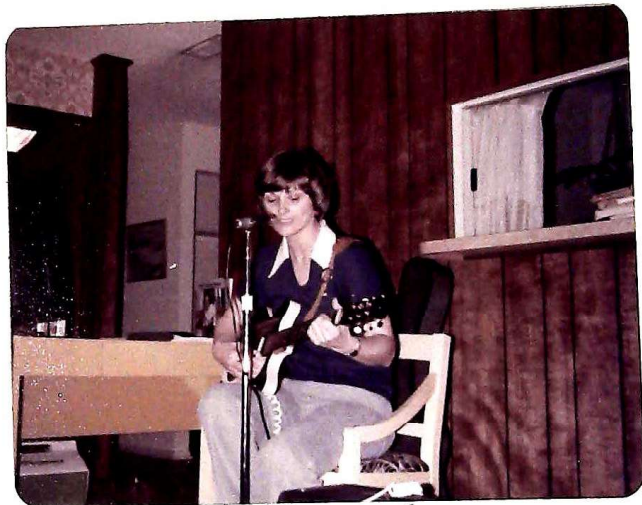

Senior Mixed Draws Record Entry

A record forty two teams of senior-age citizens will be featured in the 10th annual Mixed Invitational Senior Citizens tournament to roll this weekend at Oak Hills lanes.

According to coordinator of the event, Myrt De Fily, an extra squad has been added on Saturday at 1 p.m. due to the record number of seniors participating.

In addition to the 42 team entries, there will be 77 sets of doubles and 54 singles, plus 139 all events entries.

The team event will consist of four bowlers on each team and there must be at least one man or woman on each team. Doubles may be either two women, two men or mixed.

The seniors will be handicapped 80% from 800 in team event, 400 in doubles and 200 in singles.

Saturday action for the seniors will begin at 11 a.m. for both team and singles and doubles. Another squad of singles and doubles will roll at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday.

On Sunday action is at 10:15 a.m. and 2 p.m. and the last squad goes on the lanes at 12:30 p.m. on Monday.

Each year since the Senior Citizens Mixed Tournament has operated it has shown a decided increase in entries. The tournament is sanctioned by both ABC and WIBC and open only to members of senior citizens leagues, who have participated in the leagues for at least nine games prior to the closing date of February 8.

BVL Fund Drive Begins March 4

For hospitalized veteran BOWLERS are the key to the Bowler's Victory Legion (BVL) Fund. As the 1979 BVL Fund drive, sponsored by the San Antonio Women's and San Antonio Bowling Associations, nears - March 4 through 17th - all bowlers must put their enthusiasm and bowling efforts and money into the drive to assure its success.

As in the past the BVL Fund tournament will use scores and bowlers may bowl as often as they participate in leagues - for a one dollar donation.

Of the \$1 entry fee 70¢ goes directly to the BVL Fund; 5¢ is used as an incentive fee for league secretaries for helping collect funds and distributing entry forms and the balance goes into the tournament prize fund.

Based on 2000 entries a prize fund is set up with \$75 for first place, \$65 second and \$60 for third. The tournament is

handicapped at 80% from 200 for women and 75 and 200 for men, and bowlers use their league scores that night for entry into the BVL tournament.

Last year almost \$800 was raised during the tournament which was delayed so that all bowlers could participate in the National Hall of Fame Museum Drive. A check over \$1000 was recently given from BVL Fund to the Audie Murphy VA Hospital.

Defending champion is Larry Watkins of the Wednesday Nite Wonders who slammed in a 770 handicap score to win the 1978 tournament. Ten other cash prizes were awarded.

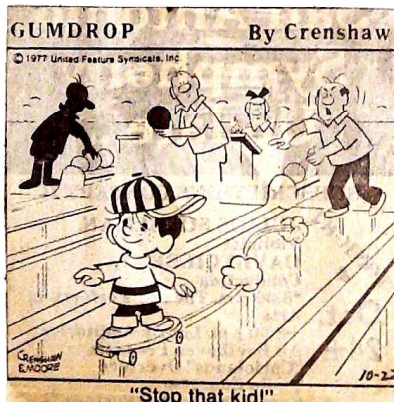

Bonnie Santaniello became the fifth San Antonio woman to roll a 300 game the first woman to turn the trick at Astro Bowl - and the first reported in the state this season in league play according to the current Texas Women's Bowling Association official publication "Across Texas Lanes"

The stunningly attractive righthander opened her league series in the Ladies Astro Scratch league with a 173, escalated to a 243 then put 12 consecutive balls in the 1-3 pocket for the perfect. The 716 series was her first trip over the 700 mark.

A playful gibe from her boss, Don King, operator of the Bowler's Pro Shop, may have been responsible for her feat. Don was having his morning coffee at Astro Bowl Thursday morning when Bonnie started her league play. "Are you good enough to adjust half a board," kidded Don as he was leaving the center to go to work.

Bonnie had been hitting the pocket well in the second game, but with a few one-pin leaves wasn't carrying solidly. When Don left, she moved exactly one-half a board and made women's history.

"I felt all the hits in the last game were good solid ones," Bonnie said. "The lanes were a little more oily than usual and I did get a few slow-falls."

"Going into the tenth - it

really got heavy!" she laughed. "I was shaking - boy, was I shaking! I just wanted to get rid of that ball and get it over."

Rolling with a Brunswick LT-48, drilled by Don at the pro shop where Bonnie has worked for the past four years, Bonnie carries a 178 average. It's the only league in which she competes this season, although she fifth man on the Bowlers Pro Shop team in the Blue Monday league.

Her previous high game was a 277 rolled in the 1976 local tournament at Thunder Bowl, and her career high series is a 645. The grey-eyed 32 year old beauty has bowled only four years under King's tutelage. "I just started bowling with my funny little ball, until Don started coaching me. My average got better and I've even bowled in a few tournaments," Bonnie admitted.

One of the touraments she rolled in was the LATA when it was at Wonder Bowl. She was the leading qualifier and eventually cashed fourth.

Bonnie is married to Jim Santaniello and has a teen-age daughter.

Previous 300 shooters from the Alamo City are Myrt De Fily (1958), Dottie Spillers Overstreet (1962), Shirley Mansfield (1967), and Bettie Jo Geisler (1973).

Regina Hillier Wins Texas Bluebonnet Queens

Flashing the brilliance that won her the 1975 Alberta E. Crowe "Star of Tomorrow" award, 22 year old Regina Hillier, Amarillo, captured the Texas Bluebonnet Queens title Sunday at Lubbock's Imperial Lanes to the delight of a partisan Panhandle crowd.

Regina responded to the fans' enthusiastic support by turning in a 712 performance in the 10th, 11th and 12th matches in the 14 game match play Finals. She followed her 712 with a 241 game (954 4-game block) to move into the leader's position ahead of Ruth Farris, Fort Worth, who had held the lead for nine matches.

For the position round (14th game) only 24 points separated Regina and Ruth. Three solid strikes and two 'Brooklyn' hits enabled Regina to take the final match 183-168. The loss of the game and the 30 bonus points dropped Ruth into 4th place in the standings.

Joycee Davis, Big Spring, took advantage of Ruth's loss and moved into second by downing our Rocky Boubel 199-187 in their match.

Two Houstonians battled for third with Peggy Jones, their local champion, overturning the title hopes of the first Bluebonnet Queen, Susie

Reichley, often an Alamo City visitor. With a 230 game, plus 30 points, Peggy moved into 3rd.

The 1979 Queen, a student at West Texas State University who has her eye on a career in law, averaged 198 for her match play finals and won nine of her 14 matches. She was sponsored in the Queens by

the Amarillo WBA as their local all events champ.

On the attractive new Queen's calendar is an appearance in the 5th US Team Trials scheduled July 25-28 in Milwaukee. The Trials held every two years to decide US representatives for the FIQ amateur title. If she advances Regina will roll in Manila,

Philippines for FIQ's 9th World Bowling Championship later in the year.

Regina entered the Queens with a 1977-78 yearbook average of 193 from Amarillo, but currently holds a 203 average in four leagues and two traveling leagues. Her career high game is 287 with a career high series of 728.

This was her first TWBA Queens tournament 'try' and for her victory she was awarded \$500 first place prize money, the gold Queen's lapel pin, a gorgeous trophy and the Queen's tiara.

The runner-up Queen Joycee Davis, was the alternate in the Austin Queens. She carries an average of 182, but averaged 193 in the Finals, winning ten of her 14 matches.

An employee of the Big Spring bowling center the 37-year-old frosted blonde has a career high game of 286 and a career high series of 706. Her current league average is 195 and she is a former Big Spring champion. *Cont. P 2*

The Texas Bluebonnet Queens tournament is open to all TWBA members. The 1979 tourney drew 172 entrants from 47 local associations. Sylvia Broyles is Queens tournament chairman for TWBA.

Plans call for the 1980 Queens tournament to be staged at Tyler on the first weekend of March.

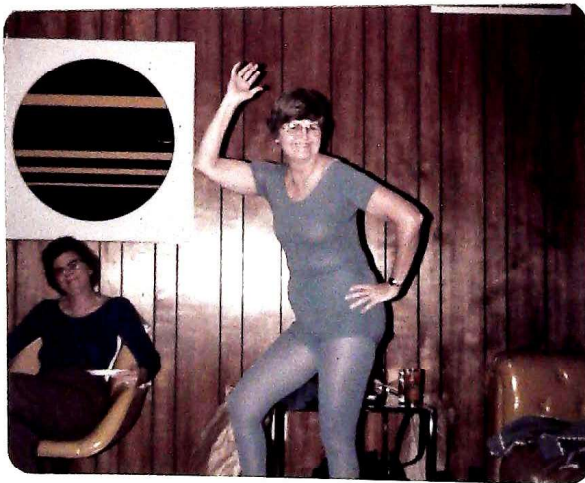

Who Vote "Yes" for '84

President Madelyn Spreng of the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association advised the membership at the Annual

Meeting of a proposed amendment to be discussed at the 1979 WIBC Convention at Tucson which will affect all

WIBC members.

She recommended that the association pay the registration fee for the Leadership Training Seminar for SAWBA officers, and this too was approved by those in attendance.

In other standing committee reports Ways and Means Committee reported a \$228.85 profit on the sale of pins, towels and jewelry project.

Chairman Clara Grimes advised of the new project of a San Antonio Cookbook, with members providing their special favorite recipes for use in the book. Directors will have a recipe entry blanks for members use, and at the next Ways and Means meeting, a deadline date for entry will be given. The Board asks that all members help with this project since profits from the publication of the Cookbook will go into the SAWBA treasury to help defray expenses of some of the SAWBA sponsored projects.

Sylvia concluded her final report to the membership saying, "It has been by pleasure serving as your local secretary for 11 years. The knowledge and experience I have gained, the friends I have made and the pleasant memories are some of the things that have made it all worthwhile for me personally. I only hope that I have given you a small part of what I have received in return."

Sylvia has submitted her resignation as secretary to president Spreng asking that Donna become local secretary effective April 15.

"I kept the score sheet because I felt my daughter (Tena) wouldn't believe me," said Nance. "I was so excited."

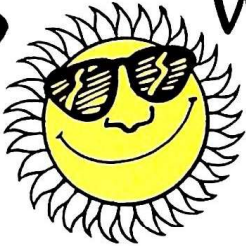

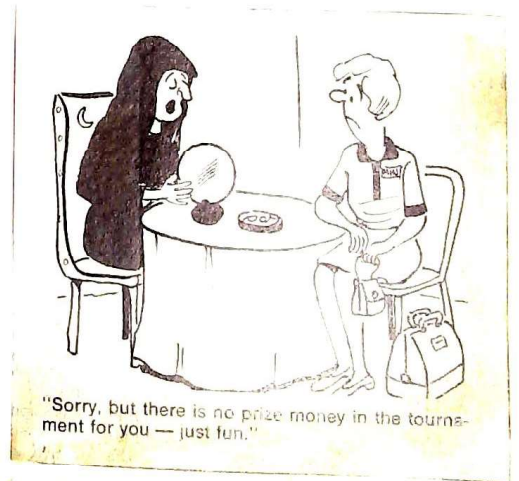

Record WIBC Delegation Busy

They came to Tucson 3506 strong - those women bowlers who were selected by their 'sisters' in the local associations to serve as delegates to the 1979 Women's International Bowling Congress convention.

The annual conclave again brought together a record delegation - 234 more than the record set in 1978 in Miami - for six sessions over a three-day period, and throughout the sessions, there was complete harmony. At closing time on Wednesday, the same record delegation remained in harmony, dedicated to one single purpose - the perpetuation of the game of bowling by women throughout the world.

Mrs. Alberta E. Crowe, Liverpool, New York, the diminutive leader of the world's women bowlers, as usual, reigned smoothly throughout the three day's activities. She was conducting her 19th WIBC annual meeting, and on the final day was honored by the delegation and WIBC Board with the presentation of a diamond watch for her 40 years service on the WIBC Board.

Mrs. Helen Baker, first vice president from So. Miami, Fla., swept through the 18 proposed amendments to the WIBC Bylaws and Rules and to the Bylaws of the local and state association in what seemed to be record time.

Delegates approved nine of

the proposed amendments, including a complete revision of the local association bylaws. The rejected eight, one which would have cut the huge delegation. One amendment was referred back to the Legislative Committee to be considered next year, when the State mandatory bylaws will receive a complete face-lift.

On a written ballot, delegates approved the WIBC Board recommendation to increase since 1971. It seemed that the majority of the women are aware of the inflationary trend around the country, but realized that the increase in expenses was not entirely due to inflation. New services have been added, including the

bonding program, Leadership Training Seminars, League Officers Workshops, new Bowlers Guide, state and local association tournament chevrons and subsidies to AJBC and NBC have been continued. Their adoption of P.A. No. 1 was evidence that they desire to maintain the high quality of present membership services and awards, as well as developing new ones.

In addition the record delegation voted to allow two adjacent associations to issue a joint invitation to host the WIBC Championship Tournament and Annual Meeting.

Election-time was spirited, as it always is. The third and sixth vice presidents, Rae Fisk, Houston, and Billie O'Connor, Washington, were unanimously returned to office as was sergeant at arms, Anne C. Simone, Massachusetts.

The former president of the National Bowling Writers, Mary Jane Sporar, unseated incumbent director, Shirley Kutzner, New Jersey for the Director #7 spot, however, Mrs. Kutzner was elected to serve as Director #12 later in the day. Elected by acclamation were Elaine Hagin, California, #8; Joyce Deitch, Nevada, #9; Hazel Mc Leary, British Columbia, #10. Lavonne C. Hodgson, Kansas, was challenged but won her seat by a vote of 2060-1038.

Twelve women were inducted into the WIBC Hall of Fame, bringing the number of women earning the highest WIBC honor available to 71. Phyllis Notaro, New York, and Anita Cantaline, Michigan, were honored for Superior Performance in the game, and former "600" Club president and WIBC Board Member, Mabel Marrs, Washington, was elected to receive the Meritorious Service Award.

Those elected in the pioneer category were Martha Hoffman, Wisconsin, Ethel Sablatnik, Florida, Birdie Humphreys, California, and Val Mikiel, Michigan, for Superior Performance and Gertrude Dornblaser, Illinois, Ellen Kelly, Missouri, Catherine Menne, Missouri, Zoe Quinn, Illinois, and Alma Spring, Michigan, in the Meritorious Service category.

Delegates were treated to a preview of the movie Saturday evening, courtesy of AMF, Inc. and the story is a good one, although a little unbelievable as Matheson loses no matches on his way up before attempting to win the "national" championship." The photography and music are exceptional, and overall should be pleasing to all bowling enthusiasts. It's by far, the best bowling promotional vehicle to come our way in years. The movie premiered on the 27th in St. Louis and will be released across the country shortly thereafter.

Pape finished with games of 224 and 180 for a 693 series.

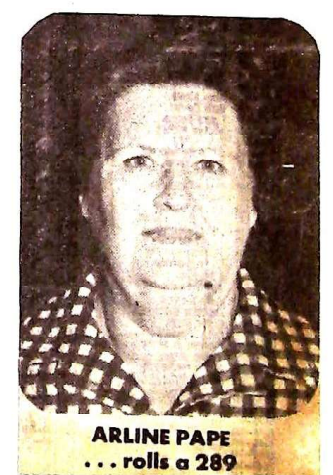

Not so in the case of Ruth Nunnally. The 54-year-old grandmother quietly rolled a 275 game in the Wednesday Sundowners League at Oak Hills, and not too many of her friends knew about it.

Nunnally, who has a 150 average, earned a Century Patch, and WIBC state and local awards. It was the league's high game until Harvey McRee carded a 287 game (and a 701 series) on the last night of league play.

"I started bowling and just went crazy," smiled Nunnally, who is a supervisor of accounting at Kelly Air Force Base. "I really don't know what happened."

"I didn't know what was going on until the 10th frame. Then, I realized what I had."

Nunnally opened with a double, followed with an 8-spare, then strung strikes until the last ball in 10th. She had a 7-count on her final toss.

"I got tired on the last ball," she smiled. "I missed my mark, and I missed the headpin. No, I wasn't disappointed. I really didn't know what the score was until somebody yelled, '275!'"

"I've been bowling for about 20 years or longer. My previous best was a 210 several years ago. I get a 200 every once in a while."

"I was thrilled that I could really bowl a game like that," Nunnally continued. "I've had such a hard time bowling. I never dreamed that I could bowl that. I'm really elated about the 275."

Nunnally, who has two children and five grandchildren, finished with games of 146 and 159 for a 580 series.

"You can see by the final two games that I was lucky," said Nunnally. "My friends asked me why didn't I bowl as well as I did the first game. I simply told them that I gave it all I had in the first game (smile)."

"I'm real happy about it... really." But you won't find her bragging about it.

ST. LOUIS Gets Hall Nod

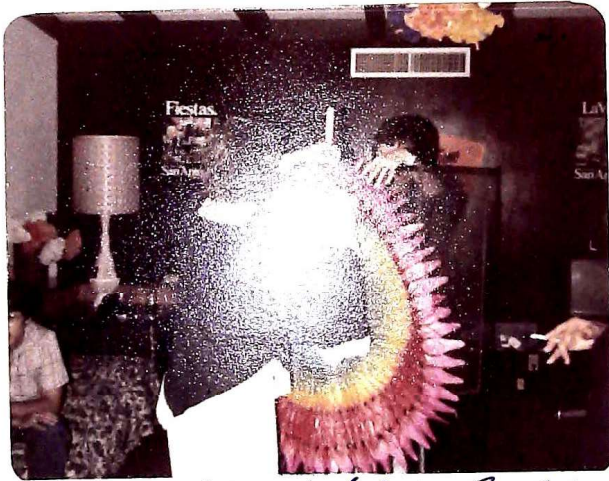

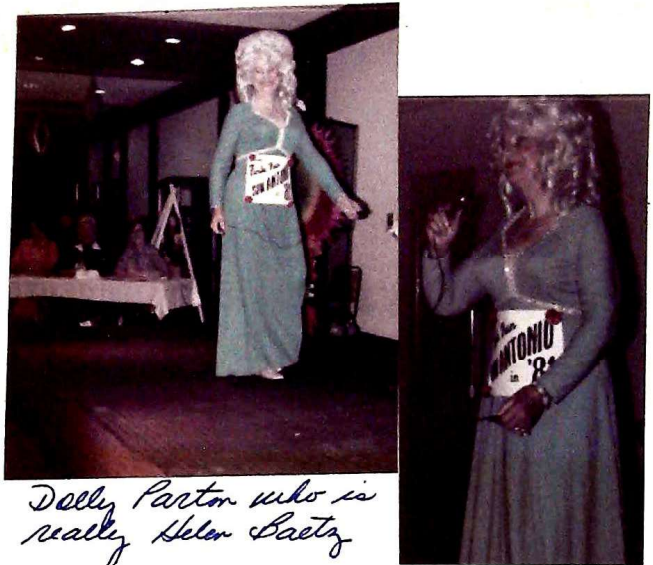

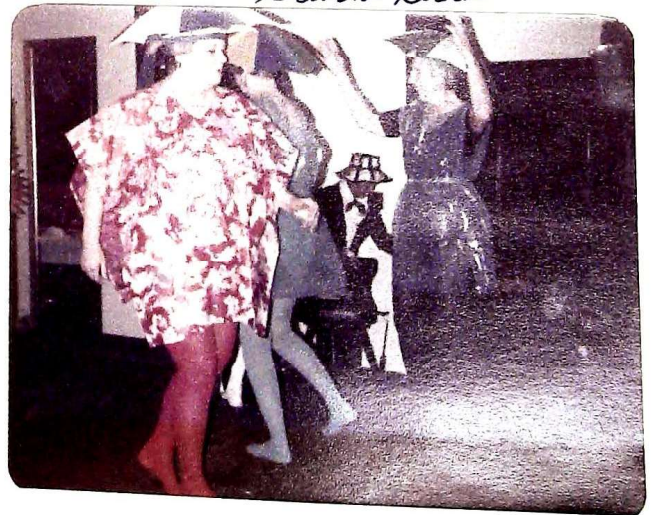

S.A. Lands Women's State Meet

AUSTIN — The San Antonio Women's Bowling Association landed the 1981 women's state tournament for the Alamo City by a 138-84 vote over Houston during the convention at this year's state tourney in the Capitol City.

The houses for the tournament haven't been picked yet, but the "Gong Show" presentation by the local ladies convinced most of the 229 voting delegates San Antonio was the place for the tourney.

Other news from the convention is that Fay Browning of Garland was voted president, Mona Loper of El Paso Sergeant at Arms and Sylvia Broyles, Bess Robinson of Waco, Gloria Newman of Corpus Christi and Elenor Rice of Port Arthur state directors.

Lil Poole was voted into the state Hall of Fame and Houston's Lucy Bonneau was named the Texas 20-Year Club's Bowler of the Year. The Miss Texas Junior Bowler of the Year is Mary Wolfe of Mount Calm, Tex., who won the girls division of the recent state scholarship tourney in the Capitol City.

I am a very special piece of white satin. Early this year some folks around Dallas printed on me "Local Delegate 44th Annual Meeting-Texas Women's Bowling Association - Austin" and I became a 'badge'. Not everyone could wear me - just 257 ladies who were elected by their women bowling members to come to Austin to legislate-statewide at the TWBA Annual Meeting.

Last Thursday I was pinned on "my lady" and I became the passport to some nice places and some very exceptional events.

To get me, My Lady went first to an area called "Registration". There another lovely lady pinned me on My Lady's shoulder, and another smiling lady gave her some colorful brochures about Corpus Christi, saying "We hope we'll see you next year". My lady seemed so pleased.

From there we went to another table and several more happy ladies pinned on the cutest pair of miniature blue-denim overalls reading "Houston '81". Others pinned a bright yellow ribbon on My Lady reading "For Fiesta Fun-San Antonio in '81". That yellow tag even had an adorable crocheted Mexican sombrero on top!

My Lady told me later that all this was because Houston and San Antonio were both bidding for the '81 tournament, and it would be up to her to decide which would be better for the majority of the state's bowlers.

After visiting with friends in the hotel lobby for awhile, my lady took me upstairs to something called a 'hospitality suite' - in fact there were two. Everyone was in such a good mood! Ladies chatted with

each other, sat on the floor shucking tamales and enjoying hot dip, while others made baby-barbecue sandwiches and they all were doing something called 'wetting their whistles'.

Even when the lights failed because of blown fuses, everyone just laughed and talked on, or moved out onto the patio. Under the stars were more ladies sitting in a circle on the floor. Ever so early the next morning my lady pinned me on again and said she was going to the Bowling Writers breakfast. There she receive another pretty ribbon made like an orange star. All the ladies at the breakfast talked about greater ways to promote the game of bowling, a movie called "The Dreamer" and getting more ladies interested in the Club. They even announced some winners in their contest - "Publicity and Writer of the Year" and said they were going to honor a male professional writer that evening for all he had done for the Texas women bowlers over the years. That was nice.

After breakfast my lady moved to another room. Lordy, you would not have believed how many women were packed in that room! There were so many there weren't enough chairs for them all!

Soon three uniformed ladies marched in carrying "Old Glory", the Texas flag and the WIBC flag, followed by 19 beautiful women, all in white with orange scarves. Everyone stood up and applauded because these were the TWBA Board Members - very important ladies who also had pretty ribbons on their shoulders and they all smiled so graciously!

It didn't take long to realize that all the ladies in that room were there to take care of some very important business. They all paid attention to the speakers and applauded loudly after each report.

A lot of them shed a tear or two when two ladies were called up to the podium and a nice lady told all kinds of funny stories from their past. But both ladies seemed so pleased after the reading of their backgrounds, and all the ladies stood up again and applauded. They were named "Service Award" winners, and from what I heard they really had given a lot of service to TWBA!

My lady took me to a lovely luncheon provided for those ladies in white and again there were old friends hugging each other and laughing and telling stories about incidents in their past. It's too bad they can't all get together more often to share those happy moments, but My Lady said, it's just fun to be together at least once a year.

After lunch my lady became involved in an 'election'. Some ladies gave her some papers stapled together, called 'ballots'. Others came around with baskets and took one sheet of her ballot at a time, until something called 'polls' closed.

Even while they were waiting for results, the ladies worked. Some talked about raising money for something called "BVL Fund", others told about a "Jamboree in the Valley", and still others talked about high scoring Junior performances! It was interesting fun.

Soon the pretty lady at the microphone told all the women, "These are your new officers and directors for three years" and everyone clapped hands again.

It must have been 'surprise' time then, because two ladies in white suits stood at the microphone and told the first lady at the mike, "You are a new Life Member" - and the members clapped again-and the lady cried! I don't understand how ladies can laugh and cry at the same time, but that's what they were doing!

A few hours later after everyone dressed for dinner we moved into a ballroom so gorgeously decorated with bluebonnets, blue candles centerpieces and hanging decorations made by the Austin ladies that it almost

My Lady shared the joy and exuberance of the guests, and I did notice a tear come to her eye - and it was one of sheer happiness at the great honor bestowed on a friend.

Then it was skit time as San Antonio and Houston pursued their bids for the '81 tournament - and what pandemonium reigned as members of both associations entertained with clever presentations.

San Antonio's "Gong Show" performance brought forth gales of laughter and a standing ovation - even though - their all-important 'Gong' toppled over each time it was hit.

Houston's "Shee-Haw" skit was equally hilarious and a stubborn microphone that wouldn't stay in play brought even larger laughs from the appreciative dinner guests.

What anxious moments were ahead for members of both groups - as the chairman of the Teller's Committee called the rolls of the local associations - intoning the

Today is the end of an era. The end of an illustrious career in the bowling game and the change of ownership at San Pedro Lanes.

Lewis P. (Lew) Levinson, operator of San Pedro Lanes since 1957, turns over the keys to the center to 29 year old Donny Hurwitz, of Austin's Bowl-O-Rama.

Levinson and the Hurwitz family have been friends for more than 20 years and reminisced together early this week after announcing the sale.

"San Antonio is my second home," said Donny. "I was about three years old when I first met Lew and some of my happiest days here in San Antonio have been right here in San Pedro. My dad and Lew have been close friends all these years and we're more like one big family."

Donny's father opened Ayers Bowl at Corpus Christi in 1950 and in 1957 opened Gulf Bowl, the same year Mr. Lew opened San Pedro.

Donny attended the University of Texas then transferred to Trinity University. He competed in the Collegiate Division, taught bowling and generally promoted the game for years while working at the First National Bank of San Antonio. And, he has many friends here in the Alamo City.

His bowling roots go so deep that he was competing in the TABY leagues before there was an active AJBC program and he's learned all facets of bowling center operation. Seventeen or eighteen years after his father opened Ayers, the family purchased Austin Bowl-O-Rama, and they will continue the operation of the other three centers, now adding San Pedro.

At one point in his career in the bowling business it seems ironic that Levinson also operated four bowling centers, under the name of "Four Star Bowling Centers" Woodlawn, San Pedro, Austin Highway Lanes and Goliad.

Hurwitz' first plans for San Pedro included the addition of automatic scoring devices, although he had not yet determined which brand. "We would install them during the summer without interrupting league play but definitely before league play begins again in the Fall," he advised.

Austin Bowl-O-Rama is the site of the Texas 600 Club tournament now underway in Austin and has been equipped with AMF MagicScores, which many local women are now enjoying, as the TWBA Championships continue.

Since entering the bowling business in 1946 Levinson compiled many "firsts" for San Antonio. He was the first to install semi-automatic pinsetters in his establishments. He installed the first automatic Tel-E-Foul lights, and he was the second in Texas to install completely automatic pinsetters. He instituted the first in-house pro shop and then initiated the first sanctioned AJBC leagues in San Antonio.

During his illustrious career he has been inducted into two Halls of Fame first into the Hall of Fame of Jewish Athletes for his performance on Texas golf links and in 1976, into the San Antonio Bowling Council Hall of Fame.

He was one of the organizers of the Texas Bowling Proprietors Association and is a past president of the San Antonio Bowling Council and was instrumental in furthering the establishment of the Hall of

Fame into which he was elected six years later.

His first center-Woodlawn Lanes was destroyed by fire.

Austin Highway lanes became Astro Bowl, and Goliad Lanes were sold to Ronpie Gaudern earlier this year.

It was with mixed emotions that the Kegler editor visited with Levinson and Hurwitz this week. San Antonio and San Pedro lanes just won't be the same without Lew Levinson and his warm and wonderful wit, and the many happy time shared.

Sad, that this day had to come, but with a feeling of excitement of all that's ahead with the fresh young talent at the helm at San Pedro. We've been to some Hurwitz-operated centers and the experience has been heart-warming.

Drop by San Pedro and welcome Donny and beautiful wife, Joyce, to our bowling family. You probably will find that somewhere during your bowling travels around South Texas you have met this energetic, intelligent new addition. Welcome, Donny!

FACE 'ROUND THE LANES

He talks softly-but we saw no 'big stick'-as we visited with the new manager of San Pedro lanes, Al Rivers.

The newest addition to San Antonio's bowling scene is a tall, dark, extremely pleasant former employee of Ayers Bowl in Corpus Christi.

He speaks so quietly, and so knowledgably about the game and his plans for San Pedro, that you're ready to whip out a pen and sign up for a league!

And what's ahead for San Pedro bowlers is indeed exciting. First, a complete remodeling job in the office-area and snack bar to be included, the addition of a pro shop, game room and full bar, as well as a revision of the existing menu.

His eyes fairly light up when you mention the installation of new automatic scoring machines for the center, although the decision has not yet been made as to which type. They will be installed in time for Fall leagues however we are assured.

And, he gets an almost tough attitude when talking

about "a clean bowling center, with the cleanest condition in town." We saw a little of what he meant as we watched the new crew, under head mechanic, Carlos Alarcon's watchful eye. "We clean the lanes daily and twice if necessary. I can't stand for our bowlers to roll on less than perfect conditions-in fact I can't stand to see even a gum wrapper outside a waste basket," Rivers stated.

"We're also great believers in preventive maintenance and our on going training program has proven to be the answer for us. We take care of minor problems, before they become major ones. Bowlers don't want to wait 10-15 minutes for equipment failures and we don't want them to have to."

"We're very promotion-minded in the Hurwitz operation," he added, "and we want to keep something going all the time for the bowlers. We like 'specials' and our first in all four of the Hurwitz center is a 'Coke Glass' promo. In this, for open bowlers, we issue a gift



card and after the person has rolled nine games of open play he can earn one of the attractive glasses."

"In our other centers we have had Special of the Day-colored pins, lucky bucks and stamp-bowling. We're offering first here at San Pedro a "roll one game-get another free" promotion just to get acquainted with some of the bowlers."

"Later we have some new

ideas we think the bowlers will like and we'll be including some of our raffles, too," he said.

The overall future plans for San Pedro include Learn To Bowl classes and formation of LTB leagues. The senior and junior program is to be expanded, and greater assistance will be given to league secretaries in the formation of new leagues, and counseling will be available to existing leagues.

The 37-year-old new manager is a former Air Force man who returned to San Antonio after his stay at Lackland AFB to marry his Glenda who resided here. They have a seven year old son, Derek.

"We're just happy to be here in San Antonio," he concluded, "and we want to become the Number One center in the city-we don't think we can become that until we prove to the bowlers that we deserve that title." With Rivers' quiet enthusiasm, his drive and attention to detail, don't be too surprised if he reaches his goal.

Deadline Nears

Entrants into the SABA-SAWBA 4th Annual Mixed Tournament should be aware of the entering average clause (Rule 9) which states that bowlers will use highest 1977-78 yearbook averages.

That's true. But before all you folks who have improved your scores this past season more than ten pins-read on down to Rule 16!

ABC Rule #363 - in addition to the portion regarding the bowler's responsibility to verify the accuracy of his/her average-states: "When a tournament uses the previous season's averages and at the time of entry the entrant has a current season's average for 21 or more games, which is 10 pins higher than the previous season's average, the bowler MUST use

his/her current average for entry in the tournament."

Too, in Rule 9 there is a correction to be made in the wording: Entrants will use current Yearbook averages for the tournament, however, bowlers with no yearbook averages will use highest 21 game or more averages.

A printer's error is in Rule 10, and in the event extra lanes are needed to conduct the tournament, the additional weekend of July 28-29 will be used.

The Mixed Tournament entry deadline is midnight, June 28 and entry forms are at all the lanes.

The ABC/WIBC sanctioned event is scheduled to roll on July 14-15 and July 21-22 at Goliad Bowl.

Entry fee is \$7.00 per person per event and the meet is divided into three

classes. Shifts on Saturday, July 14 and 21 are at 11 a.m., 2:30 p.m. and 6 p.m. Sunday Doubles play will be at 12 noon, 4 and 6 p.m. All entries and fees are to be mailed to SAWBA, P.O. Box 16427, San Antonio, TX 78216.

Confirmations will include reminders of the 10-pin rule and date corrections, according to SAWBA chairman Helen Kalala. Jeff Knowlton is the SABA Mixed Tournament chairman.

"I think back to my 22 years here at Bowlerama, and it's a wonderful feeling. I have shared the heartbreaks, pleasures and joys of bowlers, watching fine young AJBC bowlers reach maturity and enjoyed meeting their offspring years later. Nothing can replace the companionship, good fellowship and joy of being part of the bowling business," said Canright.

"I feel that by turning the business over to Stone I leave the future bowling of friends of Bowlerama in good hands. The plans for remodeling and renovation are exciting and are some that I think our bowlers will appreciate and enjoy."

Stone and Sons, means Harold, owner and operator of All Star and Oak Hills, and sons Rick, who will be the new Bowlerama manager, and Gary.

"Bettie Jo (Geisler) will continue to watch our money, overseeing all three centers," said Harold. "Rick will assume the manager's duties and our first step will be the complete resurfacing and modernization of the center."

Rick added, "Following resurfacing, we will be putting in a lot of new equipment including new ball returns with lazy susans, settees, bright concourse area, and a complete revamping of the snack bar, nursery and lounge area."

"During renovation we invite all our friends to come watch our progress and we'll provide the coffee and soft drinks while they're here."

Stone emphasized that individuals or leagues wishing information for the fall season at Bowlerama should contact Rick at All Star 923-7703, or Bettie Jo at Oak Hills, 344-6251.

Bowlerama lanes opened on December 14, 1957, one month before San Pedro lanes, which changed hands just three weeks ago.

"San Antonio is not a bowling town," is what Col Canright was told by bankers, brokers and investment realtors in the early fifties. "We received a bid for construction of \$394,000 originally, and it took almost two years before we received the financing to open," said Col Canright. "When the doors opened that December

on opening night there were nearly 100 folks waiting to try our new lanes, and asking why we didn't construct a larger center."

During his career in the bowling business Col Canright has been involved in all aspects of the game, including helping establish the Hall of Fame, president of the Proprietors Association and an active leader in junior bowling activities.

He and his lovely wife moved to San Antonio from St. Paul, Minnesota, where he was stationed at Lackland AFB, after serving overseas. He served in the Military Court in Japan and on the War Crimes Commission, sitting in on the trial of the Japanese Premier after the war.

When asked about his future plans, Col. Canright flashed his well-known grin and retorted, "I think I may have time to go fishing now. But first Mrs. Canright and I are taking a trip back home to Minnesota. We haven't had time for a real vacation in ten years."

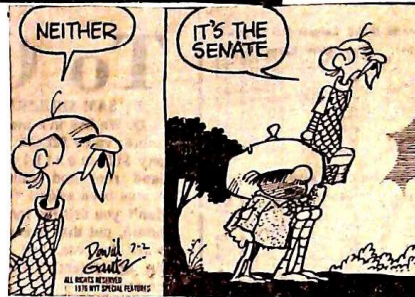
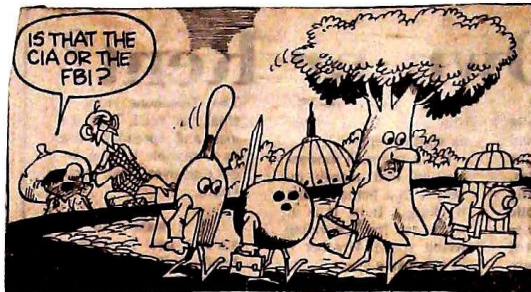

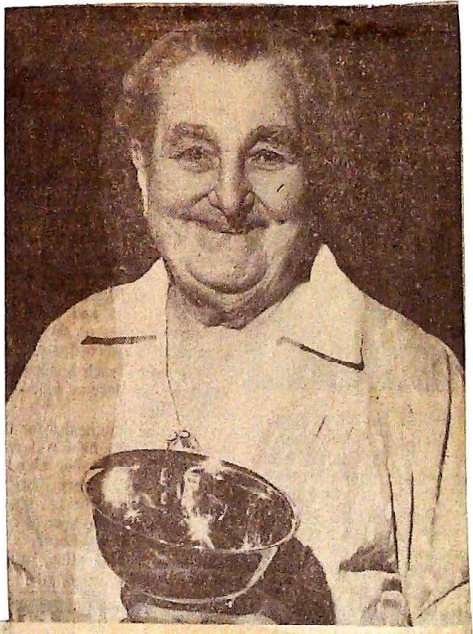
Newest of the leagues for the elderly is the Oak Hills Senior League, getting ready to start its second season with 24 members.

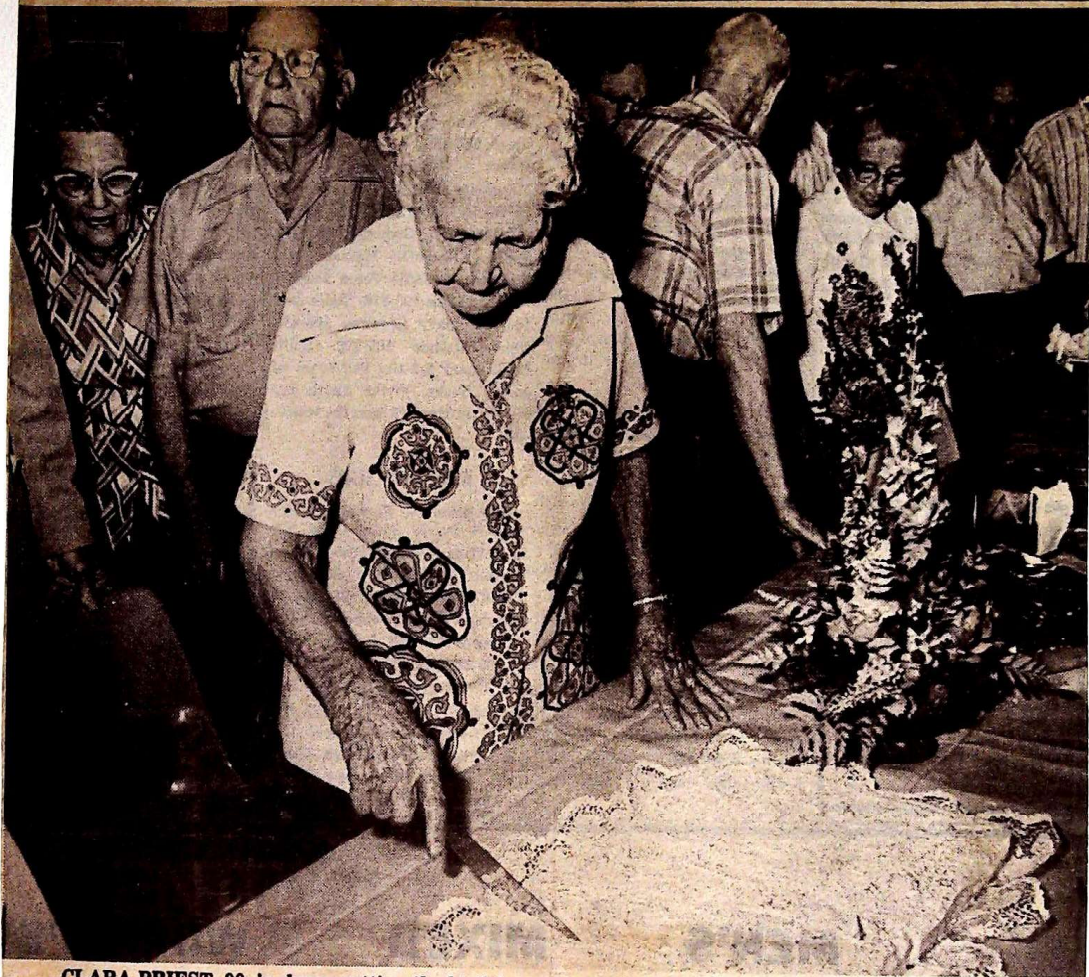
Mrs. Whall Dies at 95

SAWBA Selects Tourney Sites

Goliad Bowl soon to be known as "Ponderosa Bowl" and Bowlerama of Texas now undergoing complete renovation, received the nod of the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association Board of Directors this week to host the 44th annual Championship Tournament.

Death Claims Mrs. Erna Haufler

Mrs. Erna Haufler, a pioneer who helped blazed the way for women in the sport of bowling, died Thursday morning. At press time final arrangements had not been completed at Roy Akers Funeral Home.

Mrs. Haufler and Violet E. (Billy) Simon were San Antonio's only WIBC champions, having that title in 1935. She was a former president of the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association, and served as president of the

Women's Texas State Bowling Association in 1935 before the name was changed to TWBA. She served a second term in 1939 when 100 teams rolled in the state tournament for the first time.

For her decades of service to women bowlers she was enshrined in both the Texas and San Antonio Bowling Council Hall of Fame.

The Kegler will have a more meaningful tribute in next week's issue.
