San Antonians bowling with one eye on leaderboard

Cindy Berlanga and four other San Antonio women will be watching the WIBC national tournament leaderboard at Buffalo, N.Y., with a special interest next week.

The nation's premier women pros, who will be preparing for the WIBC Queens event May 14-18, are expected to challenge Berlanga's lead in the Classic Division singles and her team's advantage in that event during the May 10-12 weekend.

Berlanga, for now, can enjoy what she accomplished at Buffalo last Sunday. She had games of 244, 223 and 294 for a 723 series in singles. Rose Dendy of Wilmington, Del., was the previous leader with 672.

Berlanga, Connie Smoot, Judy Enderlin, Dolores Raggsdale and Nedwyn Sadler, who call

themselves: The Oil Diggers combined for a 2,855 score Monday to take the Classic Division team lead from Young Rascals of Buffalo, who had led with 2,842.

Enderlin led the team with a 246-614 set, followed by Berlanga with 212-601, Raggsdale 219-574, Sadler 215-569 and Smoot 189-497.

The women also recorded the tournament's high team game with an 1,019 in their second game

(Enderlin 246, Sadler 215, Berlanga 209, Smoot 189 and Raggsdale 164). Berlanga is fifth in all events with 1,822. S.A.'s Iva Wright is fourth in Division II singles with 390.

■ **High rollers:** Rick Martel had games of 276, 237 and 300 for an 813 at Davis, and Richard Nelson rolled 265, 300 and 215 for a 780 set and Robert Keyser had 234, 245 and 289 for a 778 series at Ponderosa, all Monday. ... Bryan Lamb had 196, 300 and 183 for 680 series at San Pedro on Wednesday. ... Ken Reeler rolled 300, 187 and 173 for a 660 set at Astro Friday. Bonnie Santinello had 290 and 180. ... Hernandez had 255-737 at Astro. ... Shelley Fulmer had 277-692 at Ponderosa.

■ **Key tidbits:** John Boags, Jr. had a 288 game. Ise Poole was 101 pins over her average with a 244 game

and junior bowler Ricky Barboza picked up the 7-10 split at Comal. ... Ken Cobb had a 289 game at Oak Hills. ... Joe Hernandez and Jeff Banks both had 289 games, and Toby Canty converted the 7-10 split at Ponderosa. ... Val Lawson Jr. had a 290 game at Skylark. ... Sotero Bautista had a 290 game, Mike Wehmyer was 162 pins over his average with a 265-774 series, Joe Estrella was 153 pins over with a 615 set. Gene Layman had a 289 game and 12-year-old Kenneth Jackson had 255-604 at University. ... Country Lanes No. 1, featuring Billy Woodward, Brandy Lively, Audric Beni, Kevin Ramey and Jerri Baker, won the Elley's Roadrunners YABA Traveling League.

■ **PBA regional:** San Antonio's Greg Kemp, Mike Shoemaker and Joe Brock finished second, sixth

and 24th, respectively, in the PBA Regional Tournament at Longview last weekend. Kemp ended with an 8-4-0 match-play record and a 5,661 total pinfall for \$1,700. Corey Atkinson of Luftkan won the event with a 10-2 record and a 5,672 total for \$3,000. Shoemaker finished with a 7-5-0 match-play record and a total pinfall of 5,377 to earn \$850. Brock ended with 2,483 for 12 qualifying games for \$285.

■ **Local wins:** Bob Freehaut of San Antonio won the top prize of \$1,000 in the Senior All Star Bowling Association's tournament last weekend in Nacogdoches. Freehaut averaged 227.55, won six of eight matches and finished with a total pinfall of 4,351 to beat ABC and PBA Hall of Famer Gary Dickinson of Edmond, Okla., by nine pins. Dickinson, who

averaged 227.10, earned \$900.

■ **LPBT doubles:** Laura Moriarty and Tammy Turner defeated Alicia Sili and Jodi Woessner 247-225 to win the LPBT Storm Doubles tournament Wednesday night at Las Vegas. Rachel Perez of San Antonio, who averaged 213.53 for 18 games, and Kim Canady of San Francisco finished ninth and split \$3,100.

■ **State meet:** Darla Ruhl of New Braunfels and Opal Spragin of Kerrville are first and second with respective scores of 394 and 369 in Division 4 singles, and Eve Fricke and Anne Hayes are first in Division 4 doubles with 1,042 at TWBA state tournament in Austin.

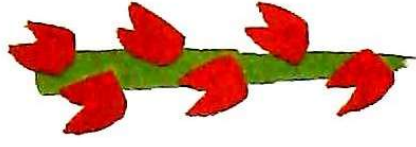

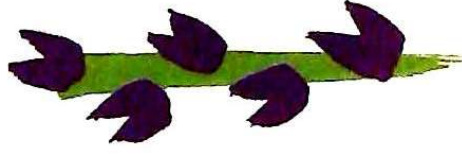

Thanks for the assistance your member provided.

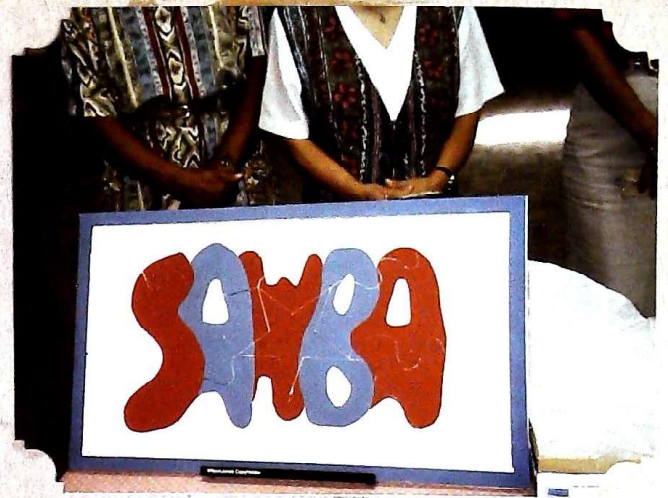
