

FOLLOW THE USBC ROAD

Kansas is the setting for creation of historic single membership organization

 $S_{\text{mack in the middle of the Great Plains, in the state made famous as the home of Dorothy from the movie 'The Wizard of Oz,' bowling found its pot of gold at the end of the rainbow.}$

The moment occurred at 12-18 p.m. Central Daylight Time on May 5 at the Century II Convention Center in Wichita, Kan WIBC President Sylvia Broyles had the pleasure of making the official announcement to those remaining from the WIBC Annual Meeting:

"There will be a United States Bowling Congress."

With those words, a new era in organized bowling was born. The WIBC and American Bowling Congress delegations had approved the proposal to create the USBC, which will mean one organization for bowlers of all ages and genders. The USA Bowling Board of Directors also approved the plan to bring USA Bowling aboard. While the Young American Bowling Alliance Board of Directors didn't approve the proposal, its members were scheduled to meet again before the May 15 deadline (after this issue went to press. Please visit bowl.com for more information).

"This was the time. This was the place. Now we will go forward," Broyles said. "I'm so happy, I can't stand it."

USBC will end the duplication of services currently provided by multiple membership organizations and will save millions of dollars on the national level. Local and state associations have the "option" to merge with their ABC counterparts. For example, if your local association chooses to merge with its ABC counterpart, your mixed league secretaries will only have to fill out one form, send it to one place, and all members in the league pay the same amount of dues.

Your association may only merge if you and your fellow members vote to do so. To take full advantage of what a merger has to offer on the local and national level, we suggest that you attend the association meeting at which the decision will be made to let your wishes be known. Contact your local WIBC association as soon as possible to find out when the meeting will be held, attend the meeting, and let the association know how you feel about the options available

Association delegates attending the state association meeting will vote to determine if the state association will merge with their state ABC counterparts. This would eliminate another level of duplication.

Creating USBC means beginning with the 2005-06 season, current WIBC members will belong to the same organization as their male counterparts. If you compete in a mixed league, as nearly 75 percent of

you do, you'll enjoy the same benefits at the same price as the males in your league

As a WIBC member, you will not see any major changes when you and your leammates begin the 2004-05 season. Your membership card still will say WIBC and you still will receive Frames & Lanes until the end of this year.

The first major difference you'll notice will come next winter when Frames & Lanes merges with ABC's American Bowler into a new publication. You will receive your first USBC membership card when you start the 2005-06 season.

WIBC will continue with business as usual through Dec. 31, 2004 USBC officially launches on Jan. 1, 2005.

Stay tuned to the next issue of Frames & Lanes where we will give more reasons why there will be no place like USBC.

ABC and WIBC finally agree to merge January

WICHITA, KS - Organized bowling took a major step for-ward May 5 when the Women's International Bowling Congress and American Bowling Congress delegations and the USA Bowling Board of Directors approved the

States history. Currently, ABC has more than 1.6 million members and WIBC has more than 1.2 million. Joining them with USA Bowling will create one organiza-tion with about 2.8 million members. USBC also will apply to the United States Olympic Committee to become the national governing body for bowling in the United States

Sealed ballots from WIBC voting May 4 and ABC voting March 19 were unsealed and counted following the adjournment of the WIBC Annual Meeting at the Century II Convention Center. According to the Plan of Merger, a two-thirds vote approval from each of the ABC and WIBC delegations was needed to form

Both the WIBC and ABC delegations overwhelmingly approved the merger.

The USA Bowling Board of Directors also approved the pro-posal. WIBC and ABC vote totals are available on bowl.com.

"I'm a believer. This was the time. This was the place. I am so happy I can't stand it," said WIBC president Sylvia Broyles

"We certainly are proud of all of you. We know everyone put in a lot of hard work," said USA Bowling president Cathy Cooper. 'USA Bowling's coaches and athletes are in full support of USBC.

The Young American Bowling Alliance Board of Directors did not approve the proposal but has until May 15 to reconsider it. May 15 is the expiration date of the Plan of Merger.

"This was not an easy decision for the YABA Board of Directors." said YABA president Mitch Mitchell. "They struggled long and hard with their allegiance to their appointing organizations and based this decision solely on what they believe is in the best interest of youth bowlers."

Immediately following the announcement, the presidents of the merging organizations signed the Articles of Incorporation that will be filed with the State of Wisconsin by May 15. The initial organizational meeting of the USBC will be held June 25-20 in Milwaukee.



MILWAUKEE — The United States Bowling Congress officially became operational and plans were made to chart its future June 25-26 following the historic organizational meeting of the USBC Board of Directors.

The Board approved all the legal documents necessary to confirm USBC's corporate status. It will elect officers and appoint the search committee for the organization's chief executive officer at its next meeting. An early priority of USBC will be the establishment and communication of its strategic direction.





Lil Poole loved life, her bowlers and many friends

Bowling will miss her.

Lil Poole, one of the game's giants in leadership, passed away on Sept. 11.

Sylvia Broyles worked under Texas Women's Bowling Associa-tion secretary Poole for years and abels her as her mentor. Poole

helped condition Broyles for her current position - president of the Women's International Bowling Congress.

"Lil was kind, caring and stately," said Broyles who became secretary when Poole retired in 1987 after 21 years. "You never doubted who was the boss. She was always the top gun."

Mary Burns who was closely associated with Poole throughout the years pointed out that during

Lil's time as secretary the TWBA membership rose to its largest number of members in history and the state tournament enjoyed record-breaking entries, one year over 3,000 teams.

"Lil was a strict taskmaster and those who worked with her and under her became very knowledgable about the ins and outs of bowling and especially in the running of tournaments," said Burns, "She liked her tournament squads to go on the lanes on time and you better be up when it was your time to bowl or you just might get a zero for that frame.

was active with and a champion for the youth bowler. In the 60s and 70s there was a movement for Texas to break away from the National Youth Association. Lil fought tooth and toenail to retain the National program and to help and improve it so the youth would benefit. She won. She always won

Lil, who resided in Hurst, received many honors during her life for her contributions to bowling. She was a charter member of the Texas Women's Bowling Writers Association, a Hall of Fame member and a life member of the Fort Worth WBA and a Hall of Fame and life member of the Texas WBA. Lil, 82, also served on many WIBC committees and had many friends nationwide who she always enjoyed seeing when she went to nationals

"Lil pushed for the prestigious Bluebonnet Queens Tournament and introduced many new services to benefit the women bowlers of Texas, "Burns said.

"During her career, she served as president, vice president and director of the Forth Worth WBA and at the state level she served as director, vice president and sgt.at-arms of the TWBA. They loved her. Whenever a bowler came to a tournament, the first thing she wanted to do was see Lil.

Doris Kaufman of Wichita Falls ras the TWBA president from 1982 to 1994.

"I just can't say enough about Lil," she said. "She was always there for you. Such a wonderful lady and great traveling compan-

Added longtime proprietor Jeanie Hulsey, "She was such a wonderful ambassador for bowling. And if she told you she was going to do something she would do it one hundred percent. Bowling needs more Lil Pooles.

Lil was born in Plainview Plainview, OK, not Plainview, TX.

She came to Texas during World War II and became a riveter at a bomber plant. She later became a game warden and operated a liquor store for a short














Good-bye to a Texas Treasure

For the next few months, there will be many stories told concerning the passing of TWBA's Past Secretary, Life Member and Hall of Famer, Lil Poole. Most will be ones of admiration with the way she conducted herself in the administration of tournaments, some will be about her service to TWBA. I was fortunate to have known Lil, and for that matter "of" Lil, from the time I was a child. Being a friend of both Mom and Dad's, and having worked and bowled with her over the years, they considered her an example of how bowling leaders should work for all bowlers.

My first thoughts will come with a smile, because to me, Lil Poole, under that professional demeanor was absolutely, positively a "hoot". Her sense of humor and that bit of mischievousness were my favorite traits about her. I would like to share two remembrances with you.

We had a deaf young lady on the team, and she had developed the habit of rearing up at the line, sending that ball flying. On this particular day, Connie was really struggling. After the first ball of a frame, I caught her attention, and using the sign language her mother had taught me, I signed for her to keep her head down and her backside up. She started laughing and went on the explain she had a deaf brother and had learned to sign. 
White hair also brings a chuckle. A

She told me about the time she and a friend went to their weekly hairdresser appointment. It was raining that day, so the friend let Lil off at the front, while she went to park. As the friend came to the door, an obviously surprised lady was standing there, open-mouthed, at the entrance. Lil went on to say that the stunned lady put her hand on the friend's arm and said, "I think Ann Richards (then governor of Texas) just went in there." The friend smiled knowing full well who "Ann Richards" had been, what with similar "dos" and all. The friend played along for a bit and the lady left the shop convinced she and Gov. Ann Richards got their hair done at the same place. Of course, Lil thought this was so funny. I told her she might get a job as a famous impersonator. She said she would just keep being herself.

Frankly, that is what I liked most about Lil. She was comfortable with herself, as well as with folks in bowling and out, with women, men, children, the known and the not so known. Serious when she needed to be, a bit rascally when she could, she was an inspiration and mentor to many. "Texas Red Rose" will bloom on in our memories. Thanks and God bless you, Lil Poole.

WIBC executive director Roseann Kubn wins 2005 WIBC Joyce Deitch Trailblazer Award

GREENDALE, WI — Women's International Bowling Congress executive director Roseann Kuhn, Franklin, WI, will receive the WIBC Joyce Deitch Trailblazer Award at the 2005 WIBC Convention, scheduled April 22-24 in Tulsa, OK. Kuhn was unanimously selected for this honor by the WIBC Recognition Committee.

The Joyce Deitch Trailblazer Award, named for the seventh WIBC president and life member, recognizes an individual or group making a significant contribution to women's bowling. Those receiving the award are considered risk takers, leaders, innovators, motivators, change agents and visionaries.

"To be recognized for something that I love to do and have done for more than half of my life was beyond my highest expectations," Kuhn said. "It means the wood to me to have my name associated with the 'real' trailblazer, Joyce Deitch. Joyce was not only my mentor during her term as WIBC president but also my friend."

With 30 years of service to WIBC, Kuhn was selected because she embodies all the qualities needed to receive the Trailblazer Award. As a leader within WIBC, Kuhn faced many challenges. Her relentless devotion and dedication to WIBC was evident in the fair and tough decisions she made as executive director. Under her leadership, the

products and services offered to women bowlers were enhanced.

In addition, Kuhn was a forward-looking leader, always making sacrifices to benefit the organization and the bowling industry. One such example was her work on the Plan of Merger to create the unified United States Bowling Congress. Despite the fact that she would eventually lose her position within WIBC, Kuhn worked diligently to bring a plan before the WIBC delegates that would be approved and pave the way for the future of bowling for women, men and youth.

In her current position as WIBC executive director as well as chief operating officer, Kuhn oversees WIBC's daily management at national headquarters in Greendale, WI, and ensures WIBC delivers quality products and services to its members and volunteers. She also works very closely with WIBC president Sylvia Broyles and the WIBC Board of Directors.

Kuhn, a Victoria, KS, native, joined the WIBC staff in 1974 as a field representative, visiting hundreds of women's bowling associations to promote WIBC services and to help solve issues and address questions about WIBC. Less than two years later, she was promoted to field services department manager.

Her advancement continued with her serving as rules/legal manager from 1988 to 1995. In 1995, Kuhn relocated to the Denver area where she served as WIBC's rules/legal technical advisor before being appointed WIBC executive director in 1996.

In 2004, she also received the Metropolitan Bowling Writers Association's most prestigious award – the William Landgrai Memorial Award for Disunguished Service to the sport of bowling.

WIBC explores rebirth of Professional Women's Tour

GREENDALE, WI — The Women's International Bowling Congress continues to explore the possibility of staging a professional women's bowling tour. A planning team was formed and has met to address key issues

including securing tour sponsors and television coverage of tour stops as well as developing a business plan.

"We're progressing steadily," said Jan Schmidt, WIBC director of tournaments and marketing. "However, advancement has been slower than anticipated due to the magnitude of the project and the many other initiatives underway at WIBC, including the transition to the United States Bowling Congress." WIBC acquired the rights and assets of the Professional Women's Bowling Association in June and is working to put together the necessary components for a re-launch of a women's tour. The USBC board of directors will

review the proposal once the essential pieces are in place to determine if it will move forward with a women's tour.
