Thousand Oaks To Open Saturday

With Joe Joseph, Virginia Norton, Belinda Campos

It's all new - it's exciting - and it's truly magnificent - that description could only apply to San Antonio's newest member of the bowling family - Thousand Oaks Bowl, set to open to the public next Saturday.

And, the public is certain to be impressed - if not just with the physical plant itself, then with the special guests brought in for the opening.

ABC Hall of Famer Joe Joseph and stunning blonde Virginia Norton, who was the first woman professional to shoot an 800 series - both Brunswick Advisory Staff members - and a sharp-shooting billiards champion by the name of Belinda Campos! All three will be on hand for autographing, signing, perhaps a small demonstration of their prowess - and just getting acquainted with San Antonians.

Orville Downs, general manager of the magnificent new complex appears to be everywhere at once, tending to the multitude of details preparatory to the opening. It doesn't take many moments with the energetic, soft-spoken Brunswick veteran, to realize that his pride is justifiable and one gets caught up in the excitement he generates.

The center is to feature the newest in the Brunswick line - Action Set making units with energy saving units, with brightly visible ball and strikes hits - the attractive 2000 Twin Line ball returns. The center is huge! Forty shining new lanes -

an easily accessible snack bar, game room, children's playroom which is to be constantly supervised, meeting room and a magnificent lounge, complete with stunning stained glass panels in the ceiling which would be the envy of many discos.

Waist-high brick walls, which hide center balls from view of those walking the carpeted concourse area, add the perfect touch to the decor. The control counter is equipped with built-ins for speediest service to the bowlers - and even features a lacy susan storage bin for house shoes.

There's to be a pro shop, computer room, meeting room, storage and maintenance

space and two executive offices.

While the Kegler was sneaking a preview-peek of the mammoth facility, workmen were still performing their magic, cables were strung everywhere, and crates and cartons were yet being emptied - but the beauty showed through the chaos.

Downs' assistant manager, Mike Andrews, was also caught up in the excitement and work, but we learned that he comes to the Alamo City with a wealth of experience and knowledge.

The St. Louis native is not only a bowler, but a tough soccer player who's looking for that type of action as soon as grand opening duties are

completed and the center is thriving.

He's been assistant manager of the Rocky Mountain lanes in Denver (a 40-lane Brunswick center), assistant manager of the South Plains Bowl in Lubbock, also a 40-lane center and the 32-lane Bowlerland in Fort Worth.

The affable 30-year-old talent is a graduate of the BRC Manager's School, who is trained in management, counter control, pro shop operation including fitting and drilling of balls and as if that wasn't enough, he's a certified bowling instructor who loves bowling promotion.

Also already on the

Thousand Oaks staff are two familiar names to local bowlers - Dottie Frank and Debbie Kirst. Dottie has been almost constantly on the phones working with league secretaries and new bowlers filling the leagues which will be rolling at Thousand Oaks in the Fall.

League starting times will be throughout the day and at 6:15 p.m. and 9:00 on weekdays, 6:15 and 9p.m. on Saturdays and at 7:30p.m. on Sundays.

Adult senior leagues will be on Wednesday at 12:30 noon on Wednesday at 9:15 a.m. on Thursday mornings.

Debbie is the new junior coordinator who plans Saturday morning leagues. Hundreds of young bowlers have already enrolled in learn-to-bowl classes which will begin immediately after Grand Opening. Volunteer coaches are still needed and interested bowlers may contact Debbie at 654-0032 after 5:30 p.m. or on weekends at 684-4507.

Downs says that Thousand Oaks is designed for total family entertainment - and the program includes Club 55 for Senior adults; free instruction classes for both juniors and adults, the exclusive annual Bowl Your Way to Europe program and the expansive Brunswick Awards Program.

Thousand Oaks Bowl is a bright new spot on the city's northside - and everyone is welcome next Saturday! Rolling off Loop 410, you may take San Pedro to Thousand Oaks and turn right, or off Loop 410 you may take either Perrin Beitel or Nacogdoches at Thousand Oaks and turn left. It'll be well worth the trip!

Team event on Saturday found the tough Mixed Heat team taking the lead with 3114, as members Liz Smith carded 570, Gary Ricks 567, Shannon Bell 545, Fred Williams 576 and Dicky Bell anchoring for 638. The leaders received 218 pins handicap.

In second in Class A was the Screw Loose Gang who slammed in 3059 with handicap, and moving into third was "5" from Ft. Sam with 3039.

In Class B the Jack in the Box quintet popped out in front with 3013. Members were Earl Reeves 450, Irene Reeves 451, Alice Scherer 593, Ronald Scherer 492 and George Scherer 574. The leaders received 453 pins handicap. The Untouchables with 2991 zipped into second with Salt & Pepper in third with 2784.

Taking first place leads in Doubles were Claudia and Jim Pierson in Class A. Gary Ricks and Kym Krauss in Class B, and Charles Maxie and Marie McBride in Class C.

The Piersons swatted an 1130 scratch and received 156 pins handicap to take their lead, while the Ricks-Krauss duo received 230 on their way to 1289. The Class C leaders, Maxie-McBride received 261 and totaled 1311.

Mary Falconer and Richard Roberts hold plaques symbolic of their win in Class A Doubles with no handicap, they slammed in a combination score of 1310.

After two weekends of pinbusting Wendy's Restaurant, captained by Wendell Wong, Mary Falconer and Richard Roberts were declared winners in Class A of the SABA/SAWBA sponsored City Mixed tournament at Astro Bowl. The winning Class A team entered with an 832 team age but all five were consistent with good scores. Vangie (179 average) carded a 106, 188, 234 to pace the quintet, while teammates Aurora Cooper (159) had 462, Martin Rendon (143) a nifty 144 and anchor Art Vera (180) added 179-214-209 for a 602. The team received 403 pins handicap to add to their scratch score for a winning 3245. The team will split \$220 for first place. Last year's winning score by the RDCSM team was 3145 with handicap. In doubles the story was all about fantastic partners to move to first and second in Class A. He rolled first Sunday at 2 m with Mary Falconer, who entered with a book average of 185, 90 and a whopping 259 the men's highest series for 534.

Richard added games of 267, 212 and 197 for a 676. Their 1310 total was without handicap since Richard also entered with a book average over 200, a 208. They earned \$250 for their victory. Two squads later Richard rolled with Donna Wallace who entered with a 186 average. Donna topped pins at a 190 clip, registering games of 161, 182 and 229 for a 572. Richard added a 257, 241 and 226 for the tournament's highest series of 723. Their total scratch score was 1295 and they received 14 pins handicap to move to within one pin of Richard and Mary. They were paid \$130 as runners-up. Roberts may have had the

tournament's best performance as he shot 596 on the opening weekend, then had series of 706, 677 and 732 last weekend. His average for the nine games last weekend was 231.6. In Class B team, five good friends teamed together for their sponsor Bob Billa Real Estate and went 40 sticks ahead of their nearest competition with a 2101 handicap total. Members were Mona Alonzo who shot 526, Joe Alonzo 498, Chris Davila 492, Dolly Burke 542 and Louis VanderPoorten Jr with 547. The team will share first place money of \$260. Vicki Brehm and her husband Gene teamed together for a hefty 1344 in Class B Doubles. For pretty Vicki it was her

second consecutive major tournament win, as she was also a member of the Martha Washington Judy Who? team several months ago. Vicki swatted a 583 and Gene, 569. They received 192 pins handicap to take the first place prize money of \$215. Only 17 pins separated first from second in Class C team event, as The Mark 5s won their first tournament together, as a team. Paced by Bruce Garcia's 600, Mary Lopez added 439, Frances Contreras 336, Ken Zigrang 528 and Roy Lopez 423. The team will share \$90 first place money after they received 703 pins handicap. Another first-time-tourna-

ment enterer made up one half of the Class C doubles winning duo, as Sharon Geitha entered with a 128 average, but whopped in a big 500 series. Her partner, Tommy A. Barker helped their cause with games of 221-191 and 188 for a 600 on the nose score. The 'coach' and his student received 247 pins handicap and earned 155 for their winning 1347. According to tournament directors Helen Kalala, and her SABA counterpart Terry Edelman, the prize list will be posted at Oak Hills, Astro Bowl and Southside lanes, with checks being issued the following week. 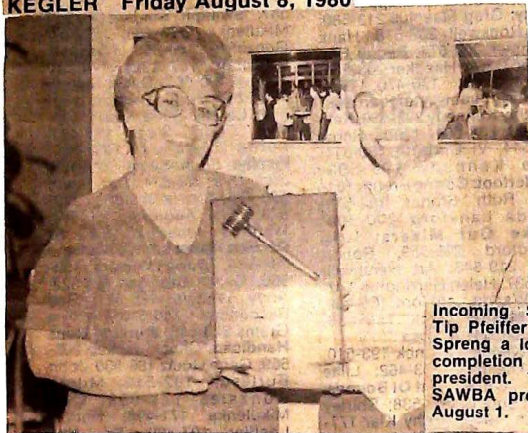

Jamboree guests in New Braunfels last weekend kept watchful eyes on the skies, ears turned to portable radios and spent anxious moments in front of a television during breaks, but went away from the Jamboree sessions with a wealth of knowledge and a greater awareness of WIBC, ABC and AJBC Rules.

Several hundred Jamboree guests listened to a joint presentation by Rules Dept. Manager Dave Lumley, WIBC Director Sylvia Broyles and Jim Beleele, AJBC Field Rep.

Beleele threw away his script and made an impassioned plea to the men who will be delegates to the ABC convention in Memphis next year - urging passage of the Unified Junior Program for the future.

"Let's turn it around this year" said Beleele referring to the declining AJCB membership last season. "There are 735,000 unsanctioned teenagers we need to bring into our program," he told the state's bowling leaders. He distributed flyers on "How To Get" and "How to Keep" juniors in the program, then tested Jamboree attendees on AJCB new and existing rules.

Sylvia's theme was "Communicate" - at all levels and with all integers of the bowling game. She pointed out some of the major changes made at the Seattle convention stating that between \$13 to \$15million of new money was generated for Washington by WIBC convention goers. WIBC had several firsts at the Queens tournament - the first time a major sponsor - Avon - was involved and the first time the Queens had been nationally televised.

TSBA president Harry Brewer of Wichita Falls invited Jamboree guests to seek out worthy candidates for the TSBA Hall of Fame. Local nominations are to be sent to Jack Shuffler, 4222 Cinnabar, Dallas, TX 75227.

For the afternoon session Saturday the Jamboree guests were split and Sylvia conducted her third WIBC session at the Jamborees, reminding the group to reserve the evening of Wednesday, April 29 for a special function for Mrs. Alberta E. Crowe, Liverpool, N.Y. who has served as WIBC President for the past 21 years.

She announced a future project of WIBC similar to the AJBC "I Beat Earl Anthony" fund raiser for the National Hall of Fame & Museum. For the ladies, it will be "I Beat The Bowler of the Decade" - Columbia Industries' Betty Morris. Details will be forthcoming shortly.

Sylvia, Fay Browning, Lil Poole and Millie Wood turned the afternoon session into a mini-workshop, with Millie handling the National Hall/Museum; Fay highlighting increased Senior activity by WIBC, and Lil outlining the many services of TWBA for its membership.

Sylvia concluded the session with a lively question/answer seminar, reminding guests that if appointed to an association committee (or state or national) committee, either accept or decline the appointment, then begin work learning all that is possible about the committee. She suggested that each committee chairman appoint one of the members to serve as secretary of the committee, working closely afterward with the chairman. "Look for both the positive and the negative side" of any question - and again returning to her theme of "communicate" - keep your president, secretary and all others involved abreast of progress.

"Personal contact is our best method of communication to our members - use it fully - and always remember to Bring A Friend when you're working on bowling projects".

It was a lively worthwhile event for bowling officials with good input from the membership to the parent organizations. The New Braunfels associations were tremendous hosts - and Sylvia deserves an orchid for another super job for the State's women bowlers.

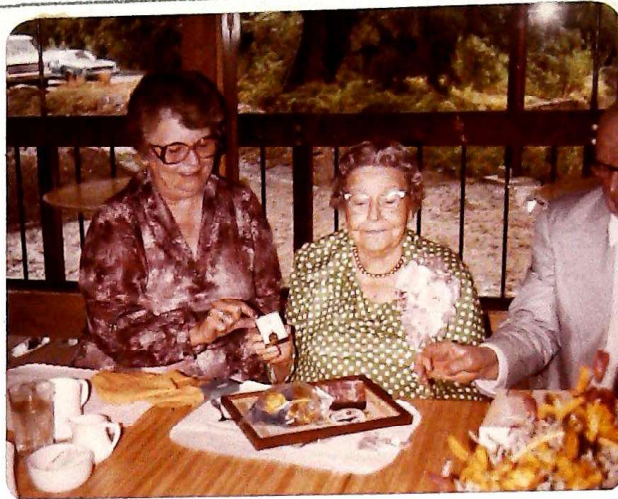

Yearbooks Available

Now that the majority of the League Officers Workshops are over, bowlers should be concentrating on completing Tournament Entries.

Included in the information out at the in-house workshops conducted by SABA directors and by SAWBA Secretary Donna O'Connor at the Tuesday and Thursday Workshops for ladies and mixed leagues, were the current season Yearbooks, giving bowlers names and averages.

Each bowling center and league secretary will have a Yearbook available now.

The TWBA Championship Tournament scheduled for the Sports Palace and Wonder Bowl next year requires a Yearbook Average verification, as does the S.A. Bowling Association tournament, based on 21 games. We suggest that you put your highest 21 game average on your WIBC or ABC sanction card when you acquire it - so there'll be less hassle at tournament entry time.

TWBA Tournament deadline for entries for all ladies bowling locally is December 20, 1980, so that SAWBA can break its own record of

entering the most teams by a hostess city. Special entry forms are available at the SAWBA office. Prime bowling times will be reserved for our out-of-time guests, so don't fuss if you can't one of the more desirable times.

For SABA Local Tournament, entry forms are at all lanes or may be obtained by contacting the SABA office at 923-7501. Deadline for entry is midnight September 19, and the tournament will roll on the weekends of October 18 through November 2. Team event is at Ponderosa Bowl and singles and doubles will be rolled at San Pedro Lanes.

Check a Yearbook - and obtain your correct end of season average - it could save many headaches and we don't want anyone to be disqualified for submitting incorrect averages.

The mail and kind treatment Johnny Campos of the San Antonio Light, Harry Page of the Express-News and I have been receiving lately has been pretty nice ---but after three hours of pouring over records, averages and tournament clippings, we have agreed on a Men's and Women's Top Twenty list - and all that may change!

Selecting this elite list is no small task and we tackled it with impartiality, reviewing tournament performances, league performances, considered lane conditions or reputations and, based on last year's performance only, we made these selections, which we are all three proud to present to our readers.

There are several new names on each list and several who moved in the standings either up or down.

It was our feeling that any individual outstanding performance in the ABC Tournament where more than 15,000 men from around the world bowled in doubles, more than 30,000 in singles and nearly 30,000 in all events, should receive more attention than one single performance in a state, local tournament or a league. Likewise, outstanding performance on the state level should receive more consideration than local or league, and so on down. Local tournaments for the scratch bowlers and head to head competition also received generous consideration and we took into account the number of entries.

In the Women's Top Twenty **Mary Falconer** continued to dominate the ladies bowling scene and her honors were many (see accompanying Superior Performance Award article), but her doubles partner, **Donna Wallace**, was constantly playing "Ms. Avis" throughout the year, except that she also carded the city's highest series by a woman, a 740. She had more than 50 - 600 series and four 700s. One of the most outstanding doubles duos in years.

Officials of the Martha Washington were beginning to think it was the **Liz Smith** tournament as she dominated competition. She had the third highest average and was one tough shooter all year long.

Laurie Jo Scales took the SAWBA local tournament title and edged **Carol Smith** for fourth even though there was two pins difference in final average. Both are tremendous team competitors but also excel in single events.

All of us agreed that we would put our "top fives" against any team - anywhere - and we would be proven right!

Beverly Hallowich moved into sixth for the women even though she suffered a slump late in the season and during the past summer league play, but definitely one of the top women.

Forever young and forever tough, **Myrt DeFily** with four league averages in the high 180s, and owner of a new TWBA Hall of Fame watch for previous accomplishments, smiled herself right into seventh, followed by **Jaye Jean Smith** who had a tremendous bowling year. Jaye Jean had a high 185 average and a composite 180.5, and performed well in all tournaments.

Bettie Jo Geisler and **Kathy Kirst** were nip and tuck in the average department, but Bettie Jo gained the edge by team performance at the State Tournament in Corpus Christi.

Anna Lee Kass and **Annie Webb** unbelievably consistent and always somewhere near the top in prize payoffs. Excellent choices for the Top 20!

The elite last five were the most difficult to choose **Ronnie Hulme**, **John Alvarado**, **John Glende**, **Harry Fletcher** and **Chris Goodwyn** were selected because they're afraid of no man. When you check prize lists you can always find their names and they're super in all centers, whatever the condition may be, and each had good track records throughout the year.

It was even more difficult to select the last five for the gals. None of us have seen **Marilyn Schaefer** bowl, but a 189 average in a Military based league grabbed all of us. **Dollie Hoskins**, winner of the Broyles Secretary's Tournament and a veteran "toughie" on the southside continues to perform unbelievably well. **Carol Lilly** was our unknown quantity, but she came up with a 181 high average which can't be ignored. Then it was **Linda Fox** who didn't perform as well as past years, but was there in LATAs and leagues. **Pam Morrow** might be considered our "rookie of the year" since this was her first appearance on the elite list, but her league performance earned her the spot.

Now---none of us will mind if you dispute our findings, touting your favorite, but after 3 hours of discussion, we three agree these are San Antonio's Top Twenty. If you're "favorite" wasn't among those chosen, how about paying their entry into the Men's and Women's Top Twenty to be held on November 2 (for the women) and November 15 (for the men) at Bowlerama Lanes and prove to us we're wrong. We don't think we are.

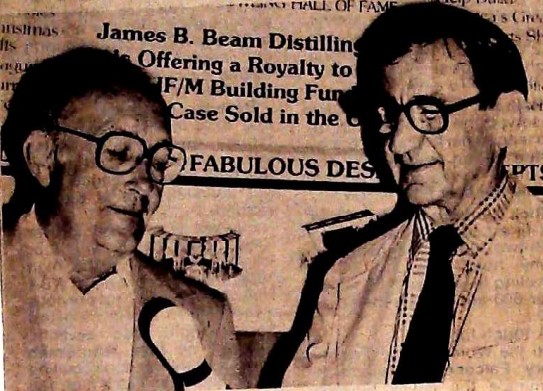

Vito Is '80 Bowler Of The Year

Mary Wins 7th Superior Performance Award

If you ask anyone in town "Who are the two top bowlers in town," they'll in all probability answer you "Joe and Mary" — and that's what the criterias for the two local associations also show.

Announcements came this weekend from the San Antonio Men's and Women's Bowling Associations reflect that the SABA Bowler of the Year is Joe Vito Buentostro and the SAWBA Superior Performance winner is again is Mary Falconer.

Joe's year was absolutely sensational and he won all major scratch tournaments stage in the city, then turned in superb performances at the ABC tournament in Louisville and had more than his share of side tournament honors.

Mary again dominated the local women's scene winning the Local Association all events title, broke a local record in doubles with Donna Wallace, was named Texas Woman



Bowler of the Year and was unbelievable in league play.

For Joe Bowler of the Year honors are nothing new. He was also the 1975-76 Bowler of the Year. But during the 1979-80 season he also won the first San Pedro Bowler of the Year tournament averaging 228.7 for 20 games; won the City Match Doubles with Carlos Castaneda in a come-from-behind victory over Jimmie Rivera and Mario Valdez, and in October he downed a tough field of the area's top shooters with a 2368 total (229.2 average). Just before the season opened he became the City Match Game Singles champ in July averaging 234.5 for his 12 games. He also won one 20-game Marathon in Austin.

Then it was Louisville-ABC time and Vito made national headlines leading the Sports Palace team to third place in the regular team event with 3090. He became the heir to the throne in the ABC individual

earnings list with \$4,769.

Vito posted a 664 in singles for \$119, and he was fourth in all events (with 2025) to earn \$1,700. Joe and Carlos were also third in doubles with 1358 (scratch) to win \$1550 each. Joe's showing in ABC now qualifies him for the 1981 U.S. Team Trials in Milwaukee in June.

While he was in the Louisville area, Joe also rolled in the Bowlers Journal side tournament finishing third, and he was a member of the third place team in Texas State Bowling Association state tournament.

To acquire her seventh Superior Performance award Mary rolled in six leagues (4 at Oak Hills, 1 at Wonder Bowl, and was a member of an all women's team in an all-men's league) compiling a composite average of 191.32. Her averages were 198, 195, 192, 191, 187 and 183. She was a member of two championship league teams and had a high game of 279.

Mary had 59 countable 600 series during the year with four 700-plus series (739, 711, 715 and 705). She had 13 series over 650 plus the four 700's.

She led her Monarch Trophy Studio team to victory in the Local Tournament placed third in handicap Singles; teamed with Donna to break the doubles record and one of the teams on which she bowled was fifth in handicap also. She had the Local tournament high game of 274.

In the City Mixed of 1979 she and husband, Kenneth, were first in doubles, then she teamed with Joe Valfre to place third in the same tourney at Ponderosa. The Monarch team also placed in the top ten in the Corpus Christi TWBA Championships.

Mary's Texas performances were recognized by the Texas 20-Year Club when she was named Texas bowler of the Year at the TWBA annual meeting, in May, and Joe's greatest day of the year came on Saturday, July 20th when he took beautiful Tammi Canady as his bride.

"Bluebonnet Queens entries are available now" said Sylvia Broyles, Queens Tournament Chairman for TWBA to the delegates attending the SAWBA Open Meeting Sunday at Hermann Sons.

"This year the prestigious tournament will be right in our back (or front) yard, depending on which way your facing," said Sylvia.

Highland Bowling Lanes in Austin (8909 Brunet Road) will be our hosts and the tournament will be March 7 and 8. The Tournament is open to all Texas WBA members but entries close February 1.

The Texas Bluebonnet Queens tournament is an individual competition championship tournament based on total based on total pinfall and is conducted on a scratch basis by the State organization.

Qualifying for the Queens is eight games across sixteen lanes to be bowled in two 4-game blocks on Saturday. The entire field will be divided into two squads - A and B and the field is cut to the top 36 high qualifiers prior to the Saturday evening semi-final round. After the semis the field will be cut again to the top 14 who will roll 13 games of head to head match play, using the 14 team regular team schedule with a final one game (position round) match.

Qualifying squads will be at 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. for Squad A and at 12:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. for Squad B. The semi-final round begins at 8 p.m. Saturday evening and the Finals are at 10 a.m. on Sunday, March 8.

All finalists will receive a 30 pin bonus for each game won and the bonus is to be added to her total score. If a match ends in a tie, each contestant will receive 15 pinfall count. Pairing for the initial round of matches will be according to qualifying position and all carryover of pinfall from qualifying will be dropped and finalists begin at zero.

The 1981 Texas Bluebonnet Queen will receive a paid entry into next year's Queens, as did defending champion Gloria Alderman, the 1980 Queen who won her title at Tyler. In addition she receives the jeweled Queens lapel pin, \$525

**A Word on Love...And Roses...
And The '81 TWBA Tournament...**

The world's favorite flower - the rose - will be used by the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association 44th annual Championship Tournament which will open here on March 20 next year.

Local entry deadline is December 20 - just five days before Christmas - but state entries will be accepted until January 19. Team event will be held at Sports Palace and singles and doubles will be rolled at Wonder Bowl, each weekend from March 20 until July 12, with the exception of April 25-26.

Each year thousands of tourists stream into parks across the nation to enjoy the beauty of rose gardens and SAWBA is attempting to sign up just 750 five women teams to enter the Championships - or approximately one quarter of our membership...but in their hearts, the Board wants each and every member to take advantage of having the state tournament in our city.

Sixteen languages around the world have a word for "rose" in them. According to old Greek legends, roses first sprang from the hears of Venus - the Goddess of Love. This myth has had a lasting effect for most of us think of the rose and love as having a strong relationship.

It is with love that SAWBA plans to be hostess to the State's women bowlers and are attempting to makes the 1981 event the greatest ever for TWBA.

Everywhere you look in ancient history you can find roses. They were in the famous hanging gardens of Babylon.

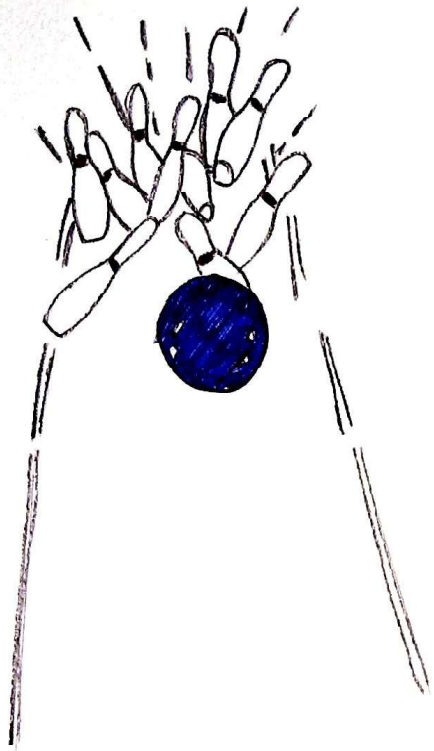
was a fight for supremacy between the House of York and the House of Lancaster. One side used red roses as their emblem while the other used white roses.

HALL OF FAME DESIGN APPROVED

The grand opening of the National Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum has been set for late spring, 1982. It was announced today by Milt Rudo, president of the Hall. He said ground is to be broken on the site in downtown St. Louis this fall, with full scale construction to be under way early in 1981.

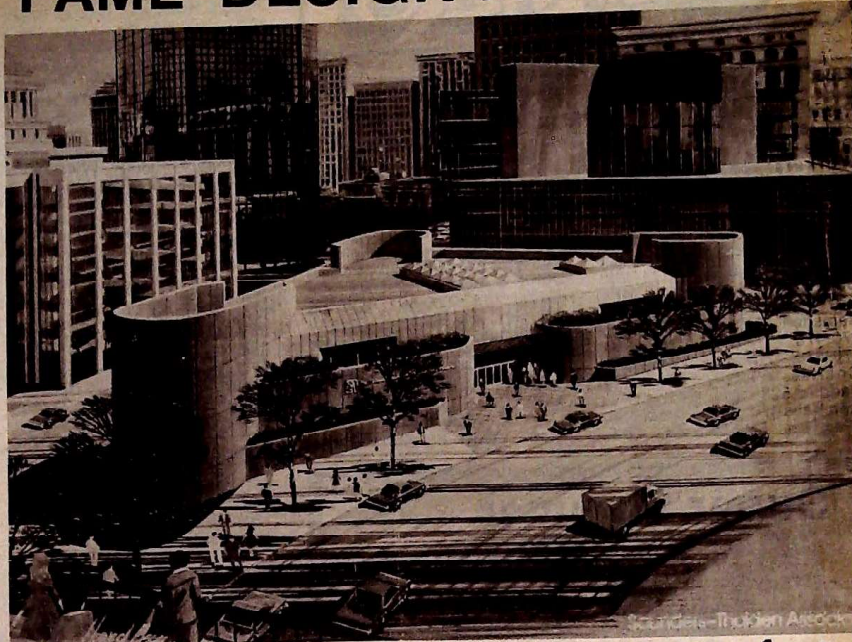
The 50,000 square foot structure will cost approximately \$6.2 million exclusive of the land, valued at \$1 million, which has been donated to the Hall by First National Bank, Equitable Life Assurance Society and IBM Corp., subject to their approval of the final plans. The three companies are partners in developing a huge office complex across from the Hall.

More than half the necessary funds still are to be raised, according to Rudo, who is a group vice president of the Brunswick Corp., Skokie, Ill. He said plans for a corporate fund drive are under way and that a major bowling promotion this winter is expected to be a strong stimulant to the campaign.

The corporate drive is under the direction of Lowell E. Rothchild, Tucson, a member of the NBHF/M Board and past president of the American Bowling Congress.

The architectural and exhibit design plans were approved by the NBHF/M Board at its annual meeting in St. Louis. A guest at the presentation was Mayor James Conway, an ardent supporter of the program since he led his city's successful bid for the Hall 15 months ago. The Mayor said he was "thrilled" by the design proposals and reiterated his opinion that the Hall of Fame will be an outstanding addition to the cultural and tourist scenes in St. Louis.

The building, designed by

Saunders-Thalden & Associates, Inc., St. Louis, will have three levels, two above ground. The entrance will be off an atrium walkway through which passersby can stroll. In addition to a series of dazzling displays and exhibits, the building will

include a gift shop and small cafe.

Designer Alex Cranstoun of the New York firm of DeMartin, Marona, Cranstoun, Downs, has developed a look-touch-feel concept that includes re-creation of an oldtime bowling

alley and a large screen theater, both in the lower level. The great variety of displays will include large areas devoted to the halls of fame of the Women's International Bowling Congress and American Bowling Congress.

The National Bowling Hall of Fame will be located on a 24,000 square foot triangular plot across from the entrance to Busch stadium and a few blocks from the Arch, whose 3 million annual visitors make it the third most popular manmade attraction in the world after Lenin's tomb and the Eiffel tower.

Construction bids are expected to be let this fall. Development of the project is under the direction of Albert R. Matzelle, executive director of the Hall. Curator Bruce Pluckhahn is working with exhibit designer Cranstoun.

All American Team Named

For the second time since *The Woman Bowler* magazine, WIBC's official publication, began honoring an All-American team, two members of that team shared top honors and the mythical title of team captain.

Both Donna Adamek, Duarte, Calif., and Pat Costello, Union City, Calif., led the 1979-80 honor group with 406 points --- 135 first team votes and one second team vote each. First team votes rated three points and second team votes one point in the calculation.

Last time around the honor was also shared. However, in that 1978-79 voting Adamek tied with Betty Morris, Stockton, Calif. This time, Morris was second in point totals with 403-133 first team and four second team votes.

Cheryl Robinson, Van Nuys, Calif., and Nikki Gianulias, Vallejo, Calif., rounded out the all-California fivesome. Robinson received 1218 first team voters and six seconds for 390 points, while Gianulias garnered 91 firsts and 41 seconds for 314 points.

The group, composed of all righthanders, was chosen for All-American Team honors by members of the Bowling Writers Assn. of America and professional members of the National Women Bowling Writers. It should be noted that only the results and winnings from WIBC sanctioned events were listed on fact sheets submitted to the writers. A total of 136 ballots were turned in.

Donna, who made her third consecutive appearance on the All-American Team, won the Avon-WIBC Queens tournament and a WPBA tournament.

She placed 3rd, 7th and 14th in other major events, and was a member of the second place Open Division team at the 1980 WIBC championship tournament. Her earnings in sanctioned events totaled \$19,345.

"California Pat", who made her fifth appearance with the honor group, won the BPAA, U.S. Women's Open and took second place in team at the WIBC. In other competition, she finished 3rd, 4th, 6th and 9th to earn \$15,090 in sanctioned events.

Betty, the only woman to have been named to all seven of the magazine's All-American Teams, earned \$8,350 in sanctioned events. She won one WPBA tourney and finished 7th and 8th in other events. At the WIBC tournament she won the Singles crown, rolled into 3rd in doubles and placed 4th in team and 5th in All Events.

Making her second appearance on the All-American Team, Cheryl won the WIBC all events championship, finished 3rd in doubles and 4th in team. She was the runnerup at the Queens and was 9th, 12th and 17th in other tournaments. Her winnings in sanctioned competition total \$9,635.

Nikki, who has been bowling professionally for less than two years, earned her first selection to the honor group. She finished 7th at the Queens and 4th in WIBC all events. In other tournaments she was 4th twice, 8th and 10th. Her earnings in sanctioned events totaled \$8,855.

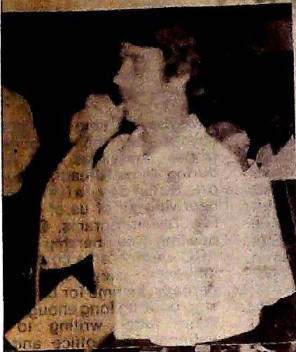

Membership in the Golden 55 Club has grown from 115 on August 26th last year to 1232 members in August of 1980 - and Rocky says, "It's still growing!"

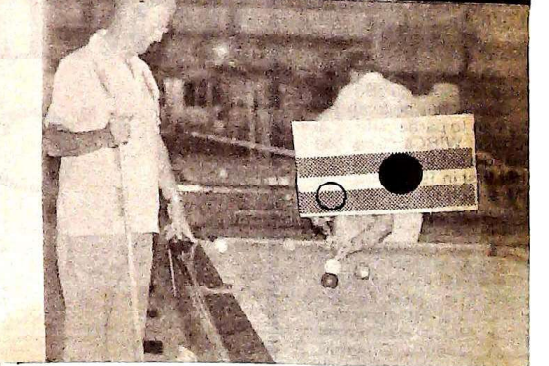

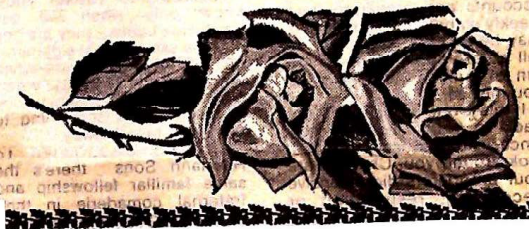

Handicap is set at 75% of 200 and ladies use current averages or yearbook averages, whichever is higher. The fifth annual Awards Dinner ceremonies will be conducted by TWBA President Fay Browning (Garland) and Lil Poole (Hurst) TWBA secretary and tournament director. Cocktails will be at 6 p.m. for the champions with dinner at 7 p.m.

Marietta Jarvis, Corpus Christi, took top laurels in Class A singles, while Roylene McBee McAllen, won Class C Della Shumate, Corpus Christi, and Anita Hennessee, Coastal Bend and Cindy Mullikin, Corpus look D and Novice honors.

Class B all events champion is Emma Lee Wilson, Kingsville; Elaine Curry, Denton, Class C; Phyllis Huckaby, Longview, Class E Susan Glizman, Montgomery County and Michelle Henson, Waço, in Novice.

Silver bowl awards will be

given to Kathy LeCroy, Fort Worth, for the tournament high game of 267, and Donna Dillon, Fort Worth, will also receive a silver bowl for her 660 high individual tournament series.

The Billy Simon Trophy Award for high game by a senior (those over 55 years of age) will be awarded to Marietta Jarvis of Corpus for her 255 game.

After the 2512 five-women teams, 6267 sets of doubles and 12,735 singles entrants completed their play on Fourth of July weekend, \$136,085.82 in prize money was distributed to contestants!

By now you know that the TWBA Championships will be in San Antonio beginning next March 20 (running until July 12) at Wonder Bowl (singles and doubles) and at S. A. Sports Palace (team event). Local entry deadline is December 20, with deadline for state bowlers set as January 19, 1981.

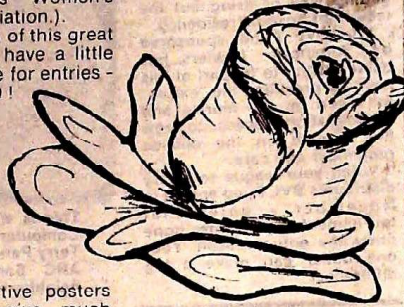

Posters will be updated with the center entries and with a total entries figure as our entries mount.

SAWBA realizes that ladies from two or more centers may make up a team, however, it is the decision of the Team Captain as to which poster will carry that team's rose!

League secretaries will be valuable members of the League Visitation Committee and the Committee will welcome any assistance. If at all possible, entries should be typed (but a Committee member will do this if needed). Entrants may enter each event only once. If doubles are entered, singles must be entered also.

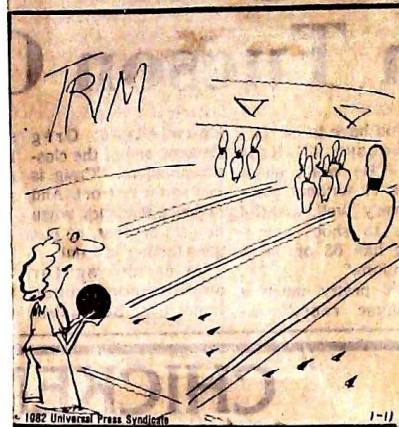

Committee Tour Shows BVL \$\$\$\$ At Work

On September 17 the BVL Fund Committee of the two local associations visited the Audie Murphy Memorial VA Hospital to see how BVL Fund dollars are put to use. Joe Zupko, chief of volunteer services, Kenneth Sanchez, chief recreation director, and Larry Peterson, chief recreational therapist, were tour directors.

Making the tour were SAWBA representatives Tip Pfeiffer, Donna O'Connor, Glenda Recker, 1980 BVL chairman, Gloria Riggs, Joye Duncan and Sandie Lacy. From SABA came chairman S. L. "Red" Donathan, Joe Lacy and Charles Altman, who also serves as a volunteer at the hospital.

The tour guests learned that this is the 50th anniversary of veterans hospitals and that there are only 173 hospitals to care for over 30 million veterans in this country.

Dr. Jose R. Coronado, chief administrator and hospital director, told the tour guests that the Audie Murphy Memorial facility has 700 beds - and to date has 610 patients.

Patient services and facilities were shown to the

tour group. They included the library, absolutely complete with medical literature as well as general. Part of the facilities houses the dental clinic, with all the latest equipment with lots

of dentists both on staff and as volunteers. A photography lab with nuclear equipment to pinpoint even the smallest details before surgery. Several Chapels were scattered throughout the hospital so that everyone could attend easily. Most impressive was the theatre that will seat 200 people, and the projectors are run mostly by volunteers and students.

They also saw the arts and crafts shop, ceramic, leather goods, woodworking and carpentry shops, machine shops, a gym complete with exercise bikes, basketball equipment, punching and speed bags and a universal gym unit consists of many gadgets for exercise and therapy.

Each of these units needs many thousands of dollars

to operate, whether by trained professionals or caring volunteers.

Additionally BVL dollars help provide television sets, pool tables, special type cue sticks, special made bowling balls and pins and ball-pushers for the wheel chair patients to use. Book, puzzles and games...and the list is unlimited.

550 patients per day are seen by doctors and at least 800 daily are processed. A new 184 bed neuro-physiatric care clinic opened recently opened downtown with two units especially for Vietnam veterans. The VA has proposed a 120 bed geriatric clinic to be built on a site near the new post office.

SAWBA Directors Learns Lane Dressing Procedures

Eight members of the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association Board of Directors attended a Lane Dressing and Inspection clinic held by San Antonio Bowling Association secretary Rusty Pope last Sunday at Bowlerama lanes.

The idea of local women's association members sharing the burden of lane inspections after awards scores have been rolled and pre-inspections was proposed this past year at the WIBC convention and delegates were encouraged to work with the local association on this vital portion of the positions.

The eight SAWBA Board members - Nell Recroft, Merion Valentine, Clara Grimes, Jeanette Wahl, Joye Duncan, Irene Wigginton, Donna O'Connor and Ella O'Quinn. They were joined by SABA president Ed Crabb of SABA, directors Joe Lacy and Eddie Jimenez, Sandie Lacy, Rollin Recroft, Laurie Jo Scales and Donna Wallace.

Pope reviewed the ABC rules which reflect that it is the local board members responsibility to enforce all ABC and WIBC rules, he reviewed the ABC rule

which calls for gutter to gutter dressing for a center to retain its ABC Certification, and the authority of the local secretary or his representative to inspect lanes.

He reviewed the courtesy to be shown by ABC and WIBC inspectors to center management when checking lanes. The ABC Lane Dressing Inspection Reports which must be completed after an award score is rolled was reviewed by each student. Pope then stated there were three tests which must be made on each inspection: Visual, Smear and Tactile.

The students then spent a great deal of time on the lanes which had been set up specially by Bobby Scales, All Star Manager, to show the students various approved lanes dressing and those not approved.

Pope reminded the students to advise league secretaries that it is their responsibility to report high scores to the Association office as quickly as possible.

The students learned a new language with definitions of such things as "Flat Gutters", feathered dressing, the point,

the break zone, blend, etc. After the initial inspection of the lanes, students were taught the function and operation of the often-controversial lane analyzer, which is not endorsed or approved by ABC, but the findings of which are accepted after award scores are rolled.

Pope praised those who attended the school, saying "Proper lane inspection can't be learned in one day, and we will be having another advance school shortly after the SABA City Tournament.

"I feel," added Pope, "that this group of women took a giant step toward better servicing their members. They are welcome anytime a high score is rolled to join the SABA member making the inspection to learn ever more. There different 'shots' were set up after our school most of them detected the hard block and the legal or approved dressing."

The ladies were unanimous in their appreciation of the school, adding that they were not aware of how much work is involved in approving or disapproving high scores. They complimented Crabb and Pope for allowing the ladies to get involved.

BVL League Score Tourney Set For Nov. 3 - 16

Entry forms for the BVL Tournament will be hitting the leagues and lanes shortly.

The tournament, sponsored by the S. A. Women's and Men's Associations, is a league score event for the purpose of raising money for our hospitalized and blinded veterans. The goal set by the BVL Committee, headed by S. L. "Red" Donathan (SABA) and Glenda Recker (SAWBA) is \$12,000 - and it's a realistic total when you consider that each bowler in our leagues has two opportunities for just one dollar to participate.

The tournament will be conducted from November 3 through November 16.

Bowlers may enter as they bowl their regular leagues, with the score that night or day counting toward the BVL prize fund. An individual may bowl as many times as he or she participates in league, provided the league is sanctioned.

The BVL Committee in conjunction with the Audie Murphy Memorial VA Hospital is offering a special "Mystery Prize" to the

league that supports the BVL League score tournament with the highest dollar percentage participation.

After all donations are collected on Monday, November 17, the league secretary of the winning league will be notified.

The BVL Fund tournament is the "Bowlers Charity" serving hospitalized and blinded veterans. The Fund, administered by the National Bowling Council, provides televisions, subscriptions, books, handcrafts, bowling equipment and trips, and other recreational programs for VA patients around the U.S.

The BVL Tournament is the only tournament inflation has not hit! Entry fee is still just \$1.00, and the event is handicapped 80% from 200 for women and 75% from 200 for men.

Based on 2000 entries across the city, first place is \$75.00, second place \$65, and third \$60, with an additional lengthy prize list. The entry fee of \$1.00 must be paid before the completion of the first game to the league secretary.

Twenty five cents of each

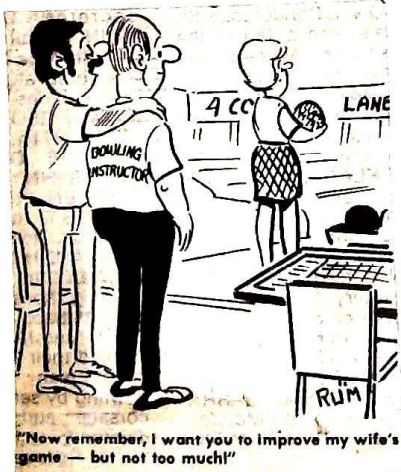
entry goes into the prize fund, five cents is used for expense and 70¢ is donated to the BVL Fund.

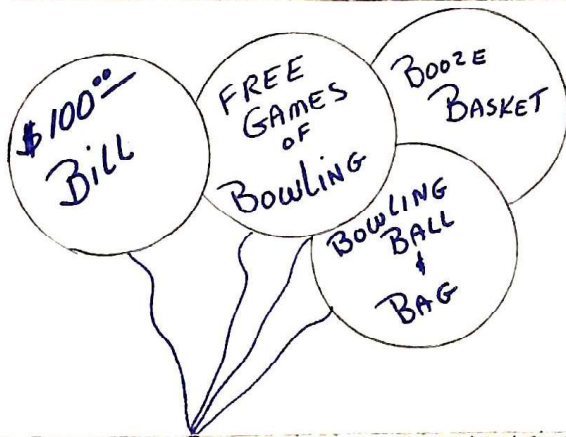

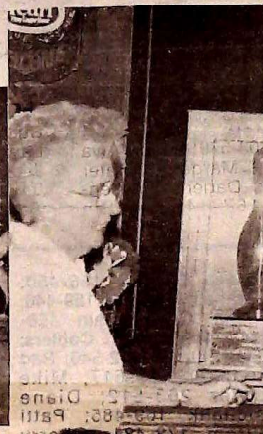

Thousand Oaks Plans Hall Of Fame Tourney

During the week of Sunday, October 26th and Saturday, November 1, Brunswick Thousand Oaks Bowl will be joining other Brunswick centers around the country in conducting a special National Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum tournament.

The tournament costs each bowler just one dollar and the bowler who rolls the most pins over their average in the SFCOND game will receive one-third of the money collected. The remainder of the money will be donated to the National Bowling Hal of Fame and Museum fund.

Two years ago leagues in Brunswick Centers contributed nearly \$15,000 through league score benefit competition. The current NBHF/M tournament is example of the continuing support from Brunswick which earlier contributed \$100,000 to the campaign fund.

Brunswick's president Milt Rudo is also president of the Hall of Fame/Museum. He stated that the grand opening of the Hall/Museum has been set for late spring, 1982. Ground breaking ceremonies are to be held at the site in downtown St. Louis this fall, with full scale construction to be underway in 1981.

The 50,000 square foot structure will cost approximately \$6.2 million exclusive of the land, valued at \$1 million, which has been donated to the Hall by First National Bank, Equitable Life Assur. Society and IBM Corp., subject to their approval of the finals plans. The three companies are partners in developing a huge office complex across from the Hall.

The architectural and exhibit design plans were approved by the NBHF/M Board at its annual meeting

in St. Louis. A guest at the presentation ws Mayor James Conway, an ardent supporter of the program since he led his city's successful bid for the Hall 15 months ago. The Mayor said he was "thrilled" by the design proposals and reiterated his opinion that the Hall of Fame will be an outstanding addition to the cultural and tourist scenes in St. Louis.

The building, designed by Saunders-Thalden & Assoc. of St. Louis, will have three levels, two above ground. The entrance will be off an atrium walkway through which passersby can stroll. In addition to a series of dazzling displays and exhibits, the building will include a gift shop and small cafe.

Designer Alex Cranstoun of the New York firm of deMartin, Marona, Cranstoun, Downes, has developed a look-touch-feel concept that includes re-creation of an oldtime bowling alley and a large screen theatre, both in the lower level. The great variety of displays will include large areas devoted to the halls of fame of the WIBC and ABC.

The National Bowling Hall of Fame will be located on a 24,000 square foot triangular plot across from the entrance to Busch stadium and a few blocks from the Arch, who 3 million annual visitors make it the third most popular manmade attraction in the world after Lenin's tomb and the Eiffel tower.

Construction bids are expected to be let this fall. Development of the project is under the direction of Albert R. Matzelle, executive director of the Hall. Curator Bruce Pluckhahn is working with exhibit designer Cranstoun.

At Bowlerama:

It's time for the Women's Top Twenty - an invitational tournament open to all Texas women bowlers who like scratch competition. Bowlerama Lanes will be host for the ten games of competition across 20 lanes, and tournament director Bobby Scales says that even though women have until 9:30 Sunday morning to enter, entries have been received from several different Texas cities.

At stake is a guaranteed \$400 first place prize, and several of Scales' aides have acquired door prizes which will be drawn for during the one hour break after the fifth game.

The tournament is limited to the first 80 entries and bowlers are requested to report at 10 a.m. to draw for starting lanes.

Additional prize money is added to the Women's Top Twenty Invitational and to the Men's Top Twenty Invitational which will be rolled November 16 at 10:30 a.m. The men's event carries a \$700 guaranteed first place prize fund.

Named to the Women's Top Twenty by the press (Harry Page, Johnny Campos and Ella O'Quinn) were Mary Falcoher, Donna Wallace, Liz Smith, Laurie Jo Scales, Carol Smith, Beverly Hallowich, Myrt

DeFily, Jaye Jean Smith, Bettie Jo Geisler and Debbie Lauzon in the top ten.

Also named were Kathy Kirst, Gayle Goodwyn, Jerry Johnson, Debbie Kirst, Anna Lee Kass, Annie Webb, Marilyn Schaefer, Dollie Hoskins, Carol Lilly and Linda Fox.

Entry forms are at all lanes and it's not too late to enter. Entry fee is just \$30 with \$20 going into the prize fund. The payoff will be at a one-four ratio and in addition to the first place \$400 money there is a gorgeous trophy provided.

Prize" with the highest dollar percentage per capita.

League secretaries are urged to distribute the entry forms. Bowlers are urged to help the secretaries by having their one dollar ready. The entry fee must be paid before the end of the first game. The bowlers return the forms to the secretary immediately after bowling to receive their handicap.

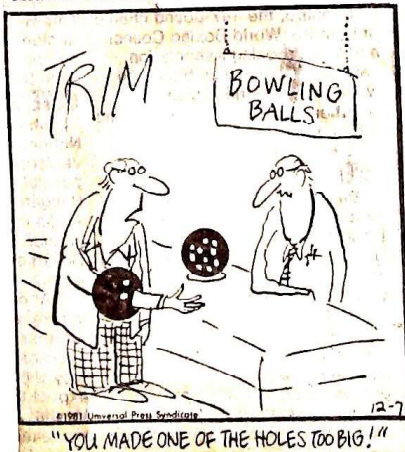

Bowlers in wheelchairs can enjoy the tenpin game as much as those with both feet on the ground. They may need help retrieving the ball from the ball return to keep their chair from rolling all around the approach, but the enjoyment of the game is no different.

Pat Parchman, a patient at Audie Murphy Memorial VA Hospital, proved that to the crowd invited to participate in the Kick Off of the BVL Fund League Score Tournament staged by the San Antonio Men's and Women's Bowling Associations this week and next week.

Pat found many friends among the special guests at the Kick Off when it was learned that he is the brother of former San Antonio bowler Carole Parchman, who married Bill Poff several years ago.

A native San Antonian and a former Robert E Lee High School student, Pat was wounded in Viet Nam.

His spinal column was severed causing complete paralysis of both legs. But Pat has seen BVL dollars at work at Audie Murphy Hospital, and with the aid of much rehabilitative equipment, plans to 'go home' before Thanksgiving.

Although wheelchair-bound, Pat rolled the opening ball of the Kick Off receiving a nine count on his first ball. He's a gutsy veteran who bowled as a teenager, and was quick to admit that bowling is excellent therapy.

"I've come a long way with a lot of help out there (Audie Murphy Hospital). I try to walk with my crutches as much as possible, but sometimes if I get tired I just lean against a wall - because I will get out of this (pointing to his wheelchair).

And I WILL be home for Thanksgiving when Carole and Bill and all the family come home."

Pat received a warm welcome from the bowling officials assembled for the Kick Off. Joining them were City Councilwoman Helen Dutmer, State Representative Al Brown, representatives from four military bases, veterans groups and numerous officials and therapists from Audie Murphy.

Co-chairmen of the BVL Fund drive Glenda Recker, SAWBA, and Red Donathan, SABA, turned emcee chores to committee members Charles Altman and Joye Duncan, who introduced SAWBA and SABA board members.

Colonel Alvin Hall, Base Commander of Fort Sam Houston, was the official host who introduced representatives from Lackland, Kelly and Randolph.

He told the visitors, "The BVL Fund is the only national charity specifically devoted to providing the many 'extras' so essential to the morale and psychological rehabilitation of veterans in VA Hospitals. We are grateful to the bowlers of San Antonio for their many efforts, through your annual tournament and other ways, to help provide those 'extras'. I wish you good luck during the tournament. It's a wonderful and generous effort by all of you."

"You hang in there. We do care and all of us are willing to do whatever is necessary to work with you," she said.

Parchman was obviously moved by her words and later proudly told the Kegler that Bill Poff, since leaving San Antonio had an extended town in Guam. Bill's had eleven sanctioned 300 games. The Poffs are now living in Grand Forks, No. Dakota, and will be visiting with friends during the Thanksgiving Holidays.

Glenda Recker and S.L. Donathan, the two association BVL chairmen, have worked many weeks for a successful BVL League Score Tournament.

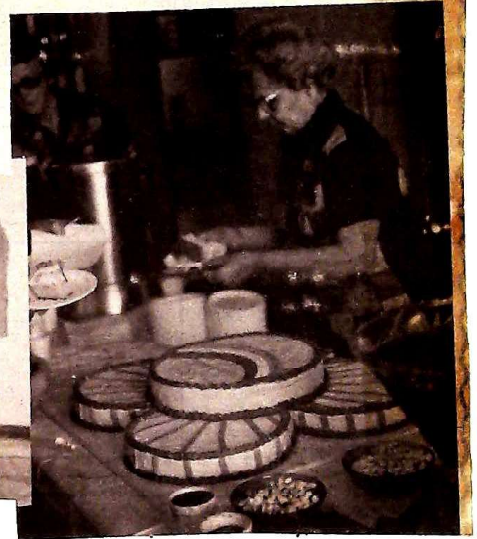
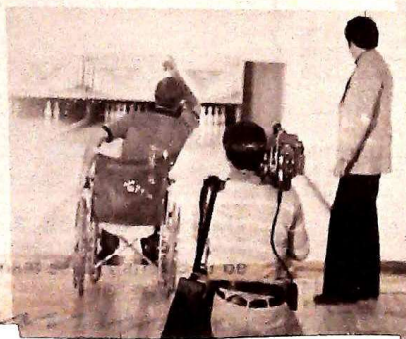
Did you pay your one dollar entry fee last week. If not, read again Pat Parchman's state-

GLORIA ALDERMAN WINS TOP 20

The stunning redhead from Fort Worth - Gloria Alderman - who is the reigning Texas Bluebonnet Queen - proved once again she can wear almost any bowling crown available.

She cruised the Bowlerama 10-game course at a 223.8 clip and in addition to the \$400 first place prize, earned \$63 by winning three high game pots which the competitors funded.

Gloria's first five games were 195, 210, 226, 179 and 268. After the break she returned and shot games of 212, 248, 195, 258 and 246.

Gloria was 160 pins ahead of her nearest rival in the Open Invitational to challenge San Antonio's Top Twenty women. And her nearest rival was another Queen - the only two-time winner of the prestigious tournament conducted by Texas Women's Bowling Association - Donna Dillon, Irving, who swatted the pins at a 207.8 clip.

Laurie Jo Scales was just two pins behind Dillon with a 2076 after the ten games, as she went under the par-200 score just three times during the 10 games. Laurie Jo opened with super-665 series and stayed in the plus column throughout the tournament. She closed out with a 624.

Donna Wallace, after a slow 908 five game opening block, turned on the steam after the break with games of 256, 269, 202, 201 and 230 for a five game block of 1158, to move into fourth behind Laurie Jo with 2066.

Kathy LeCroy, who throws one of the strongest balls in the state among the women, was fifth with 2064. Kathy's 8th game of 167 almost put a lid on her bid for the title, but she came back in the 9th and 10th with 215 and 200 even. Kathy is one of two women in Texas who had two 300 games last season.

Right behind the top five were Liz Smith (2041) and Mary Falconer (2001) whose second and last games were her undoing. Liz's opening 168 was her low, and she escalated with a consistent performance with games ranging from 241 to 201. Mary's high was a 230.

Joy Latimer, Fort Worth, started the action early Sunday morning with a whopping 245 game to win the first side pot, but hit four games in the low

170s and mid 180's before putting things back together in her final two which were 211 and 205. She finished the course with 1960.

Houstonite Dixie Broadwell and Debbie Lauzon were neck and neck for the 9th and 10th spots, but with a closing 200 even game Dixie outdistanced Debbie 1942-1932.

Another 'lefty', Jackie Heintz, from Killeen, tied for the top of the bottom half of the Top Twenty aided by a Dutch 200 game in her 7th. She tied Myrt DeFily for 11th with each gal swatting 1902.

Carol Clark of Fort Worth, who had to be 'talked into bowling the tournament' proved she is ready for the higher average bowlers as she averaged 189 even for the ten game course.

Beverly Hallowich was just four pins ahead of Trinity University's Susan Farrell with 1876, aided by a 232 game in the 8th game. Susan made her mark on the local scene with a third game of 243, then stayed consistent in the high 180's and low 190's before dropping to 167 in her final game. Her total was 1872.

Gloria Alderman was the big winner in the optional side pot, which the competitors established, each paying in \$5 (\$210). Gloria had a 268 in the fifth game; 258 in the ninth and 246 in the tenth to earn \$64.

Donna Wallace was the only dual winner with 256 (6th game) and 269 (7th game). Other winners and their scores were Joy Latimer 245, Eileen Sherman, Houston 232, Susan Farrell 243, Liz Smith 241, and Gerry Brock 239.

Overall there were 50 entries (31 local entries) in the tournament conducted by Bobby Scales, manager of All Star Lanes. Between the five game blocks tournament friends provided a tasty repast for all the bowlers and

scorekeepers.

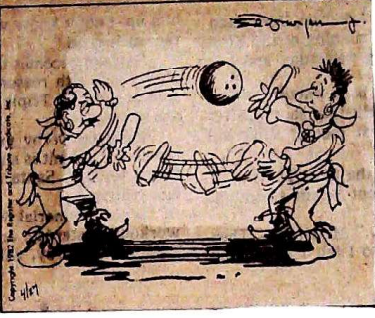

If ever there was a designated night to break an ABC record last Friday at Oak Hills didn't seem to be it for the Lou Barbour Insurance team of Nicky Reid, Judy Enderlin, Jim Albers, Laurie Jo Scales and Joe Vito Buenrostro. But before the night was over the talented quintet with their scratch 3412 series, toppled the five-player Mixed Team Series score which has been in the ABC Record Book since 1971.

Captain Scales had already called on the talents of 6th member Nicky Reid as a substitute for regular member Jake Granato, who had a social engagement.

Leading the league by just one game, the Barbour Insurance team faced a tough match with Bowling & Billiards Supply.

After most of the five minutes 'practice' time had expired, Judy, who had been involved in a minor auto accident just the week before, and Joe Vito rushed in - with just enough time to roll one practice ball each.

Hardly the recipe for a record-setting night - and for the superstitious, they were to start on Lane 13.

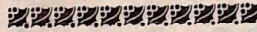

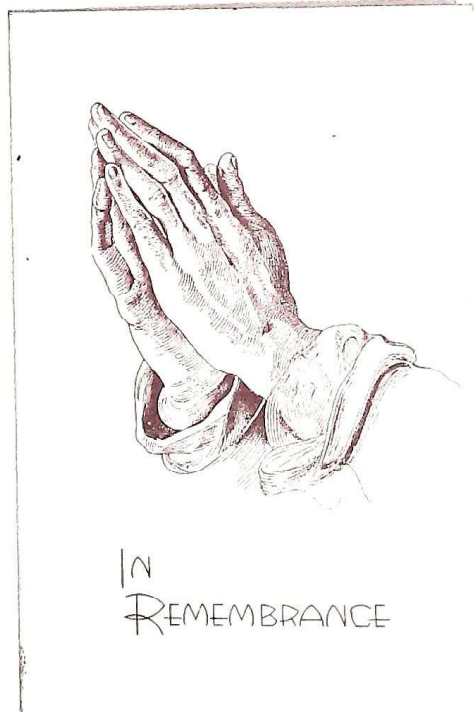

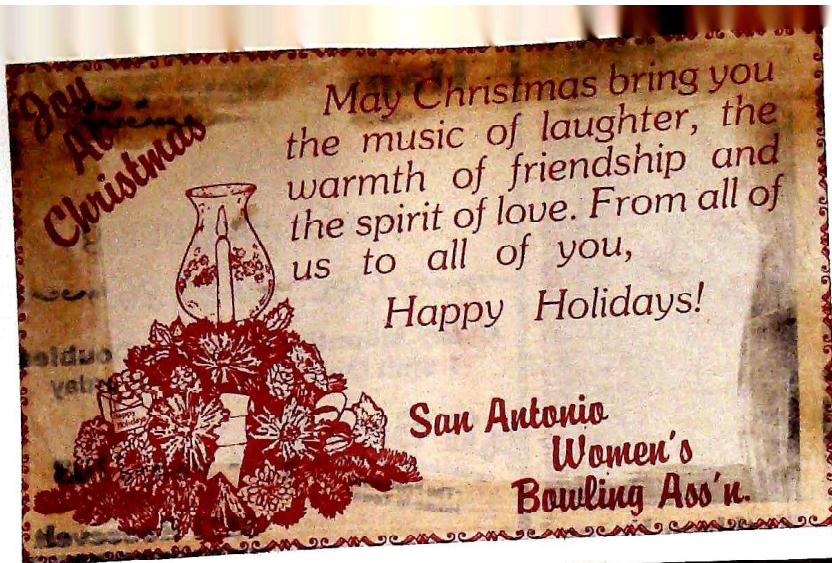

Record '81 Tourney Looms

"Entries are 317 ahead of this same time last year", and "we've already set one record," were the optimistic words from TWBA secretary and tournament director Lil Poole, and local coordinator Sylvia Broyles Monday night.

"From all indications you will have a record tournament," said Poole, and Broyles added, "With our 29 senior teams already entered, we set a new record, and for the first time in TWBA history we will be having TWO full squads of seniors opening weekend."

With the happy outlook for the New Year, 1981 TWBA Championship Tournament Committee Chairmen gave Poole and unofficial look at the work already completed, and plans for staging the largest sports event for women in the State of Texas.

Poole who was on an "official visit" ("Just to see Sylvia's new grandson," she said) added, "The great influx of early entries leads me to believe that your city will be hosting TWBA's largest

tournament. Last year just two days prior to the entry deadline, we had only 1372 entries in our office and the final tally for the Corpus Christi tournament was 2512 teams."

"With the 284 teams you have already signed up and those already in the TWBA office which are totalling in the 1500s, I feel you will be breaking the record," said Poole.

San Antonio WBA holds the record for Most Teams By A Hostess City set in 1973 when the tournament was last in the Alamo City (432 teams). The record tournament was in Austin in 1979 when 2558 teams were entered in the Championships.

Final deadline for entries isn't until January 19, so the League Visitation Committee will be redoubling its efforts now to break San Antonio's own record.

"There are so many places our members can help," said Sylvia. "We all need to ask for help. We'll be needing ladies to help in the concession stand at both Wonder-Bowl and Sports

Palace. We'll need ladies to help with check in - with publicity - and of course at the side tournaments - the BVL 3-6-9 and Texas 600 Club tournaments at Bowlerama lanes."

"There is so much to be done to have a successful tournament," she added. "Many hands are needed because after all 16 weekends is a long time, so we need to have as many volunteer their time and talent as possible. All they have to do is tell their center SAWBA Director and we'll be happy to make them a part of this great undertaking."

The local women's association broke its own record for entering the most senior teams in the Championships. With the 29 already entered, they surpassed last year's total of 18 to the Corpus Christi event.

Poole advised that the concessions will again have TWBA T-shirts (this year with replicas of the Tower of the Americas) and "proceeds from TWBA membership pins and the funds collected in the canisters attached to the

scorer's tables (for misses in the 5th frame) will be sent to the National Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum in the name of Mrs. Alberta E. Crowe, WBC president who will be retiring this year."

Sylvia also reported that a great deal of assistance has come from the North San Antonio Chamber of Commerce via a letter to their members soliciting funds for team sponsorships. The letter reveals that the TWBA Championships are expected to bring an estimated \$2.4 million to the Alamo City during the 16-weekend run of the tournament.

Committee chairmen will also show spiffy new vests which will be the uniform for all workers at the tournament to be worn with white long-sleeved blouses and slacks. The vests in American beauty rose-red to follow the San Antonio rose theme, are being made by SAWBA treasurer Helen Kalala. On the back of the vests is the new SAWBA

logo, designed by Wayne Shirt Shop.

The rose theme will also be reflected in the flags used by scorekeepers when 175 games of 200 games are rolled.

Sylvia was obviously pleased with the work already completed by the various committees. "Our goal is still obtainable," she said. "We know we set our goal high, but I feel that with all the wonderful women out working now, we'll give TWBA one of the greatest Championships ever! It's up to all those already entered to encourage their friends and league-mates to get their entries in before than January 19th deadline. I hope everyone just keeps on saying, "Are You A San Antonio Rose" right up until the last minute!"

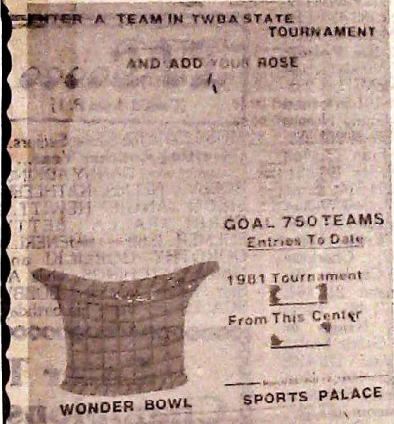

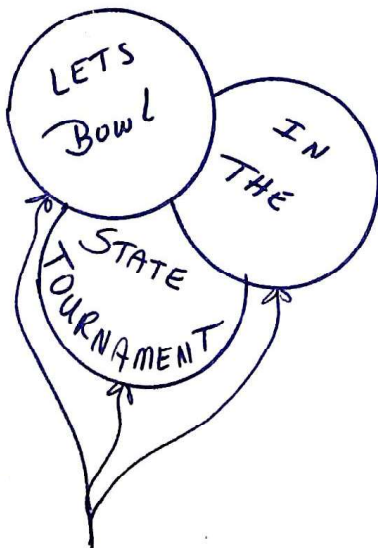

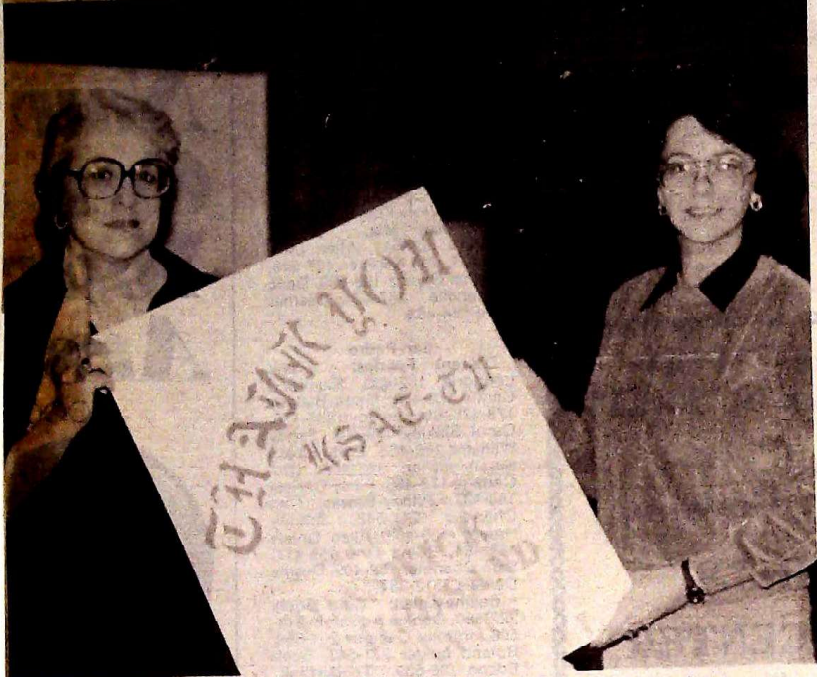
