At Astro Bowl: Senior Mixed Rolls This Weekend!

Senior bowling stars take to Astro Bowl lanes this weekend in the 12th annual Mixed Senior Invitational tournament, with the first squad taking to the lanes at 1 p.m. on Friday.

According to tournament director Neil Recroft of the San Antonio WBA Board, 40 four-member teams, 75 sets of doubles and 150 sets of singles are scheduled, with 136 optional all events entrants.

The energetic seniors will be rolling for \$1010 in prize money

which will be paid out on a 1-10 ratio.

Team events begin at 1 p.m. on Friday and again at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday. Doubles and singles will be rolled at 1 p.m. on Saturday and again at 3 p.m. on Sunday.

The tournament which is sponsored by SAWBA is handicapped 80% from 800 for team, 400 for doubles and from 200 for singles.

The tournament was open to all members of senior citizens

leagues sanctioned by WIBC and ABC. Each entrant must have participated in the leagues for at least nine games prior to the closing day of January 9.

Seniors may bowl in doubles and singles only once and in team more than once, so long as no more than two players did not bowl together more than once.

Volunteer assistance will be welcomed by the members of the Senior Committee throughout the weekend.

Mary's high averages for the past years were: 1975-76, 192; 1976-77, 191; 1977-78, 193; 1978-79, 201 and 1979-80, 198.

Her composite average for the five years is 195.00.

SAWBA Topples Second TWBA Record 517 Local Entries Logged!

The question "Are You A San Antonio Rose" has now been answered and the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association did indeed break its own record of 432 teams entered in a Texas Women's Bowling Association Championship Tournament.

Absolute joy reigned in the SAWBA office Monday as entry Number 433 was processed and president Tip Pfeiffer, secretary Donna O'Connor and local tournament coordinator Sylvia Broyles were joined by several Board members working on the huge pile of completed entries.

The work didn't stop there as League Visitation members and board members continued their efforts until the final deadline of midnight Monday was reached.

The first call out of the busy phone in the office went to TWBA secretary and tournament director Lil Poole in Hurst who is at home with the flu. "I knew you girls would do it, and at this point, even though I haven't been to the office for several days, all indications are that you will be hostess to the largest TWBA Championship Tournament in history."

At presstime Thursday receipted entries totalled 519 teams, but a few more could come in the mail with a Jan. 19 postmark. Doubles and singles not yet counted will probably exceed 1060!

In 1973 when San Antonio was hostess to the state women bowlers they entered 432 women teams, a record which has not been tied or exceeded by any association in the state. Houston WBA holds the record for the most traveling teams to a TWBA Championship, when they sent 302 teams to the Corpus Christi event.

The anticipated record entry may necessitate additional weekends and some Friday night squads for local singles and doubles entrants. It'll be a few weeks in the TWBA office now finding suitable times for all the entrants. Miss Poole will write to each team or singles and doubles entrant if their request for a specific time cannot be met. They will then have approximately seven days to accept the time, so a final slate tally is not expected until early February.

An elated Sylvia Broyles said, "I am so proud! So proud of all those SAWBA Board members, the League Visitation, and all our members who volunteered their time. It took so many people to make this dream come true. I'm thankful that we have so many dedicated workers and cooperative proprietors - it was a mammoth joint venture."

ment in 1973 but was pleased as punch with the record entry of 432 teams then. All during our League Visitation I thought again of 500 teams knowing that if we worked together we could do it! I am just overwhelmed and gratified - and so appreciative of all the truly dedicated work. We'll give the women of the State one of the finest tournaments ever!"

The SAWBA ladies bid for the State Championships and Annual Meeting two years ago when the tournament was in Austin, which was a record-breaker that year featuring 2558 teams. When they received the nod from the TWBA delegates with a "Gong Show" themed skit, they promised "Fiesta Fun in '81" to the lady bowlers of the state.

The "Be A San Antonio Rose" theme was developed in the League Visitation Committee meeting, and chairman Clara Grimes and her Committee attempted to visit every league in the city promoting entries.

Ladies became San Antonio Roses once their completed entry was received in the SAWBA office. Visitation and Board members placed colorful paper roses into baskets on posters in each bowling center.

Opening ceremonies are planned for March 20 at the Sports Palace at 6p m. Opening Squad of the Championships is traditionally reserved for senior-age bowlers across the state.

The SAWBA Senior Committee generated 29 teams of senior ladies and with the heavy influx of senior entries into the state office, the first TWBA record of 1981 was set, when it was learned that there will be two full squads of senior ladies on opening weekend.

Expected at the opening ceremonies will be the TWBA Board of Directors led by president Fay Browning, Pepper Martin of Columbia Industries will act as master of ceremonies for the opening and Councilman John Steen and Sister Elizabeth Ann Sueltenfuss, president of Our Lady of The Lake University are expected to participate. Ceremonial opening balls will be rolled by members of the Bowling Council Hall of Fame members.

Once the opening ceremonies are completed the Championships will continue each weekend, possibly until July 26th, with team event at Sports Palace and singles and doubles at Wonder Bowl.

Turn right at the Ventura New Homes by Ray Ellison sign to FM 78 and turn left to Woodlake.

From the South guests may take 410 to the Kirby exit which will bring you right to the Country Club.

It'll be a gala evening with reunions with many old

bowling friends. List and Bauman are still active on the lanes, but List has been missing on San Antonio lanes for more than a decade.

With Columbia's Johnny Jowdy, no slouch of a bowler himself in the heydays of List and Veil, guests should be treated to many of the bowling fun events and jokes of the 60's as Jowdy traces their illustrious careers.

By just 4 pins the peppy Old Timers team of Erna Trenkelbach, Phyllis Walter, Hubert Johns and Otto Neitzke were declared team champions of one of the largest Senior Citizens tournaments last weekend at Astro Bowl. The event was sponsored by the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association.

Top honors in the doubles class were earned by Alice Daniel and John "Jack" Fleming, and singles honors went to Shirley Kane for the ladies and Douglas Anderson for the men.

With nine game totals of 1867 and 1925 respectively, Shirley Kane and Jesse J. Wilson were declared All Events champions for the 12th annual event.

Dual-winner Kane earned \$30 as ladies singles champ and will receive \$16 plus trophy for her all events. She had series of 431, 429 and 475 (1335 scratch) to earn her crown. Shirley has bowled one year in the senior league at Ponderosa and this was her first senior tournament. She's also entered on the openign squad, reserved for seniors, when the TWBA Championships begin in March.

Jesse, 74, is a retired chef who is a father of four, grandfather of 32 and great-grandfather of eight. Since he doesn't drive an automobile he commutes to his leagues at Oak Hills and Wonder Bowl by bus.

Jesse had series of 561, 497 and 542 for a scratch 1600. He'll earn \$16 for his all events effort.

Alice Daniel, a delightful 64, entered the tournament with a 130 average and slammed in games of 141, 137 and 196 for a scratch 474 series. Jack Fleming, also 64, her doubles partner, added a 145, 201 and 216 for a nifty 562 series. They received 240 pins to add to their scratch 1036 and will earn \$80 for their play. Both bowl in the Fort Sam Houston seniors leagues. Jack has a career high game of 236 with a 640 series. Alice, who's been married 38 years, has bowled for about 35 years and has logged a high game of 223.

Douglas Anderson, an Oak Hills senior league member, slammed in games of 223, 185 and 190 with his entering average of 167, to capture men's singles honors. He'll receive \$40 plus a first place trophy.

The Old Timers team effort was aided by four 200 games from Hubert Johns and Otto Neitzke. Fleming had games of 205 and 202 and Otto had 205 and 206. The members of the team all bowl in a Hermann Sons senior league, and received 355 pins handicap to post a 2069 scratch score. First place prize money is \$100 plus a trophy.

According to tournament director Cal Stahl, Minnie slammed in 513 and Ken swatted a big 624 scratch on their way to 1137 scratch. They received 175 pins handicap to earn their title, and the trophy which goes with the championship.

Minnie is secretary of the Knight Keglers and Lucky Outcasts at Hacienda and Ken is secretary of the Dick Minor league from Hermann Sons.

Parkhurst was a double winner in the tournament as the rules called for cash prizes on each shift for the bowlers rolling the most pins over average for the squad.

Every TWBA Entry Record Falls! 3090 Teams Ready 'For Fiesta Fun'

A record number of five-women teams - 3,090 - have entered the 44th annual Texas Women's Bowling Association championship tournament here in San Antonio. According to TWBA secretary and tournament director Lil Poole, Hurst, the giant entry is 532 teams higher than any previous entry, and that figures could change slightly if a few of the teams decide they cannot accept their shifts on the adjusted schedule.

Originally scheduled to run from March 20 through July 12th, at the Sports Palace and Wonder Bowl, the tournament is now expected to conclude on July 26.

"We have extended the tournament throughout the month of July," said Poole. "Additional squads will be added to the singles and doubles schedule. Starting June 5 there will be 9 p.m. shifts on Friday and starting June 7 there will be a 5:45 p.m. shift on Sunday," Poole added.

The 3,090 figures erases the mark of 2,558 five women teams entered set in 1979 in Austin.

The San Antonio WBA surpassed the hostess city association mark with 519 team entries. The old mark, set by the San Antonio WBA in 1973 was 432.

The tournament will begin on March 20 at Sports Palace with two full squads of senior age

citizens (those 55 years of age and older) and the senior entry is another record-breaker for

the 1981 event. San Antonio will field 29 teams of seniors opening weekend.

There will be no bowling the weekend of April 24-25 so that state leaders and local delegates may attend the WIBC convention and tournament in Baltimore, Maryland.

With the huge entry the prize list will increase considerably. Texas women will be shooting for a record prize fund which should go over the \$160,000 mark. The previous record was last year in Corpus Christi when \$136,085 was paid out.

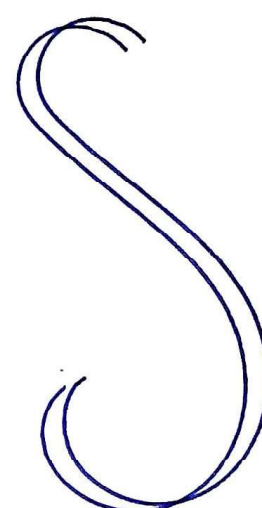
The Houston WBA will improve its record in the TWBA books for the most teams from a single city. The Bayou City is expected to bring 389 teams to San Antonio (one more than was in their local association tournament) bettering its mark of 302 teams sent last year to Corpus Christi.

Approximately 25,000 female keglers are expected to come to San Antonio and local officials estimate that roughly \$3 million dollars will be generated for the city as a result of the TWBA Championship Tournament.

"Many things contribute to this great entry," Poole said. "One reason for the large entry is the geographic location - plus San Antonio is a fun town. Also in the past few years, we have been getting new bowlers, who in turn, sell others...and it keeps growing."

"A lot of credit should go to the hard work of the ladies of SAWBA and all who helped amass the local entry of 519 teams. We're just delighted about everything and since I call San Antonio mys econd

home, I just can't wait to come back."

"When San Antonio bid for the tournament two years ago," said TWBA president Fay Browning, at the special press conference last Monday, "I expected San Antonio to break some records. I didn't expect them to go crazy and I certainly didn't expect this. This news is out of this world," she beamed. "The new record of 3090 teams will stand for a long long time."

The special press conference Monday included, in addition to members of all radio stations, television stations and newspapers, the proprietors of the city, representatives of the North San Antonio Chamber of Commerce, SABA president and secretary, Ed Crabb and Rusty Pope, and the officers of SAWBA, plus the members of the TWBA 1981 Publicity Committee, and the local TWBA 1981 Tournament Coordinator Sylvia Broyles.

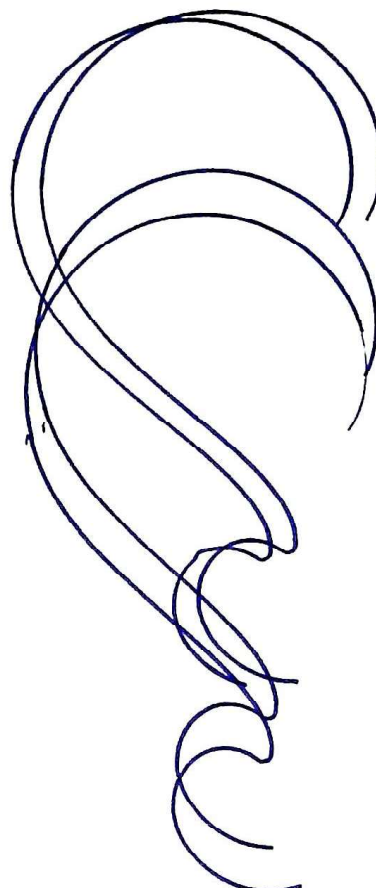

Glenda may have expressed it best Tuesday when she said, "If I see the look in their eyes (the VA officials) that they are grateful, that's all we could possibly ask for."

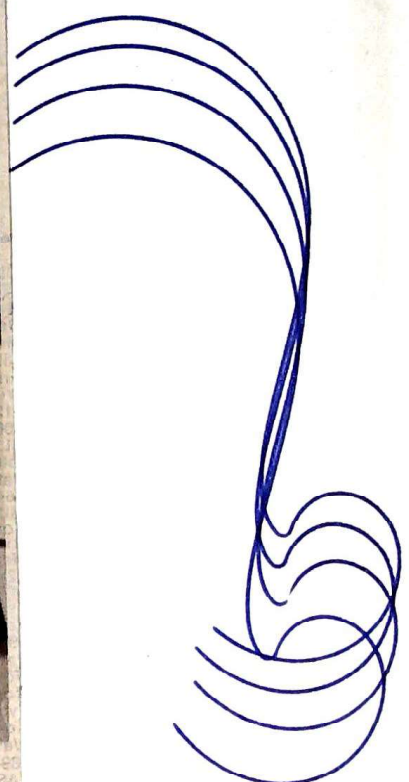

Four More Go Into Hall Of Fame Saturday

Saturday night may be, as the song says, "the loveliest night of the year," as the San Antonio Bowling Council inducts its four newest members into the Hall of Fame.

The two men who will be honored this year were outstanding stars on the lanes although both have curtailed their activities the past few years.

Louie Veil, still active on the lanes, is known as one of the greatest of match game bowlers and was an outstanding member of the great Falstaff and Phillips Drillers teams of the '50s and '60s.

Additionally he's been a state and city singles champion, winning the Stae All Events crown in 1960. He was the City Match Game champion and city all events champ in 1950; city singles champ in both 1953 and 1956 and a member of the city championship team. In the state singles in 1960 he set a new record with a 749 series and in 1954 he was a Texas Tenpin State Double Champion with Wes Spencer.

Also to be inducted is Fred List, a top San Antonio bowler since 1946. He moved to Houston in the '60s.

His city tournament wins include the team, doubles, singles and all events. His state tournament wins rank him with Bob Harris in both team and

doubles. In league play, he was a member of the famous Phillip Drillers team and he was the captain of the Falstaff team that set the record in the 1957 ABC tournament for high team game of 1226 and placed second in team event.

Fred, too, is an all events champion from 1950-51 when he won with an 1885. He repeated in 1954-55 with 1902 and teamed with Hall of famer Bob Harris in 1955-56 as doubles champions.

Fred started many bowlers, including this writer, on their way to happy days on the lanes when he drilled their first bowling ball when he was with the Wonder Bowl pro shop in the fifties.

The two ladies to be honored Saturday night are Mayselle Bauyman one of the very first bowling instructors in San Antonio and Donna Kuehl, who will be honored posthumously, but was not only a tiger on the lanes but an active and able administrator for SAWBA. She was claimed by cancer in the early 1970s.

Mayselle's career spans nearly 50 years. Her first husband, Willie Granieri, was inducted in the the San Antonio Hall of Fame in 1973 posthumously.

Mayselle has been a champion herself in both nine pins and in tenpins, and she competes in both currently. She was one of the first women to teach other women the game of bowling and served more than five years as instructor at the old Mai Alleys and Texas Lanes.

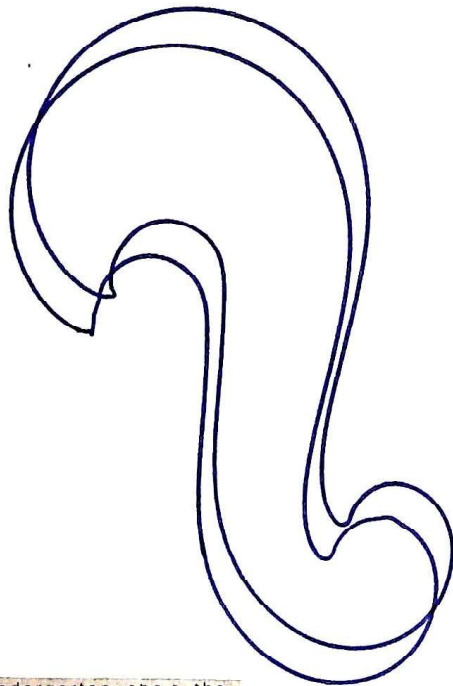
She was a WIBC delegate in the 1940s and has competed in both state and national tournaments for more than 25 years. She was a member of the 1968 WIBC Championship Senior Citizens team when WIBC was in San Antonio. More currently she has accumulated many honors as an outstanding senior citizen bowler.

Overshadowing her many accomplishments, Mayselle is also one of the city's biggest bowling boosters and often sponsors individual bowlers.

All four candidates who will cross into the hallowed halls of honor are most deserving.

Festivities begin at 6 p.m. at Woodlake Country Club Saturday night and dignitaries from across the stae will be on hand to remember and relive days gone by.

They join an elite group already enshrined and like all who have come before - and those who will come after - they will enjoy the highest honor which can be bestowed by fellow bowlers.



Columbia Rolls For 'Strike' on TV

Columbia Industries Inc., a San Antonio firm which is the world's largest manufacturer of polyester bowling balls and which sells its products at bowling lanes and pro shops in 50 states and 21 countries, has expanded its advertising efforts to include television for the first time in its 20-year history.

To make this move was one of the reasons the company recently switched its account to Anderson Advertising. It has traditionally advertised in trade publications and by sponsoring professional bowling tournaments.

A 30-second TV spot with a thunder theme will be test-marketed first on ABC's Professional Bowler's Tour aired in four major bowling centers, Milwaukee, St. Louis, Kansas City and Cleveland, says agency head Jim Anderson. It will also be seen in San Antonio because KSAT-TV (Ch. 12) carries that program, reflecting the growing popularity of bowling here.

The new campaign, frequently featuring professional bowling champions, will also include print advertising in bowling publications and at point-of-purchase in pro shops and bowling lanes. Nationally, bowling has increased 40 percent in the past decade, possibly because of the rising cost of other entertainment, Anderson reports.

TWBA Fields All Time Record In S.A.

When TWBA tournament director and secretary Lil Poole was in town this weekend for the Hall of Fame banquet and a SAWBA Board meeting, she revealed more startling numbers regarding the 44th annual Championships which open March 20 at Wonder Bowl and Sports Palace.

"We only lost four teams from our original announced figure of 3090 because four teams from Houston could not accept the adjusted schedule for the lengthy tournament," Lil said.

In addition to San Antonio's record 3086 teams, there will be 7,749 sets of doubles, 15,498 singles and 14,814 optional all events entries.

The 3,086 teams will be vying for \$50,174.50 in prize money. Doubles and singles prize funds are \$50,368.50 each and All Events, for a fee of \$1.00 is \$14,814, bringing the total prize fund to a record \$165,698.50.

Poole stated that 104 local women's associations made up the record team entry with Houston sending 350 teams, Austin 474, Dallas 152, Fort Worth 108 and Corpus Christi 95 teams. Lubbock WBA which will host the next championships will send 56 teams and the Montgomery County Association turned in an outstanding entry of 68 teams from among their membership. San Antonio of course had entered a record 519 teams.

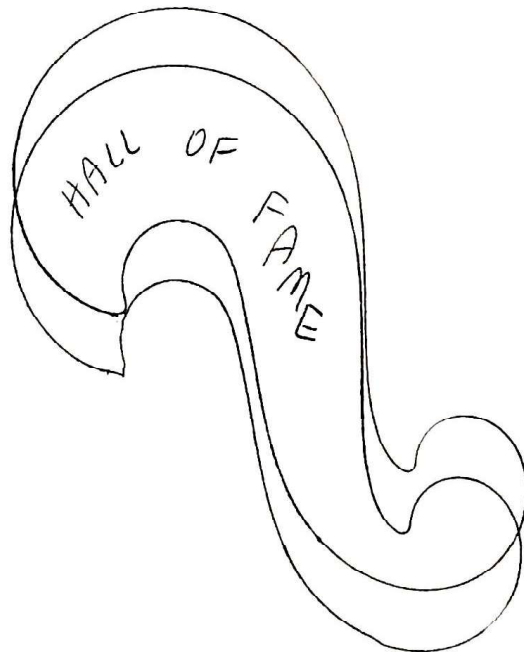

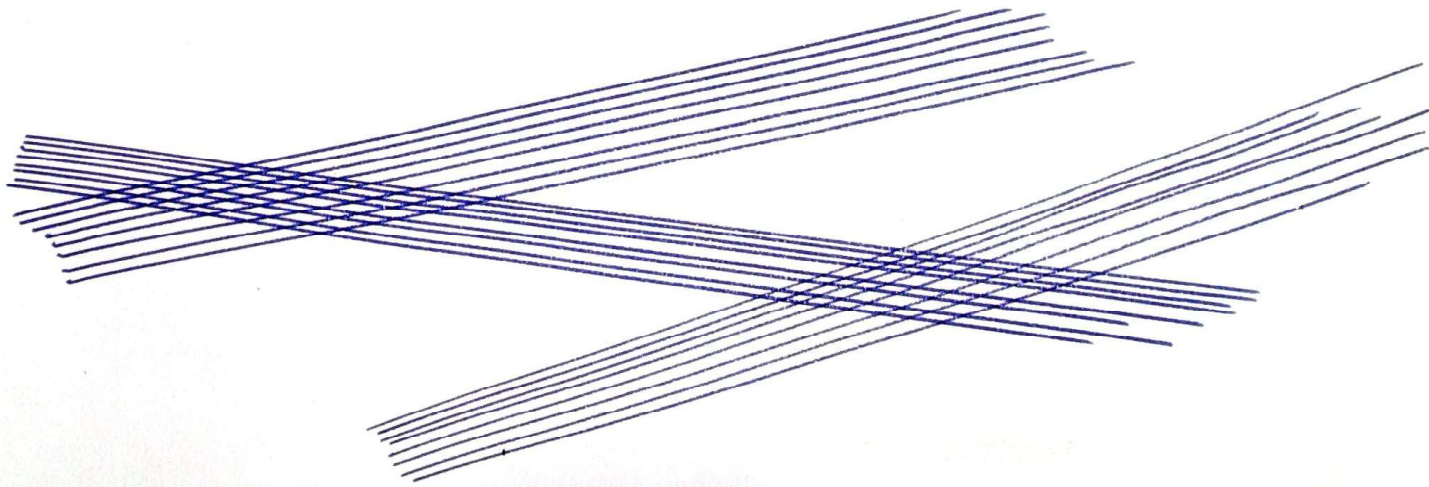

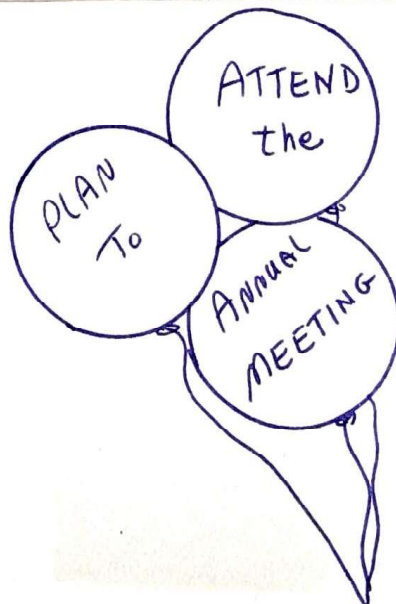
Nominations may also be made from the floor at the Annual Meeting by any member. The member must

Regina Hillier Repeats As Bluebonnet Queen

Amarillo's Regina Hillier became only the second Texas woman to win the Texas Bluebonnet Queens crown in the grueling 26-game tournament conducted by the Texas Women's Bowling Association for its members.

The perky 1981 Queen, who won the title in 1979, staged a see-saw battle for first place with Fort Worth's Kathy LeCroy as they worked their way through the 14-game match game finals at Highland Lanes in Austin last weekend in TWBA's scratch extravaganza.

Donna Carr, Dallas, with games of 235 and 217 was the tournament's first leader but Regina, with games of 204, 205 and 215, took possession after game two, holding down the top spot for one more match.

Following a 258 game, she led went to Kathy who banged out games of 199, 221 and 197 before returning it to Regina. Kathy remained in first the next four matches, but two losses and the 30 bonus points at stake, allowed Regina to return to the top after match 12.

In games 13 and 14 the talented right-handed former Queen slammed in back-to-back games of 228 and 234. She faced Kathy in the position round and with the aid of a closing 5-bagger went on to capture the bonus points and the victory.

One pair of lanes away from Regina and Kathy was defending Queen Gloria Alderman, Fort Worth, who was standing sixth in the standings. After an exciting strike battle with Houston's Laska Schmidt Readette, Gloria moved into second ahead of Kathy by virtue of a 244 game and the 30-added bonus points.

Prior to the final position match it was Donna Carr, Dallas, and Sue Kingham, Houston, battling for the runner-up spot. Carr took the win 163-154, but the scores dropped Donna into fourth, and Sue down to sixth.

Regina quickly referred to her unusual slump since the last Queens at Tyler. "I just lost my confidence after the Tyler Queens when I didn't even make the cut. I didn't bowl that well in Nationals, State nor the FIQ, but a few days before coming to Austin,

something just clicked, and I felt good about this tournament. I'm really pleased at the outcome because I just wanted to do well with and against the top Texas women. I feel great right now (immediately after the presentations) and I'm really looking forward to the WIBC Tournament and to coming to San Antonio for TWBA.

I won't bowling in the WIBC Queens because I'm an elected delegate to the TWBA convention and that's more important to me."

The 1981 Queens tournament was a record-breaker with 207 entries and Queen Hillier was awarded the new TWBA award for Queens - a lovely gold necklace with a diamond studded crown. TWBA secretary Lil Poole presented the Queen's trophy to Regina and Gloria Alderman returned the Queen's tiara symbolic of winning the prestigious tournament. She will also receive from TWBA a paid

entry into the 1982 Bluebonnet Queens in Waco.

Regina averaged 207.9 for her 14 games in the finals, and the overall average of the 14 finalists was 190.7 for the tough schedule. There were 85 finals games over the 200 mark with Kathy LeCroy carding the high of 258.

The two new special awards for non-semifinalists were won by Carolyn Boedeker, Houston for the high four game block. She had a 791. The second award, for high game by a non-semifinalist was won by Linda Baer, Odessa, for her 245 game.

Leading qualifier after Saturday's qualifying rounds (1st 8 games) was Susie Reichley, Dallas, and she continued to lead throughout the semi-final round Saturday night.

Making the cut to the top 36 after the 8-game block were San Antonians: Elfi Tomczyk, even, 3rd place; Debbie Lauzon, 54, 6th; Donna Wallace -66, 10th; Laurie Jo Scales -82, 16th; Mary Falconer, -111, 24th.

It took minus-145 to move into the finals and only Elfi Tomczyk and new bride Debbie Lauzon were in the Sunday finals. Laurie Jo was the alternate.

Tournament director Sylvia Broyles and her committee of Gloria Newman, Corpus Christi, Beverly McLendon, Houston, and Doris Coffman, Wichita Falls, with ex-officio members Fay Browning and Lil Poole, staged another sensational Queens tournament for TWBA members. The ladies of Austin maintained a buffet in the paddock for all the contestants which was greatly enjoyed by all.

SAWBA Annual Meeting Sunday

Calling All Women - women who are members of SAWBA - it's time for your annual meeting and election but more importantly it'll be the time to hear of all the exciting plans for hosting the TWBA Champions, which begin next Friday at Sports Palace and Wonder Bowl.

Those attending the annual meeting will also be called upon to elect officers and directors to guide the association in the years ahead. The Nominating Committee has submitted the

names of Clara Grimes, first vice president, Myrt DeFily, second vice president, Donna O'Connor, secretary and Ella O'Quinn, sergeant at arms.

Also suggested for members' consideration for posts on the SAWBA Board are (in alphabetical order) Lue Best, Florence Buckner, Gail Cantu, Irene Castaldo, Joye Duncan, Dori Johnson, Linda Kopych, Sherry Myers, Unice Powell, Glenda Recker, Karen Sanders and Darlene Wallis. Myers, Recker, Sanders and Wallis are incumbent directors.

Nominations may also be made from the floor at the meeting by any member. The member must give the qualifications of the nominee, with one copy for the SAWBA file.

The other two elections to be held are for delegates who will represent SAWBA at the next TWBA convention in Lubbock and to the WIBC convention at St. Louis. The 1981 WIBC meeting will be in April in Baltimore.

President Pfeiffer advised that the slate of nominees has been posted at all lanes for several weeks and members are encouraged to read the qualifications submitted before choosing their leaders.

Members will learn of many jobs which need to be completed and filled as SAWBA undertakes its gigantic task of staging an 18-weekend successful event. Volunteer workers are still needed for many tasks - and all members are urged to attend the meeting - learn of the plans - and volunteer their times and talents!

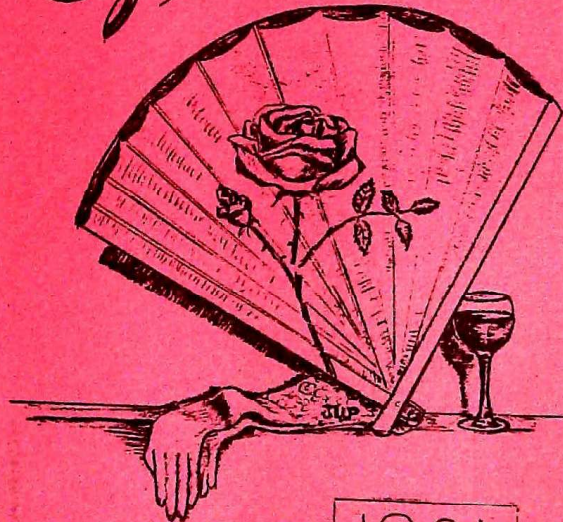

WELCOME TWBA Board & Bowlers!

Tonight is the night the San Antonio Bowling family has been anxiously awaiting - the opening of the 44th Annual Texas Women's Bowling Association championship tournament at Sports Palace and Wonder Bowl.

Seven times the San Antonio WBA has been hostess to the state women bowlers - 1935 when just 36 teams were entered; 1939 when the tournament drew 100 teams for the very first time; 1945 when 166 teams entered; 1951 when 342 entered; 1961 when 1206 teams played in the Alamo City and the first time entries had topped 1000 teams; and in 1973 when 1958 teams enjoyed their stay in our city.

The 1981 edition of the Championships is another record tournament. At the end of the 18-weekend run of the Championships 3,086 teams will have attempted to earn a portion of the \$165,698.50 record prize fund.

SAWBA set a new record for the most teams entered by a hostess city (breaking their own record of 432 entered in 1973) when they entered 519 teams - from among San Antonio's membership.

The singles, doubles and all events totals are also records to be broken. In doubles 7,749 sets have been entered and there are 15,498 singles entries with a record 14,814 all events.

Houston WBA also broke their own record for this tournament by sending 350 traveling teams to the 1981 Championships, after setting a record last year when they sent 302 teams to the Corpus event.

Two localites - Tip Pfeiffer and Clara Grimes, president and first vice president of SAWBA - are defending champions in Class A Doubles. In the Corpus Christi event they slammed home a winning total of 1143 to earn their titles.

A Columbia 300 team from San Antonio holds the all-time team record in Class C, when the talented quintet smashed in 2643 in 1973.

Cheryl Bodenhamer and Betty Ponder, with 1224, hold the all-time record in Class A Doubles set in 1978. That same year Chris Davila and Gladys Heinsohn set a new record for Class B Doubles with 1212.

One of the oldest records in TWBA History was set in 1965 when Necey Schulte, Dunlay, and Kathlene Haby, San Antonio, popped in 1151 in the Class C doubles, and in 1971 Myrt DeFily won the open singles event with 695, records which have not been topped to date.

Alice Illis carved her own

special niche in the TWBA record book with a 245 game in 1969 to earn the Billy Simon trophy for senior age women. Alice's record score was set

when the age for seniors was 60 years, and the age was lowered to 55 years in 1976.

Nine women from the Alamo City have become State

Champions since the state women were organized in 1973 as the Southwest Ladies Bowling Assn.

First to turn the trick was Lonie Schuman who had a nine-game total of 1741 in 1936 when TWBA was known as the Women's Texas State Bowling Assn.

Two years later in Houston Billy Simon became state champion with 1479 and the following year Elna Palmer had 1614 to earn honors when the tournament was here.

Grace Baskin, now retired from bowling, has earned TWBA State Champion honors three times - 1946 at Waco with 1647 - 1948 in El Paso with 1754 and in 1949 at Beaumont with 1821.

Robbie Frey, who went on to pro honors in later years, rolled her way to a state title in 1954 in Austin. She was a member of SAWBA at the time. The following year she relinquished her crown to Hall of Famer Lil Canfield, who slammed in 1768 in the Dallas Meet.

Defending State Champion from the 1980 Corpus Christi tournament is a personable computer operator from Austin, Jane Galbreath, who was recently honored by the Austin WBA with Bruce Carter, Leander, a small community near Austin, who earned the men's state crown. Galbreath won her title with an 1831 total score.

Opening squads of the TWBA Championships have traditionally been reserved for the senior age competitors across the state. This year it's going to take two full squads to accommodate all the seniors wishing to bowl - which is another TWBA record. Thirty teams will roll Friday evening after the official opening ceremonies, and another full squad will be waiting in the wings for Saturday morning action. San Antonio broke its own record by entering 29 five women teams of senior ladies in the 1981 competition.

104 local associations from across the state have sent teams with the smallest entry being one team from the Dalhart WBA.

No TWBA Championship competitor has yet had a 300 game, but Jo Ann Fournier, Beaumont, almost reached that magic pinnacle in 1970 when she rolled TWBA's high tournament game of 293.

The individual high team game was logged by the Alpine Lanes team of Fort Worth, a 1101, and Jeanneane Huey, Fort Worth, in 1960, turned in the high series of 717.

High individual series last year was rolled by Donna Dillon, now of Dallas, a 660 and Kathy LeCroy, Fort Worth, had the high individual game of 267.

The members unanimously adopted the one proposed bylaws change of raising our local dues from \$2 to \$2.25 effective August 1.

Reports were given on the Sylvia Broyles Secretaries Tournament, Donna O'Connor champion with a scratch 608, 694 handicap, the 12th annual Senior Citizens Mixed TOurnament at Astro Bowl, which was won by the Old Timers of Hermann Sons. All events champions for that tournament were Shirley Lane with 1867 and Jessie Wilson, 1924.

Of particular interest to all was the highly successful BVL Fund tournament, and the first KickOff for the event held at Fort Sam Houston Lanes. The prize fund was \$1,061 divided by the 54 winners. A check in the amount of \$3,406.63 was sent to the National BVL Fund headquarters after 4,222 local bowlers participated.

Other reports included Publicity, AJBC and the Senior Team Committee.

"We already have the largest TWBA tournament" reported Sylvia Broyles, Local coordinator for the 1981 TWBA Championships, "And now we want to host the BEST TWBA Tournament and Convention!"

She highlighted activities to date including Mayor Lila Cockrell proclaiming October 26 as Bowlers Week, the successful KickOff followed by Sign Up week, and the league visitation activities which resulted in a record 519 local teams into the Championships.

She added, "Our TWBA Banquet on May 15 promises to be one of TWBA's most beautiful. Chairman Helen Baetz and her committee have everything ready and the ballroom at the Sheraton should be a veritable rose garden. Banquet tickets are \$12.50 each and may be purchased from Mrs. Baetz. Space is limited and as hostesses our members will not have the best seats in the ballroom, but we know you will want to sacrifice to assure that our visitors have the best accommodations."

She reported on Opening Ceremonies, the budget and all the various functions necessary to stage a successful tournament. "It would be impossible for me to list each and every one who has brought



this success to San Antonio, because everyone has done a good job. I am so proud! Many hands are still needed, and I call on each and every member who has not volunteered to help, to do so now. 18 weeks is a long time, and it will take each and everyone of us to help our committee chairmen. Call a Chairman or the SAWBA office and let us know that you want to be a part of this great endeavor," she concluded.

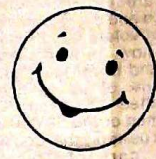

Clever "Smiley Face" posters are cropping all around town promoting the TWBA 3-6-9 BVL Fund tournament at Bowlerama Lanes.

The handicapped event is open to men as well as women who participate in the TWBA Championship Tournament, and the BVL 3-6-9 tournament will run the same dates as the Championships - March 20 through July 26.

There are two separate divisions - men and women - and handicapped is given to all bowlers at 80% from 200.

Bowlers will roll three games on one pair of lanes, and all entrants receive strikes in the 3rd, 6th and 9th frames in each game. Competition is anytime lanes are available during the run of the Championships.

Local 600 Club members will be conducting the tournament at Bowlerama as 600 Club members compete in their Championship Tournament.

Entry fee is just \$5.00 per person with \$2 set aside for bowling fees, thanks to Bowlerama management, \$2.00 to the prize fund and \$1.00 of each entry being donated to the BVL Fund.

Bowlers may place only once in the prize list, and the prize fund will be disbursed at a ratio of 1-10.

No entries will be accepted on Sunday after 4:30 p.m. so as not to conflict with the Bowlerama league schedule.

The 16th annual Texas 600 Club Tournament conducted for members only carries a \$6 entry fee with \$2.50 designated as prize fund.

The event is a scratch singles event in two divisions: Div. I for members whose average is 165 or above and Div. II, for those with 164 or below averages.

Members roll three games on one pair of lanes and multiple participation is allowed (individuals may bowl twice, but not on the same pair of lanes, and to place only once in the prize list).

Bowlers use TWBA entering averages and plaques will be awarded first place in each Division, provided by TWBA secretary, and Club Advisor, Lil Poole.

Payoff in the 600 Club tournament is 1-10 and entries will be accepted until 4:30 p.m. July 26.

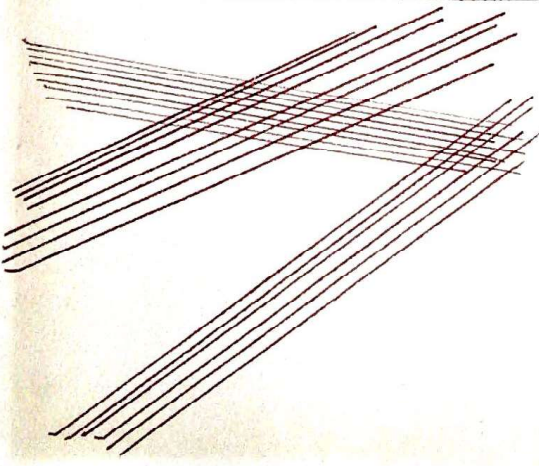

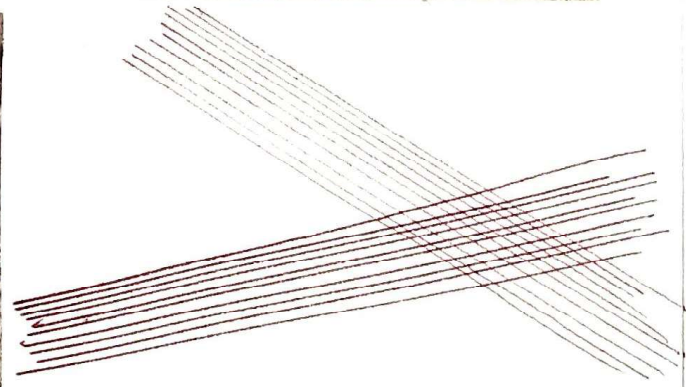

"Lemon Tree Very Pretty"

Rita Dalton Shoots 5th 300 in SAWBA History

Humming and singing the lyrics of "Lemon Tree" while the pins rattled around the pindeck, Rita Dalton became the fifth SAWBA member in history to record a sanctioned 300 game Tuesday morning at Fort Sam Houston lanes.

"I always sing while I'm bowling," said the stunning and shy 36-year-old mother of two. "Sometimes when I can't pick up spares, it's 'When You're Hot, You're Hot'," laughed the 157 to 139 average keggerette.

"I guess the singing keeps my mind off my bad bowling, but today (Tuesday) it was just 'Lemon Tree', and the pins just kept on falling down. I know I went to the Brooklyn side four or five times, because that's where I usually strike. But whether light or heavy, everything just fell down - it was unbelievable," she said incredulously just a few hours after her historic feat.

"I'm just sorry I didn't get my first 600 series," she said as seriously as she could be about her bowling (her friends say she knows nothing about the

technical side of bowling). "I had a 152 first game and then I had a split in the tenth frame on my last game (143), so I just had a 595, which is still pretty good for me."

With a chuckle, she added, "I really wasn't supposed to be bowling today, because my back was bothering me so I went to the doctor and he told me to rest in bed two to four days, but I felt better, so I bowled."

Asked if she had used any new equipment or changed her delivery, she said, "No, I just use my old AMF Hugger that Larry (Porrini) drilled because I really don't pay much attention to scores, averages and all that. I just throw the ball down the lanes pretty straight - maybe it moves about 3-4 boards. It's not much, but I have fun with the ladies I bowl with and we all have a good time when we bowl. The only thing I remember about the game is that on the last ball in that game (the 300) I sort of bounced it down the lanes - and again - everything just fell down."



Dalton is the director of the Youth Center at Fort Sam Houston where she bowls in another league on Wednesday carrying a 159 average (her highest ever). She's also coach of a girls softball team, directs the Teen Club and enjoys tennis and golf.

Her husband, Eddie, is a 179 average bowler at Fort Sam, but neither of their two children, Eddie 11, or Amy, 9, are active bowlers yet.

Rita Dalton will be rolling her TWBA Championships this weekend with partner, Rose Loudermilk, and as the song says, "the lemon flower is sweet" (as was her 300 game) so maybe she'll be able to do as well then. But—as the song also says, "the fruit of the poor lemon tree is impossible to eat"...so maybe once again it'll be "When You're Hot" time again for Rita. Either way, she carved her own special niche in SAWBA history - even if she doesn't understand all about the game. She's to receive WIBC and TWBA awards for her perfect and for going 100 pins over her average.

The owners of previous 300 games in San Antonio are Myrt DeFly (1958), Dottie Overstreet (1962), Bettie Jo Geisler (1973) and Shirley Mansfield (1974). Bonnie Santaniello's was not approved by ABC.

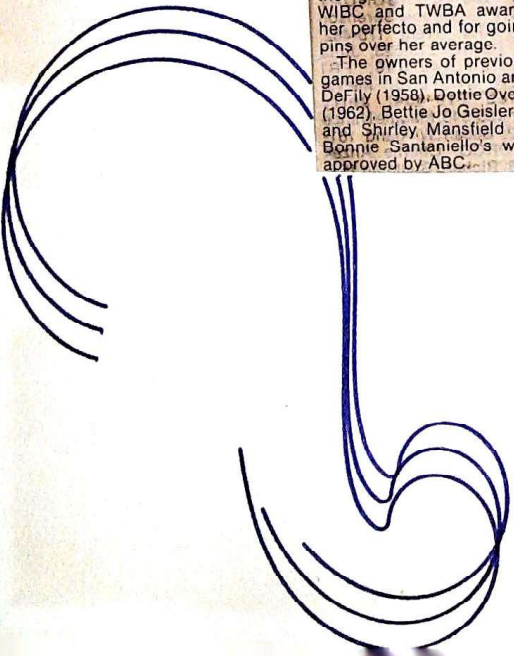
Visitors at Astro Bowl dopped coins in a slot on the top attempting to put the coin in the jigger for a free game - and \$101 was the take.

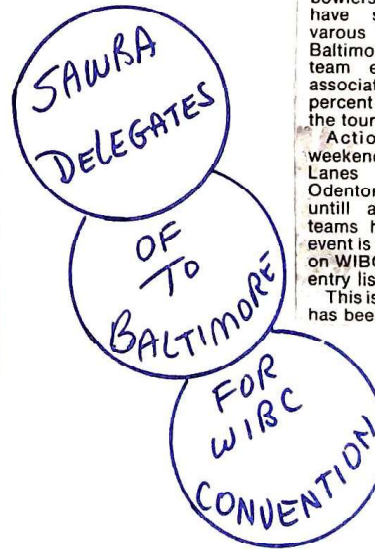

Moving a pair of lanes away she opened her singles play with a 205, added 182 and closed out with 203.

Facing an overnight wait before she could take a crack at the all events lead, Laurie Jo returned to the tournament office at the Palace to continue her work with Tournament Director Lil Poole and Sylvia Broyles, posting cards of other TWBA competitors.

After a good night's sleep for Laurie Jo, and while two full squads of team event competitors rolled, Laurie Jo returned again to the Palace with the Oak Hills-All Star team (mother, Bettie Jo Geisler, Jerry Johnson, Carole Butcher and Smith). She opened with a 203, slammed in 205 then with the pressure mounting and half of the local tournament workers

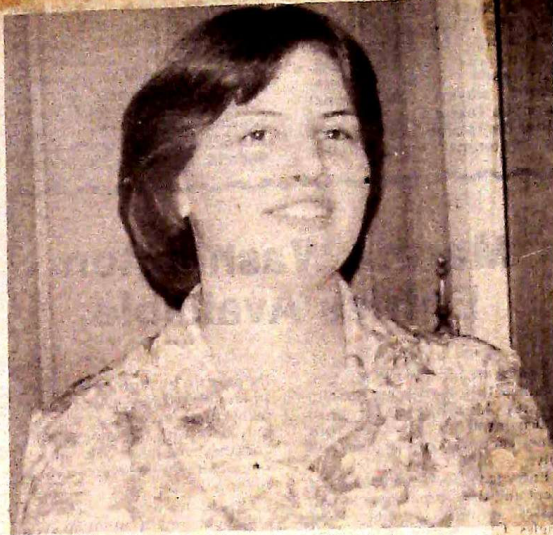
watching, she completed her team play with a 216 for 624, to move into first in All Events Open Division with 1831.

Laurie Jo had locked up the tournament lead by the seventh frame of her final game, but added another strike, spare and a spare and strike in the 10th to tie the winning score of the Corpus Christi event, which was won by Jane Galbreath, Austin, with an identical 1831.

Jean Wentz reaps dividends from more leagues, practice

What a difference bowling in more leagues and practice can make. Jean Wentz, for example, had been a 147-average bowler for several years just participating in one league a week. This year, however, the 42-year-old housewife is bowling in three leagues, subbing in another and practicing more.

The Texas Women's Bowling Association's Class C singles and all-events leader going into this weekend isn't disappointed in her investments.

"Bowling more and getting a new ball has really helped," said the jovial lady. "I've really worked on my game this year. My average was about 147 last year, but it is between 158 and 163 in four different leagues at Thousand Oaks and Astro Bowl. I've never carried over a 148 average until this year, and that is because I'm bowling in more leagues."

"Jeannie does well in bowling," said George Wentz, her husband. "If she continues to bowl a lot, she'll do well. She is a good athlete."

Wentz demonstrated her marked improvements in the state tournament. The Cheyenne, Wyo., native had games of 188, 210 and 201 for a 599 series in just missing her first 600 while taking over the Class C singles lead.

She also had games of 172, 183 and 136 for a 491 series in doubles and games of 145, 199 and 214 for a nine-game total of 1,648 — an average of 183.1 per game — for the Class C all-events advantage.

"I'm getting a lot of 'You've been sandbagging' from my friends and acquaintances," laughs Wentz. "I really wasn't expecting to do so well since I hadn't bowled on the lanes (Sports Palace and Wonder Bowl) before. The dots were different. Everything went well for a change."

"I was relaxed and I wasn't nervous. That was unusual. I was bowling with some friends, Carol Gould, Bernice Kostpoth and Norma Cox, whom I've bowled together with for two years, and that made a difference also."

It could be Wentz wanted to prove that she is just as talented as her versatile family. George is an excellent trapshooter; son Stan, 21, a junior at the University of Texas at Austin, is a Texas collegiate judo champion in his weight class; son George Jr., 17, a junior at Churchill, was the Alabama state wrestling champion in his class in 1978; and daughter Melissa, 10, nicknamed Missy, is a talented Class III gymnast for the Pritchett school.

"I did pretty well in the first game of the tournament and it started me off," said Wentz, who is also a former swimming instructor. "Going to the final event, the team event, I knew I had to have a 520-plus series to be in the top three. Ironically, I didn't get nervous and I just buckled down and got the job done. Those 199 and 214 games really made the difference."

Wentz, who didn't fare too well in her only previous state tournament experience in the 1973 event in Alabama, is a former music major at the University of Wyoming.

"Certainly, I would like those scores to stay up there," Wentz said. "I know, however, there are a lot more bowlers coming in and the lead is really iffy. From now on it is going to be tough."

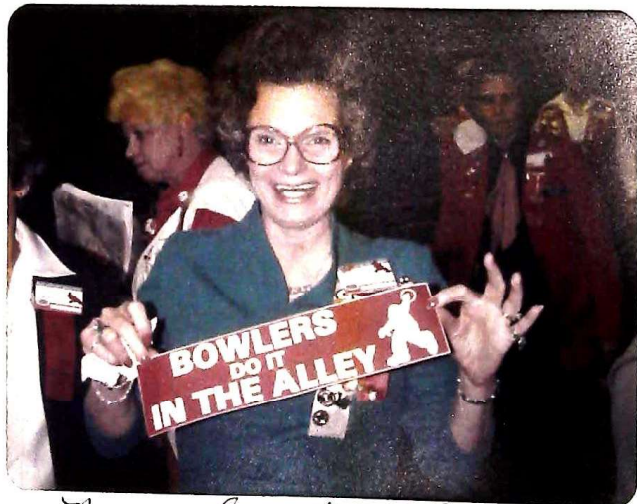

For the first time in 21 years the Women's International Bowling Congress has a new president - Mrs. Helen Baker, South Miami, Florida.

The second largest delegation to a WIBC convention gave Baker a rousing vote of confidence with 2,343 votes on the first ballot.

Also presented to the delegates as candidates for president were Gladys Banker, Maryland, Agnes Duffy, California, and Billie O'Connor, Washington. Baker withdrew from the race on Tuesday and during the balloting Duffy received 614 votes, O'Connor, 200.

Rae Fisk, Houston, received the delegates' nod for the position of second vice president and Lo Borschuk, Iowa, was named fifth vice president. Fisk is also chairman of the WIBC Legal Committee.

All incumbent directors (post 1-8) were re-elected to their respective positions from the dual slate presented by the 1981 nominating committee.

Sylvia Broyles of the Alamo City also serves on the WIBC Board as Director No. 18, but her three year term on the

Board was not up for election at this meeting. Fisk and Broyles are the only two Texans on the WIBC Board.

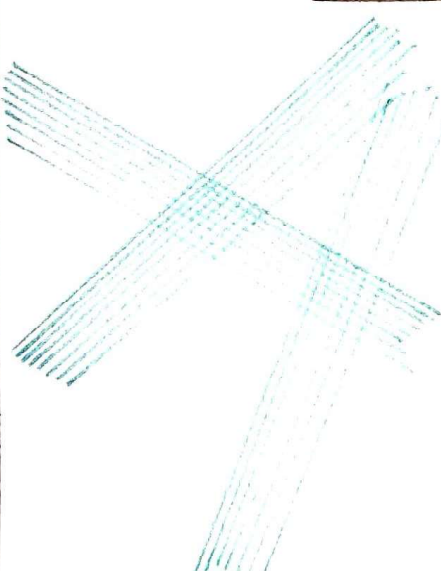
Mrs. Baker succeeds Alberta E. Crowe, Liverpool, N. Y., who has served as WIBC president for 21 years, but notified the delegates last year that she would not seek another term as

president.

At the Baltimore conclave, Mrs. Crowe told the delegates, "When I step down as your president 94 days from now, it will conclude 42 years of service to our national organization. That wasn't exactly what I had in mind back in 1939...to be very honest with

you. But I've not regretted a single moment of it, not even those days when problems seemed to outweigh the gains we were making."

The delegates, also unanimously approved the Board's recommendation that Mrs. Crowe become the first Life Member of the WIBC.

On Wednesday evening Mrs. Crowe was special guest of honor at a huge banquet in the magnificent new Civic Center.

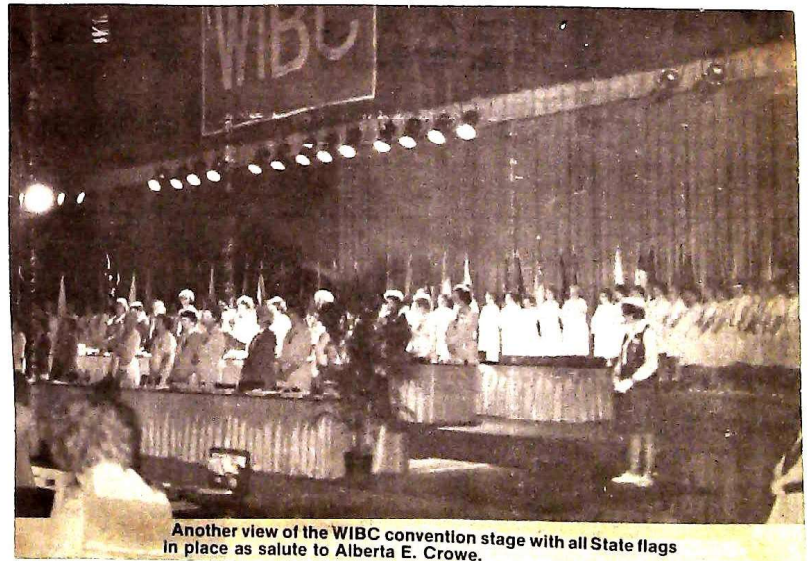
An audio-visual presentation highlighting the events of her illustrious career was shown to the nearly 2000 banquet guests.

The happy mother of three rolled games of 187, 195 and 158 (540) in her doubles event last weekend, before switching lanes at Wonder Bowl for doubles.

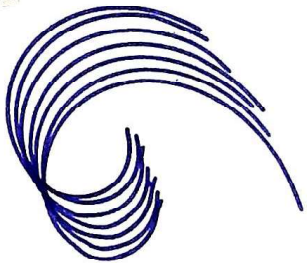
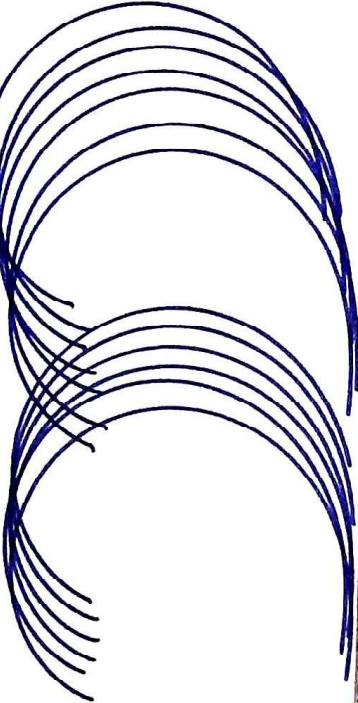
Then followed games of 210, 256, and 193 for her leading singles tally. Her 256-659 ties both the tournament high game and series to date.

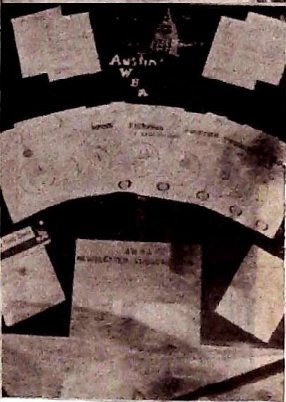

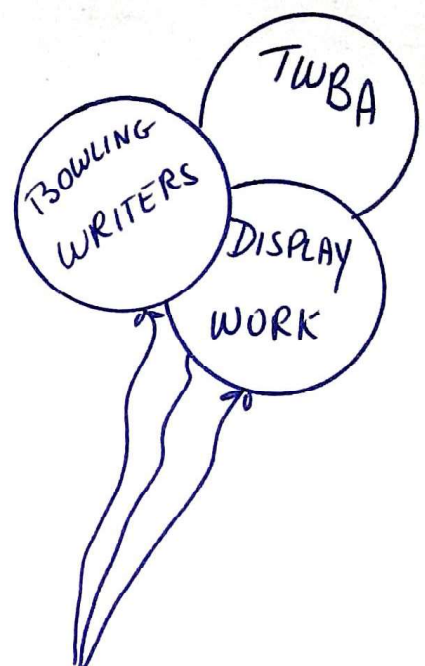

Grace Baskin Enters TWBA Hall Of Fame

Appearing every bit as beautiful and youthful as she did when she was forced to give up the bowling game several years ago, Grace Baskin was enshrined in the TWBA Hall of Fame last Friday evening.

Nominated by the San Antonio Women's Bowling Association, Baskin thought she was going to be recognized as a former TWBA Champion,

together with all other past champions.

Her shock was evident as TWBA Hall of Fame members strolled through the banquet guests searching out the 1981 inductee, but Baskin quickly recovered as her lengthy list of accomplishments were read.

As Baskin wiped away tears of happiness, dinner guests were told that she was a six-time city titlist, only able to compete in the sport for 20 years because of tendonitis which put a stop to her bowling, tennis and softball careers. Three sports in which she always excelled.

Besides her three state all events titles, Baskin won four titles in doubles, with three different partners. She also had three in singles and four in team event.

In the WIBC tournament in Omaha, Nebraska, in 1950 Baskin was second in singles and in team event.

It's no wonder, with her outgoing, vivacious personality and sense of fair play, that she received the Good Sportsmanship Award locally. Baskin gave of herself to the bowling game as well as excelling in it. In 1968 when WIBC was in the Alamo City, she was Score-keeper chairman for the mammoth event.

Grace was inducted into the San Antonio Bowling Council Hall of Fame in 1973 with Gus Pfeiffer and Willie Granier, posthumously. At that time it was reported that she held a four-year domination on the women's bowling scene in San Antonio. She reigned from 1945 through 1949 before losing the honor to Lil Canfield, who was

with her at the banquet Friday, for two years. She returned to the throne and won the 18th and 19th city tournaments before the bad arm curtailed her bowling activity.

Grace, with her husband Frank, has been a tremendous asset to bowling in San Antonio. Frank is legal counsel to the local proprietors and the women's association.

State Hall of Fame honor to Grace Baskin is long overdue, and she merits every accolade which can be bestowed. Her vivaciousness and charm have graced our game and her influence on the sport has been felt for many years. She never was an individual - but clearly a team member - devoted to her teammates and even to the

opposition.

Sharing the evening with Grace was another former teammate and long-time friend, Ina Elo, who's been missing much too long around the lanes.

Last year Austin claimed to have the State's most proficient bowlers after the men's and women's all events titles went to Austinites Jane Galbreath and Bruce Carter.

San Antonio now has the distinction of having two of their family members honored by TSBA and TWBA as Hall of Fame members, since Bob Harris of San Antonio will be inducted later this year.

Honors such as these couldn't come to two more deserving bundles of niceness!

"With all the fanfare behind the big game, I still wound up losing 50 cents because I didn't get my average in the other two games," said Schreefer. "Lloyd was real proud of me, though."

"Now, I guess it is time to get a new ball. Every time I beat Lloyd, he buys me a new ball. It takes some time to adjust to a new ball and your scores aren't as high. He has bought me a new ball two or three times. This time, however, he wound up getting himself a new ball instead."

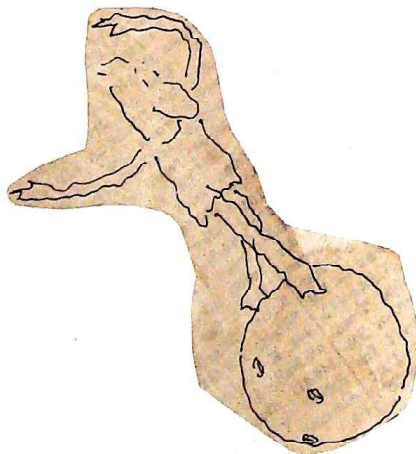
"I really wanted to get a 600 series, too," she added.

Martha Washington Opens Next Weekend

The Oak Hills Martha Washington Tournament, for women only, begins its two-month run next weekend and could be one of the largest ever since Friday night squads have been added and additional squads in July.

The tournament remains a two-division event - Class A and B, with 75% handicap from 200 in Class A; and 75% from 155 in B. Entry fee is \$6.50 per person per event with a 1-10 payoff in each division.

This year entries close 30 minutes prior to squad time or when the squad is filled.

Entering averages are 1979-80 yearbook, or highest 21 game average as of January 12, 1981. If the bowler has no yearbook average, a written verification of average must accompany entry.

A bowler may enter doubles as many times as she wishes, but can cash only once with the same partner. In singles, bowler may cash only once with highest score rolled. Each time a bowler enters doubles, she must also bowl singles.

Bowlers may roll in team event as often as desired, but no more than three bowlers on the same team can place more than once in the prize list for position standing.

There are Friday night 7p.m. squads on June 5, 12, 19, 26; July 3, 10, 17, 24. And on Saturday and Sunday at 9a.m. 12:30 and 3:30 throughout June and July.

Entries are in most centers or may be obtained by contacting Oak Hills Bowling Center, 344-6251.

The Division II lead also changed this weekend as Pat Chapman, Spring, put in a 608 series with games of 163, 248 and 197. She was rolling with a 164 average.

In the TWBA BVL 3-6-9 tournament localite Tommy Priest continues to lead with an 816 while Mary Fokken, Houston, holds the top spot for the ladies with 785.

The 3-6-9 tournament is handicapped and bowlers receive an automatic strike in the third, sixth and ninth

th Claims Two Hall Of Famers

ng family was shocked and to learn of the of two Hall of Fame within three days each other. Bertram 'Bert' Weltens, 69, who had been a Antonio Light employee for more than 40 years prior to his retirement in 1974,

died on Sunday, June 14, of a heart attack.

On Wednesday, at age 85, death claimed E.J. "Egg" Eyhorn, who was inducted into the Bowling Council Hall of Fame in 1979.

Egg began his bowling career in 1928, because someone invited him to bowl nine pins. The following year he joined his first league at Grand Alleys.

He loved pot games, participated in exhibition matches during Bowlers Days functions, won league championships, scored sensationally in the ABC tournaments and was feared and respected on the lanes in league play.

He bowled series over the 650 in abundance in the early '30s and at Broadway Lanes swatted the second highest score rolled in the city in 1934...267, 245, 250 for a 762 to bring the Martin Linen team recognition for their games and series: 1087, 1043 and 1100 for a fantastic 3230.

Egg never lost his interest or his love for the bowling game. In the years before his brief illness which resulted in his death, he was a regular "booster" whenever tournaments were in progress at Bowlerama or when the Traveling League visited. His own bowling activity stopped about ten years ago but he always had an encouraging word for youngsters and adults alike. His enthusiasm never waned and never an unkind word passed his lips. This editor will sadly miss the fellowship, the coffee stops, the twinkly blue eyes and friendship shared over the years.

Egg Eyhorn was a rich man. He was the father of four sons, grandfather of 17 and great-grandfather of 16. We share their sorrow at the passing of this great human being.

Bert was an ardent, and proficient, golfer, a tennis champion (1934-35), an active member of the Texas Exes who had missed very few University of Texas football games since returning from the service, a semi-pro and softball baseball

player, and a bowling champion who had participated in 15 ABC tournaments. He was the City Champion All Events titlist from 1936-39, doubles champion in 1937 and in 1939, and singles champion in 1937, 1939 and 1951. His bowling career paralleled that of Charlie Trueter, Charles Kaiser, Jr., Norby Peshorn, Billy Simon, Egg Eyhorn, H.H. Phillips and Ralph Nixon.

He bowled first at the Knights of Columbus Hall, then moved to Grand Alleys and of course, Billy Simon's Alamo Lanes. In 1939 he was selected by the legendary Gene Gagliardi of New York to be his doubles partner, where they represented Bill's Alamo Recreation Lanes. He was also an exhibition participant in match games with Billy and Buddy Bonar for Bowlers Days, the celebration held on Labor Day Weekend for bowlers around the state and the United States.

During Bert's Service days from 1942 until 1945 at every base he was sent to the base hospital for his "cancerous thumb" which officials thought was deformed, but in reality was just a "bowler's thumb".

Many oldtimers happily remember Bert's bet with a slightly 'tipsy' bowling fan who bet that Bert couldn't average 200 across Billy's lanes. Billy kept score and Charlie Trueter, who had \$50 of the bet, set pins and in the last frame the baby split jumped up, and Bert needed just one pin to average 200. He missed it. Charlie ran out of the back to collect his portion, but their tipsy friend had passed out by then, so they left the money for him and went home. The next day they learned that he was a "deadbeat" who couldn't have covered the bet anyway -- and they had to pay the lineage.

Bert covered Light Sports for a short while with Harold Scherwitz then moved to the administrative side of the publication, where he stayed until his retirement in 1974. He was a founding member and past president of the San Antonio Light employees credit union, a member of the Canyon Creek Country Club, and various other civic groups.

Bert was inducted into the San Antonio Bowling Council Hall of Fame in 1974, but missed the banquet to attend a University of Texas football game. He last visited with his bowling friends at the 1981 Hall of Fame Banquet in February.

Surviving Bert are his wife, Kay, a Bowling champion in her own right, a brother-in-law and several nieces and nephews.

The bowling family lost a true friend and a real champion, whose gentlemanly and gentle manner will be sadly missed.

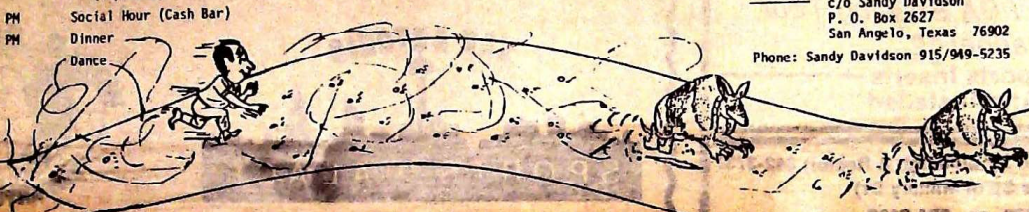

City Mixed Deadline Is July 18th

Entries close midnight July 18 for the SABA/SAWBA City Mixed Tournament at Hacienda Bowl and doubles close 45 minutes prior to each shift.

The 8th annual City Mixed is scheduled for the first three weekends of August - August 1-2, 8-9 and 15-16 with squads for team events on Saturdays at 2 p.m. and 7:15 p.m. Sunday squads are at 12 noon on the 2nd, 9th and 16th.

Saturday doubles squads are at 5:15 on the first, 8th and 15th with squads on Sunday at 3:15, 5:15 and 7:15 p.m. each day.

Cost is just \$7.50 per person per event with \$3.55 designated for the prize fund.

The tournament is divided into three classes for each event with Class A team averages of 825 and over; Class B 750-824 and Class C, 749 and under. In doubles in Class A it's 330 and over; B, 300-329, and Class C, 299 and under.

The tournament is sponsored by the two bowling associations and 80% of 400 will be used as handicap in doubles and 1000 in team events. Handicap based on three game

totals.

To enter the tournament bowlers must be members of either the San Antonio Bowling Association, San Antonio Women's Bowling Association or the Boerne Women's Association. All participants use 1979-80 yearbook averages of at least 21 games. If no yearbook average bowlers may use current league averages of 21 games.

Prize money remains in its respective class and the prize fee is returned 100% at a ratio of less than 1-10.

Mixed teams may be 3 men and 2 women or vice versa. Doubles must be one male and one female. In team event bowlers may enter with as many teams as they wish, however, not more than 3 members of a team entered in the tournament may bowl together more than once.

Bowlers may enter doubles as often as desired, but cannot cash more than once with the same partner.

Entries are available at most centers or may be obtained by calling either association office - SABA 923-7501 or SAWBA, 824-1321.
