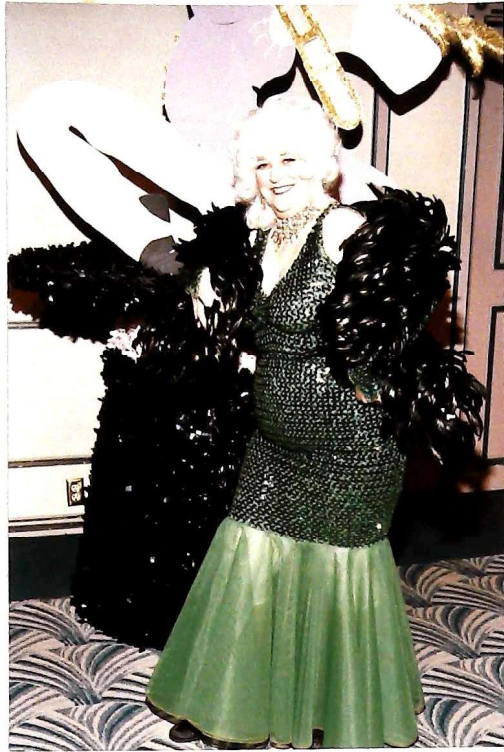

## WOMAN BOWLER OF THE YEAR

Donna Conners of Houston, a brilliant performer on the lanes and a true lady of bowling in every way, is the Texas Woman Bowler of the Year.

Conner's genuine interest in the sport is evidenced by her attitude, not only toward the game, but also with her fellow competitors. From her graceful delivery of the ball to her quiet smile when departing the approach, she retains the pleasant demeanor that has become her trademark.

The 1986-87 season carried a total of eleven 600+ series for Donna, her highest being a 680. Not being satisfied, Donna added two 700 series, posting a 748 as her highest. High game was a 299, just one pin shy of the elusive perfect game.

The pretty lady has a career high of a 767 series and accomplished that elusive 300 which had evaded her last season. While bowling only two leagues this past season, Conners managed a modest average of 190 and 184. This year, however, she dropped to one league and is carrying a 206 average.

A member of the 1987 TWBA State Championship team and an 11th place finish in the Bluebonnet Queens added to Conners honors for '86-'87 season. She won the Majestic Daisy Tournament, the 2nd jewel in the Yellow Rose of Texas Triple Crown.

She will soon be competing in the Team USA State Finals for the second time.

They will be joining an illustrious group of 26 other ladies who are members of the Hall. Selection for the Hall can be either for Meritorious Service or for Outstanding Performance. Induction ceremonies will take place in San Antonio at the annual meeting and banquet of the TWBA in May of 1988.

When notified by TWBA President Doris Coffman of their selection, both responded with the same comment - "Are you serious? This is fantastic!" When told that someone else would be joining her in the Hall Sue asked, "Can I guess who this person is? Is it my sister?" She then added "Lou and I have talked and dreamed about this happening for a long time." Twins they are ... doubles partners they are ... and also very good friends.

THE MAGIC OF  
ACHIEVEMENT.....



In 1951, while students at San Jacinto High School in Houston, and known as the "Morton Twins," Sue and Lou entered their first bowling tournament. This was the beginning of the capturing of many titles. In their first tournament, they placed 3rd...and had been bowling a very short three months.

In 1953...their team from San Jacinto High School placed first in the city, first in the state, and third in a national meet while competing against 1600 entrants. Again in 1954, their team won the city title.

Graduates of the University of Houston, they were members of the U of H bowling team during their years at the university.

They have garnered many titles throughout their bowling careers. While many of their titles have been as doubles partners, they have won their share of individual and team titles as well. They've won the doubles event in the Houston Association tournament twice, 1956-57 and 1957-58. They were members of the Houston All-City team in 1959-60 and again in 1962-63. They have four Houston Women's Bowling Association team titles. Both Sue

and Lou were recipients of yearly HWBA high game and high series awards.

While writing the history of the Texas Women's Bowling Association, Author Barney Barnhill, a non-bowler, asked "who in the world is Sue and Lou Morton?" After noting a few of their accomplishments, it's easy to understand why Barney would want to know. TWBA Doubles titles were won during the 1960-61, 1961-62, 1962-63 and 1974-75 seasons. In an interview with the Austin American Statesman, Lou stated "I believe my most outstanding achievement has to be my four state doubles titles with my sister, Sue." Team event titles were won in 1963-64.

Following are just a few of their individual accomplishments. Sue was selected Queen of Bowling in Houston in 1963-64. She also has the distinction of winning state all events titles in 1961, 1964 and in 1971. During the early 1970's, Sue won many titles in the Southwest Master's Tournament, a mini-tour of the higher average lady bowlers in Texas. She was named Southwest Masters "Bowler of the Year" twice. In 1974,

when the WIBC tournament was in Houston, Sue captured first place in the National 600 Club tournament. Kingham is a member of the Ladies Professional Bowling Tournament and has finished in the top ten positions in these tournaments many times.

Lou won the 1st Annual Houston Scratch Singles Classic championship in 1958, traditionally an all male event. Lane, also a member of the Ladies Professional Bowling Tour, won the 3rd Annual Ladies Professional Bowling tournament in 1962, and again in 1975. While living in Houston, she was a continuous sight on the Houston TV Strike Show, winning three first place titles. Since moving to Austin, she has won doubles titles, and six team titles. Lou recently has been named the Austin Bowler of the Year.

While Sue has 27 700+ series to her credit and Lou has four, Lou has managed to roll two 300 games. Kingham has a high game of 299 and high series of 766. Lane has a 743 high series, to go with her 300 game.

Both Sue and Lou are members of Houston Bowling's Hall of fame.

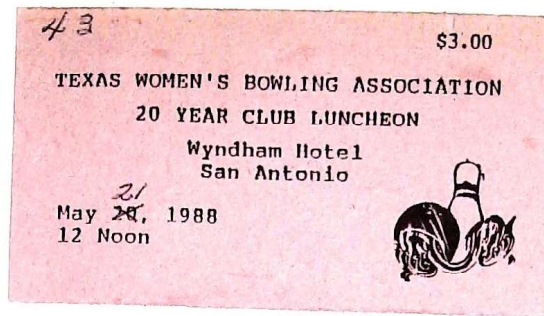

## Kathy Kirst Leads State All Events

If Kathy Kirst's all events total of 1876 in the TWBA Championship Tournament holds up until July 17th, it'll be another historical mark for the state women's association.

Kathy, now 27, was the 1977 "Miss Texas Junior Bowler of the Year" that year and was a graduating senior from John Marshall High School. The same year she was honored as the recipient of the Alberta E. Crowe "Star of Tomorrow" at the WIBC annual meeting.

Should her nine game total withstand the final weeks of pin bombardment at World of Sports and Astro Bowling Center, Kathy would be the first "Miss Texas Junior Bowler" to earn the TWBA all events crown.

According to her mother, Debbie Kirst of Country Lanes, during her team event the quiet lefthander posted games of 200, 175 and 156 for a 531 set.

Moving into Astro Bowl for doubles with partner, Laurie Jo Scales, the 1981 State Champion, Kathy sizzled in a 685 series with games of 237, 235 and 213. Laurie Jo added 184, 186 and 213 (583) for the leading Division I Doubles tally of 1268.

Adding games of 215, 214 and 231 (660) in Singles, Kathy moved one pin ahead in the all events list. Mickie Archer, rolling for the Snafu team had just completed her nine games in the TWBA event the previous shift, ousting Joyce Davis of Big Spring from her lead.

Micki was a member of the Snafu team which featured a 625 series by reigning Texas Bluebonnet Queen, Linda Urbanek, Humble, Arlington's Carol Bailey's 602 and Beth Parker's 562, Dallas' Sue Gregory's 488 and Micki's 607. In Queen Urbanek's final game she slammed in a six bagger to complete her team play.

Archer's totals were a 672 in doubles and a 596 in single for her 1875 total, a lead which vanished when Kathy stepped on the lanes.

In Division 2, Letha DeLaughter, who's been blistering the lanes of late, entered the state tournament off a 156 high yearbook average. She zipped into first in all events with a 685 team effort last weekend, had 511 in doubles and 603 in singles to compile a leading 1682 score.

Other local ladies remaining in first or second in the top three of the TWBA are: Betty Roberts, Div. 3 Singles with 658; Jane Alvarado and Sally Alighire with 1065 in Div. 4 Doubles; Dona Long in second in Div. 4 Singles; and Carol Detwiler with 1614 in Div. 4 all events with 1614.

Third place is held down by these local ladies at this point of the competition: The Thunder Rollers #2 tied for third in Div. 3 team event; and the Fort Sam Strikers tied for third in Div. 5 team. Ernestine Harris and Jackie Summers have 1121 in Div. 2 doubles; and Cammie Brown is third in Div. 2 all events with 1699.

The tournament continues at both centers until July 17 with the exception of the July 4th weekend.



## First '88 TWBA Championships Record Falls In 12th Week

With just five weekends remaining in the TWBA Championship Tournament at World of Sports and Astro Bowling Center, the state recorded its first record this past weekend.

Mary Honeycutt, Milano of the Rockdale Women's Bowling Association carved her special niche in TWBA annals setting a new singles record for Division 4.

A mother of two, who is expecting her third child in just three weeks, rolled games of 165, 264 and 212 for a 641 series during her tournament competition at Astro Bowl.

Honeycutt, the 1983 all events Novice Division titlist of 1983, topped the previous record of 636 by five pins. The previous record was set by Kathey Spurling of Killeen set in 1978.

It was Honeycutt's first career 600 series and since she was competing with a yearbook average of 143

she'll be awarded a century award from WIBC by going at least 100 pins over her average for a single game.

Although not a record, 70 year old Clemma Bailey of Austin also found herself in the spotlight this past weekend. She slammed in a 241 game (missing her century award from WIBC by just five sticks) by taking the lead in the race for the Billy Simon Memorial Award for a senior bowler during the competition.

Other WIBC award winners were Shirley Yarbrough of Waco who carded a 167 triplicate off her 155 average, and Robin Siebe of Houston, a 111 averager, who posted a 225 game for her century award.

A local team known as the Super Shooters II were just outside the glare of the spotlight. Members Joyce Vaughan (484), Wendy Martin (524), Andrea Keck (563), Kathy Kurtz (648) and Cindy Berlanga (568) moved into third place in Div. I, only to be demoted to fourth in the standings later in the day.

The Westgate Pro Stop of Austin, sizzled in a 2864 to move into the runnerup position behind the Snafu team of Dallas with 2884.

No other changes were recorded which would affect the local ladies in the various divisions in the top three slots.

## Local 600 Club Sets Special Friday Squad For Texas 600 Tourney

An invitation has been extended to all San Antonio 600 Club members to bowl on a special squad in the Texas 600 Club tournament on Friday, June 24th at Country Lanes!

Time for the special squad is 7 p.m. with arrangements made for a second squad immediately afterward for those ladies wishing to roll the second time.

Tournament rules allow each 600 Club member to attempt to qualify for the prize fund twice for an entry fee of \$10 each squad.

Members roll three games on one pair of lanes and average to be used is current yearbook high.

The state competition is divided into two divisions - Division I for those with averages over 170; and Division II for those 169 and below.

Members are reminded to bring their white receipt cards showing they have paid their current annual dues, or, dues may be paid at the tournament site.

### BVL Side Tournament

The same night any bowler - man or woman - may also compete in the BVL 3-6-9 Tournament for an entry fee of \$7.50 -- with one dollar allocated as a donation to the BVL Fund. The BVL tourney is handicapped 80% of 200 in each division (men's and women's) and bowlers may cash only once in the prize list -- but bowl as often as desired.

Leaders in the Texas 600 Club are Bernie Ehemann, Houston with 643 in Div. I, and Betty Burke in Div. II with 611.

In the BVL Fund event Karla Martin, Atlanta, leads the women's division with Charlie Burke leading the men's division with 774.

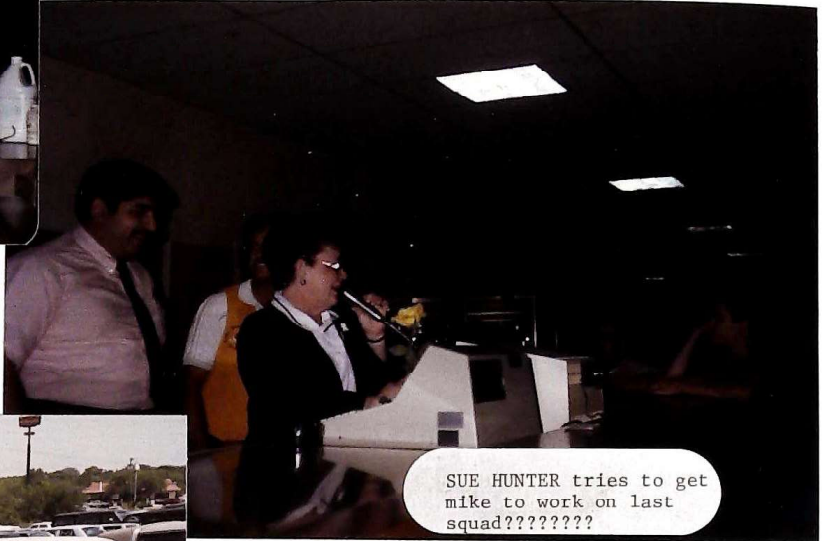

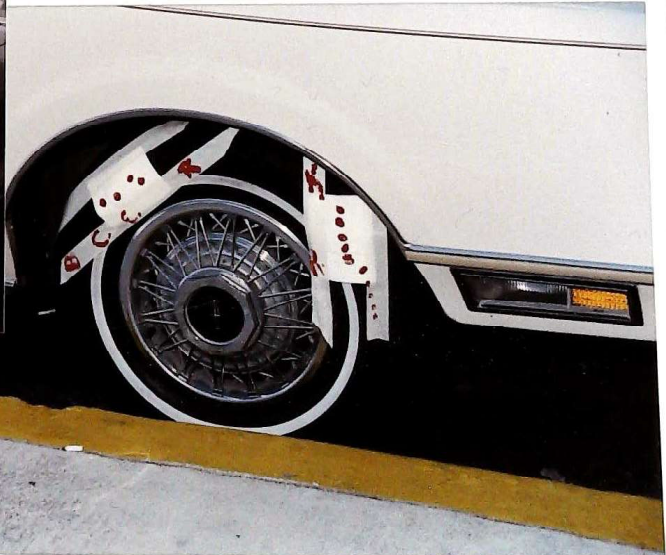

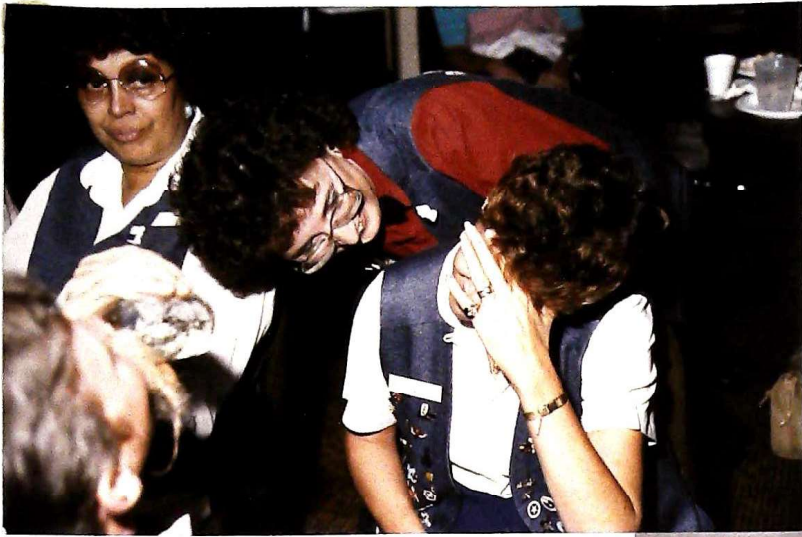

# Kathy Kirst Is State Champion!

## Laurie Jo Scales, Betty Roberts, Cass Harris Also Winners

When Laurie Jo earned her State Champ's crown in 1981 when TWBA also visited the Alamo City, she posted an 1831 in her all events, and was second with Carol Smith in Doubles with 1159.

The same year was third in All Events with 1783. Most recently Kathy was a Regional TEAM USA finalist who finished in fifth in Austin. She went on to Fort Worth for the Regional Finals swatting a over 190. Her appearance in the TWBA Championships this year was a hefty 208.4 for her nine games. At presstime both she and Laurie Jo are on the first place team leading the Martha Washington tournament.

Betty Roberts earned her first state title when she used her 157 yearbook average when entering, and came out on top of the Div. 3 Singles with a super 658 series. She rolled her state events late in April and her score remained on top for all those weeks.

Cassandra Harris, rolling in her first state competition, took the Div. 3 All Events crown with 1692 for her nine games. She rolled off a 159 average posting a doubles total of 594, 604 in singles and 494 in team event.

Defending team champions in Div. 1 provided all the excitement the weekend of June 19-20 as they successfully defended their State crowns, and their total was never seriously threatened throughout the remainder of the competition.

The Ladies Choice team from Houston included 1985 Texas Bluebonnet Queen

Luci Bonneau who rolled 608; reigning "Texas Woman Bowler of the Year" Donna Conners, 573; Dixie Broadwell 546, Wanda Chovanec, who replaced Carol Rountree, 549; and Jean Cope, who with Dixie were the 1987 Div. 1 Doubles champions. The team surpassed their 1987 total by 145 teams.

For the second consecutive year stunning Joyce Davis, Big Spring, earned Div. 1 singles honors, this

year with a fantastic 690 series with games of 208, 254, and 228. The total was just five pins shy of the tournament record set by Myrt DeFily (695) in 1971. Her winning total last year was a 683

Other local ladies in the top three places in the TWBA championships which features an estimated prize fund of \$208,848, were, unofficially, Margie Garcia and Aurora Cooper, third in Div. 2 Doubles with 1127; Letha DeLasughter, third in Div. 3 with 603; Evelyn Washington who saved her best shot for final weekend and posted a 582 for runnerup honors in Div. 5 singles. Letha also finished in second in Div. 3 with 1682 all events, and Carol Detwiler was runnerup by just two pins in Div. 4 all events.

One State Record was broken during the run of the 51st annual event. The first weekend of June Mary Honeycutt, Milano (of the Rockdale Assn.) toppled a score which had stood since 1978. Honeycutt, who was expecting her third child in three weeks, rolled games of 165, 264 and 212 for a 641 series, topping the record score of 636 set by Kathey Spurling of Killeen.

TWBA rewards the ladies rolling in the State Championships for their first 200 games during the event, and awards ladies whose averages are 139 and under for games over the 175 mark. The final award of the 51st annual event went to Melba July for her 201 game rolled in doubles. She competed with a 151 average.

Ladies rolling on the final squad of the championships were thrilled to receive a single yellow rose just prior to their tournament play. The roses were courtesy of the host proprietor (Astro Bowling Center) not only celebrating the end of the event, but in thanks to the ladies for visiting San Antonio.

The San Antonio edition of the TWBA Championships drew 2,669 five-woman teams, plus 6,817 sets of doubles, 13,634 singles and 13,054 all events, the fifth largest tournament in TWBA history. San Antonio WBA also holds the record for the largest TWBA event, set in 1981 when 3,086 teams participated.

The 1988 edition also was the first combining of Class E and Novice Division for those with averages 129 and under, and was the first time the tournament scores had been tallied by computer.

Unofficially too, is the top score in the race for the Billy

Simon Memorial Senior Award. Betty Brewster, Corpus Christi, sized in a 267 individual high game on her way to a personal career high series of 696. Brewster was rolling with a 179 current average. The award is given to a senior tournament participant, over the age of 55, who rolls the highest individual game of the tournament. The record is held by Elfi Tomczyk, San Antonio, a 279, set in 1982.

The state, magic, and

music may have ceased with the closing of the 51st event, but now the ladies of SAWBA have their eyes on an even bigger pie -- hosting the WIBC Championships and Annual Meeting in 1993. Bid work continues and plans are underway for a giant sized Texas Hospitality Room in Bismarck-Mandan, North Dakota. A site inspection team is expected mid-August to detail San Antonio's many attractions and facilities.

Beginning March 11, 1988, the tournament press room will be open on weekends in World of Sports, 12731 IH 10 West, San Antonio.

We are most appreciative of your interest in the activities of the Texas Women's Bowling Association, Inc.

In this year of 1988, the Texas Women's Bowling Association enters the second-half century of conducting State Championship tournaments. The 51st of these events opens in San Antonio on March 11th, with the 5th largest entry in history. That entry is 2,669 five-woman teams, which encompasses some 13,300 individuals, 6,817 sets of doubles, 13,634 singles and 13,045 have entered all events.

One significant change in the tournament format, the first since the Open Division was established many years ago, is the combining of Class E and the Novice Divisions. The Class E division will now be open to all bowlers who average 120 and below.

A major change in tournament administration came last fall when Sylvia Broyles of San Antonio assumed the office of TWBA Secretary and Tournament Manager, the first change in that office in 21 years. The home office of TWBA has been moved from Hurst to Spring Branch, just north of San Antonio.

Opening ceremonies for the 51st tournament of Champions will be on March 11th at 7:00 P.M. in World of Sports, 12731 IH 10W in San Antonio. Opening squads traditionally feature Senior bowlers. Doubles and Singles events are scheduled for Astro Bowl, 3203 Harry Wurzbach in San Antonio.

There is no competition scheduled for the weekends of April 23-24, when Texas bowling leaders will attend the Women's International Bowling Congress meeting in Reno, Nevada, nor on the weekend of July 2-3. The tournament will end on July 17, 1988.

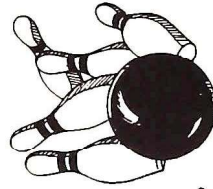

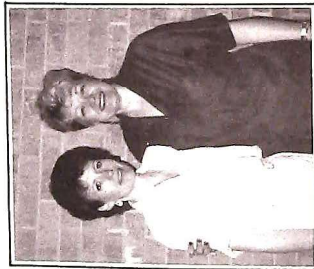

## BLUEBONNET QUEENS TOURNAMENT

The Texas Bluebonnet Queens Tournament, conducted annually for eighteen years by TWBA, is designed primarily for the higher average women bowlers in the State. Qualifying rounds consist of eight (8) games across sixteen (16) lanes and are bowled in two 4-game blocks. The 48 high qualifiers then advance to the Semi-final round of four (4) games on the same day. The top ten go on to the Finals the following day for nine (9) games of match play.



The 1988 Queen will receive a trophy, a gold charm with chain, symbolic of the title, and a paid entry into the 1989 tournament, as well as a prize check of at least \$600 and \$10 for each match won during the finals.

This year's tournament is scheduled for early March in Houston at Fair Lanes Imperial Valley. Browning's Trophies and Awards of Garland co-sponsor the Queens and contribute substantially to the prize monies.

1988 Hall of Fame Honorees

TWIN-CREDIBLE. . . . .

In a joint installation ceremony in May of 1988, the Texas Women's Bowling Association will induct twin sisters, Sue Kingham of Houston and Lou Lane of Austin, into the prestigious Hall of Fame.

In 1951, as students at San Jacinto High School in Houston, the Morton Twins, Sue and Lou, entered their first bowling tournament. Many titles were to follow the third place they won — after having bowled only three short months. In 1953, their team from San Jacinto HS won 1st in city, 1st in State and third in a national meet among 1600 entries. In 1954 they again won the city title. Graduates of the University of Houston, Sue and Lou were members of the collegiate bowling team.

Among their many awards are individual and team titles, as well as the many titles won as doubles partners. Outstanding among these are the four State Doubles wins in 1961, '62, '63 and 1975. During the '50's, the twins won doubles twice in the Houston tournament four HWBA team titles and were members of the Houston All City team in 1960 and 1963.

Sue was Houston's Queen of Bowling in 1963 and '64. More importantly, she won TWBA All Events titles in 1961, '64 and 1971. In 1964, she won the National 600 Club tournament in Houston. She is a member of the Ladies Professional Bowling tour and has finished in the top ten positions of their tournaments many times.

Lou won the first Houston Scratch Singles Classic in 1958, traditionally an all male event. She also is a member of the Ladies Pro Bowling tour and won their tournaments in 1962 and again in 1975. While in Houston, she was a constant participant in the TV Strike Show, winning three first place titles. After moving to Austin, Lou has won doubles titles and six team titles. She has recently been selected as Austin Bowler of the Year.

While Sue has 27 series of 700 or more and Lou has four, Lou has rolled two 300 games. Kingham has career highs of a 299 game and 765 series, while Lane has a 743 high series along with the 300 games.

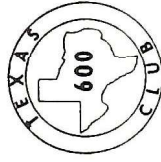

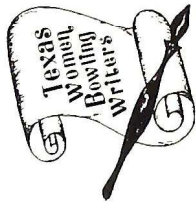

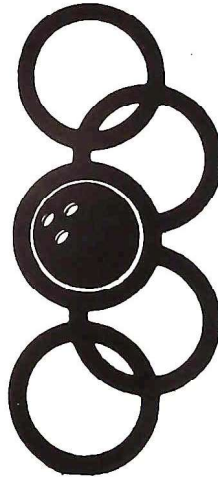

## TWBA TODAY .....

The primary purpose of the Texas Women's Bowling Association is to maintain and increase interest in bowling for women. The TWBA Board of Directors and Delegates to the annual meeting exercise general care and supervision over related activities of its members which are initiated by, and/or conducted by the State Association Membership for the 1986-87 season was 130,629 individuals.

### \*\*\*\*\* MEMBERSHIP SERVICES \*\*\*\*\*

**CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT:** The Championships are the primary activity conducted for TWBA members, to supplement services of the parent organization, the Women's International Bowling Congress, and is conducted annually, unless WIBC permits otherwise.

**SENIOR-AGE AWARDS:** Senior-age bowlers are spot-lighted on opening squads of the Championships and are feted at a Senior Reception prior to Official Opening. Each bowler on Senior squads receive a specially-designed dress pin and winners of squad high game and series receive awards from TWBA.

**AWARDS:** Tournament Champions are honored each year at a special banquet. Each champion traveling to the banquet is awarded expense money, in addition to prizes won in tournament. Individual high tournament game and series are recognized with a gift of silver. The Billy Simon Trophy is for the high tournament game by a Senior member (55 years of age or older.)

Certificates are presented to those who have bowled in 20 or more Championships. These are presented on the lanes as winners participate in the team event.

The President's Award is given to the local association who enters the largest number of teams on a percentage basis of their membership.

The Helen Baetz Traveling Trophies are given to associations in three categories based on the highest percentage of membership entered in Championships.

**BLUEBONNET QUEENS TOURNAMENT:** Conducted annually for all TWBA members, but designed for higher average bowlers. Individual competition with scratch scores over 26 games in two days. **RECORD ENTRY:** 1983 in San Antonio-235 entrants.

**HALL OF FAME:** Members, past or present, may be honored for outstanding contributions to TWBA.

**SERVICE AWARD:** Given to recognize accomplishments of a member (other than a current TWBA Board member) who has given valuable service to TWBA.

**SECRETARY OF THE YEAR:** An award to a local association Secretary for efficiency and expediency in her relationship with the state office.

**SCORE RECOGNITION:** TWBA gives awards for 300 games, games of 270 or better, series of 650 or better, and in cities where no high scores are rolled, TWBA awards the member who rolls the highest game and series.

**LIFE MEMBERS and MEMBERS EMERITUS:** Past Presidents and Secretaries of TWBA may be elected Life Members and any member who has given valuable service may be elected a Member Emeritus. Nominations are made by the TWBA Board of Directors.

**WOMAN BOWLER OF THE YEAR:** TWBA will recognize an outstanding bowler for her performance of the previous season.

**YOUTH BOWLING SERVICE AWARD:** TWBA will recognize a member who has contributed valuable service in the Youth Bowling Program.

**HIGH AVERAGE AWARD:** TWBA will award its member who ended the previous season with the highest average in the State.



**More services.....**

**BOWLERS VICTORY LEGION FUND:** Is aided during the Championships by special competition (currently a 3-6-9 tournament) with proceeds going to aid blinded and hospitalized war veterans. The Dorothy Cornelison BVL Award is given annually to a local association, based on monies donated to BVL per capita of membership.

**GIFTS:** TWBA absorbs the subscription costs of Woman Bowler magazine for local presidents and secretaries. TWBA serves as hostess for the Writers' breakfast, 20-Year Club luncheon, State Delegates luncheon, and the Texas Delegates Reception at WBC annual meeting.

**ACROSS TEXAS LINES:** Is the official publication of TWBA and is published 4 times yearly to convey news, notices and reports of TWBA programs, plus outstanding local news as submitted by local Publicity Chairmen.

TWBA joins with the Texas State Bowling Association and the Texas Bowling Centers Association with financial assistance and operation of the Texas Young American Bowling Alliance.

TWBA is a member of the Texas State Bowling Council, which conducts the annual Seniors Tournament and the State Mixed Tournament, and presents the Annual State Bowling Jamboree, a workshop for Rules and Regulations.



**DISABLED VETERANS  
DEPEND ON BOWLERS  
WHO CARE**

The Bowlers Victory Legion Fund is the national fund-raising project of bowlers. It had its beginnings in World War II, when the lady bowlers of the United States raised enough money to purchase three hospital airplanes and donate them to the U.S. Air Force. After the war, the idea of raising funds for veterans of all U.S. wars took root. Today, millions of dollars have been given to Veterans Hospitals to purchase television sets, sports magazines, bowling equipment, and to fund the appearance of bowling stars to entertain the patients. During the season of 1986-87, Texas bowlers gave in excess of \$55,000.00 to the BVL. These funds were raised through tournaments, donations, sale of a BVL dress pin, auctions, and other fund raisers.
